### Minutes of Feb. 28 meeting:

*Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m.*

- 1) Rtn. Epoy Yao led the invocation.

## RCDS PRESIDENT'S CORNER

The understanding is that you add \$100 (about P5,600) next Rotary Year beginning July 2024. This opportunity is for Active Members (or those actively paying their semestral dues).

Last Sunday, we sounded out the request of PE Loloy Baylon for Rotarians to support the operations of the Club through a special budgetary allocation referred to as the Sustained Assistance for New Officers, aptly called SANO Fund because it was initially established by the family of PP Susano "Sano" Sy, through the generosity of Ann Teena Sy.

### What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations".

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

### Opportunities for Fellowship

Most Rotarians are successful professional and business executives because they hear opportunities, knock, and take advantage of them.
