SECRETARY'S REPORT

Jan Ashley "Ashley" E. Morelos

Minutes of March 13 meeting:

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m.

1) Rtn. Matthew Green led the invocation.

 After the Pambansang Awit and the Rotary Hymn, PE Loloy led the recitation of the Four-Way Test, and the Mission and Object of Rotary.

3) Rtn. Erp Bustamante introduced the guests.

4) After breakfast, Rtn. Philip Yao led the fellowship singing with Don't Stop Believing by Journey.

5) PP Mark Higgins was the Fine Master.

6) <u>President's Time</u>. Pres. Alex awarded the **Polio Plus**Certificates and **Polio Plus pins** which recently arrived from the District. The Polio Plus certificate recipients, who are 2023 Paul Harris fellows, are the following: PVP Wilkie Matiao, PN Niño Viking, PP Henry Liu, PP Chiquiting Sagarbarria; PP Myles Bejar, Rtn. Jake Cayang, VP Jeorex Chua, PP Boy Diputado, Rtn. Jim Jardiniano, Treas Jessie Mascardo, Rtn. Randy Quisil, and PP Henry Sojor.

7) Pres. Alex encourageed Rotarians to become Paul Harris Fellows by donating at least \$200. He explained there are actually three ways to be recognized as Paul Harris Fellows: a) Donate \$1,000; b) Have someone, like a relative, donate \$1,000 in your name; and c) Collect 1,000 points wherein \$1 = one point, and turn over to Rotary International.

This time, the District is generously offering to match our points to as many as 1,000 points after donating at least \$200 (about P11,200), and committing to donate \$100 more by next Rotary year.

8) The President again reiterated the invitation by DG Twinkle Gamboa for RCDS to perform *Where Hope is Planted* during the DisCon on May 4 in Davao City. He encouraged the Rotarians to sign up for the DisCon so we can have more singers during the Governor's Night. He said it is a big honor and privilege for a Rotary Club to be invited to perform in a District event such as the DisCon.

9) PP Ran Lim enchoed the sentiments of the President that indeed, it is a privilege to do a 'command performance' before the District Governor who saw us perform the District Song in September 2023, and was visibly pleased. He said we should consider this a big thing that of all the more-than-100 clubs in the District, DG Twinkle chose RCDS to perform just before she is formally introduced in the program. He said each and every RCDS member is highly-encouraged to attend the DisCon in Davao because this is how one gets to experience what it really means to be a true Rotarian at-heart. He recalled that before, he and VP Jeorex Chua had participated in almost all District events -- where they learned a lot more about Rotary rather than just being mere members. He said the DG must have been impressed with the many achievements of RCDS so far; why don't we just finish what we already started, and support Pres. Alex until his term ends in June? (Then he turned over the mike to Ann Sasa Lim, vice president of the RCDS Anns.)

10) Ann Sasa discussed that RCDS will sing during the Discon in Davao, and **encouraged as well the Anns to register as Spouses**. She said we will also produce an MTV-like video of the

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the

worldwide organization, Rotary International.
Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial
gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary.
From that time, the Rotary Foundation
has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations". In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means

to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.



Are you aware of the responsibility or obligation most Rotarians fail to perform? Paying their dues? Attending meetings? Contributing to the Club Service fund? Participating in club events and projects? No none of these!

Of all the obligations a person accepts when joining a Rotary club, the one in which most Rotarians fail is "sharing Rotary."

The policies of Rotary International clearly affirm that every individual Rotarian has an "obligation to share Rotary with others, and to help extend Rotary through proposing qualified persons for Rotary club membership."

It is estimated that less than 30 percent of the members of most Rotary clubs have

It is estimated that less than 30 percent of the members of most Rotary clubs have ever made the effort to propose a new member. Thus, in every club, there are many Rotarians who readily accept the pleasures of being a Rotarian without ever sharing that privilege with another qualified individual

that privilege with another qualified individual.

The Rotary policy on Club Membership states: "For a Rotary club to be fully relevant to its community and responsive to the needs of those in the community, it is important and necessary that the club include in its membership all fully qualified prospective members located within its territory."

One merely has to glance through the yellow pages of the local telephone directory to realize that most clubs have not invited qualified members of all businesses and professions into Rotary.

Only a Rotarian may propose a customer, neighbor, client, supplier, executive, relative, business associate, professional or other qualified person to join a Rotary club. Have you accepted your obligation to share Rotary? The procedures are very simple, and everyone must know at least one person who should belong to Rotary.
