SECRETARY'S REPORT



Jan Ashley "Ashley" E. Morelos

Minutes of April 17 meeting:

Pres. Alex Pal called the meeting to order at 6:30 a.m.

- 1) Rtn. Junrex Bungabong led the invocation.
- 2) After the singing of the Pambansang Awit, PE Loloy Baylon recited the Four-Way Test and the Object of Rotary.
- 3) After breakfast, Rtn. Randy Quisil led the group in fellowship singing.

4) Rtn. Junrex then shared some information that he learned from the PETS/SETS and the District Training Assembly. He started by asking, "How Deep is your Love for Rotary?" This was a question that was asked of them, and the new Rotarians didn't quite have an answer for it. After all, how can you love someone or something you don't know? That's why it's important for every Rotarian to get to know Rotary deeper so he will understand better what being a genuine Rotarian is all about.

Rtn. JunRex said that up until that time, he and many other new Rotarians could not fully comprehend the zeal and undying love for Rotary that mostly old timers demonstrate in many ways. He ended his talk with an inspirational quote by Etienne de Grellet: *"I shall pass this way but once; any good that I can do, or any kindness I can show to any human being, let me do it now. Let me not defer nor neglect it, for I shall not pass this way again."*

5) SAA Edo Adriano had collected the fines ahead of time so we dispensed with the Fine Moments.

6) Our guest speaker was Engr. Robert Cabiles, the new chief operations officer of Metro Dumaguete Water, replacing Rtn. Dave Berba who has been assigned in Iloilo City.

As a new member of the community, Engr. Cabiles shared three impressions that he gathered in the two weeks he's been based here in Dumaguete:

- a) Dumaguete is indeed a City of Gentle People. Having lived in many cities in the country like Cebu, Cagayan de Oro, and Davao, he said the Dumagueteños speak Bisaya in a gentle tone.
- b) Dumagueteños love their breakfast. He recalled meeting Rtn. Chiquiting Sagarbarria, who immediately offered him breakfast in his home. He was told that in Dumaguete, people share a meal first before discussing business. Incidentally, he has also discovered several restaurants here serving good food.
- c) People in Dumaguete are intelligent. The people he meets offer insights that amaze him. He says he also finds himself having to double check his grammar as Dumaguete is a City with the second most proficient English speakers, according to a survey.

7) He revealed that Dumaguete has vast groundwater resources, most likely due to our proximity to the watershed in Mt. Talinis. The water supply in Dumaguete's aquifers will last more than 20 years from now. That is why MDW is adopting a ridge-to-reef approach in its environmental plan that takes care of the trees in the mountain down to the mangroves in the shorelines.

He added that the priority of MDW is to replace the pre-war assets or pipelines that are causing water leaks. He also

So I sent to DG Twinkle some photos of the progress of the house construction at Friendly Homes in barangay Cadawinonan, which PP Greg Uymatiao is building through I-Homes. If you recall, DG Twinkle led the groundbreaking ceremony at Friendly Homes during her visit to our Club in September 2023.

DG Twinkle was so happy to see the photos of the three houses being constructed that she asked if they could stop by Friendly Homes and check it out for themselves, on their way to Tierra Alta where the RCDN event was going to be held.

We continue to look forward to this possibility with our young Rotarians, and I'm sure the oldtimers will work doubly hard to make this vision into a reality.

What is a Paul Harris Fellow?

A Paul Harris Fellow is a person who has been recognized as having done something significant for others through a contribution of \$ 1000, which will be spent on humanitarian efforts around the world.

A Paul Harris Fellow is recognized for service to the club and the community.

The recognition is named after Paul Harris, founder and organizer of the first Rotary Club in Chicago in 1905. He was founder of the Rotary idea, and the first president of the worldwide organization, Rotary International.

Upon Paul Harris' death in 1947, memorial gifts poured in to honor the founder of Rotary. From that time, the Rotary Foundation has been achieving the noble objective

of furthering "understanding and friendly relations between peoples of different nations".

In 1957, the idea of the Paul Harris Fellow recognition was first proposed as a means to promote voluntary giving to the Rotary Foundation.

Although the concept of making \$1,000-gifts to the Foundation was slow in developing, by the early 1970s the program began to gain popularity.

The distinctive Paul Harris Fellow medallion, lapel pin, and a certificate have become highly-respected symbols of a substantial commitment to The Rotary Foundation by Rotarians and friends around the world.

announced that MDW is in the final leg of completing its master plan for Dumaguete to meet the City’s water needs for the future. Dumaguete’s water source is ground water so it is not affected by the dry spell caused by the El Niño phenomenon. He said some places which rely on surface water, such as rivers or lakes, are reporting a reduced volume of water. Engr. Cabile also confirmed that the water from our faucets is safe for drinking. The water is tested in the laboratory every month, and the company also monitors water quality on a daily basis. “We can drink the water from our faucets,” he said. When asked about the ideal distance of deep wells from the shoreline to prevent

saltwater intrusion, he said it should be at least 300 meters from the shore. But he said he is surprised at the strong pressure of the underground water in the aquifer, so much so that one deep well near the Capitol Area has not reported saltwater intrusion. Engr. Cabile, who is also a member of the Rotary Club of Iloilo, said he is looking forward to becoming a regular member of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South. 8) President’s Time. Pres. Alex informed the Club that there will be a memorial service for Rtn. Hans Bissdorf on Sunday, April 21 at his home in Siaton.
