

PROFILE OF DISTRICT GOVERNOR CAROLINE L. ANDRADE

District Governor Caroline Lee-Andrade, or Caycay as she is fondly called by friends, will make history for Tacloban clubs to serve as the first lady governor from her area, and is the sixth lady governor of District 3860.

DG Caycay joined Rotary in 2006 and was inducted to Rotary Club of Kandaya, Tacloban. Since her induction, she has held various positions in the club level as director for Membership, The Rotary Foundation, Club Administration, Public Image, Club Treasurer, Auditor, and Vice President.

She served as Club President in RY2012-2013 with the theme, "Peace through Service" and has garnered several district awards, notable of which as Outstanding President and Outstanding Club during her term. She served a second term as Club President in RY 2013-2014 when the devastating super typhoon Yolanda struck Tacloban City.

Beyond the club, she has generously extended her time and talent to serve in various capacities as Assistant Governor, Deputy District Governor for three consecutive years, District Governor's Representative to the Philippine Rotary Magazine, District Stewardship Subcommittee Chair, District Endowment and Major Gifts Adviser, District Empowering Girls Chair, and as District Executive

An avid supporter of The Rotary Foundation since 2006 when she became a Paul Harris Society member prior to becoming a Rotarian, DG Caycay and Spouse Bobby, are Major Donors Level 4 with a named endowment fund.

In the community, she is a brand ambassador as "Mrs. McDonalds" being the first franchisee to open the first restaurant in Tacloban City. To date, she has grown her business in the region and operates several restaurants. Her management style has been recognized through the years and has garnered her numerous awards and recognitions. To name a few, these are Ray Kroc Press On Award, Community Excellence Award, George T. Yang Leadership Award, People Award, Regional Franchisee Award for Visayas, National Franchisee Award as awarded by Philippine Franchising Association Franchising Excellence Awards and the most coveted Fred L. Turner Golden Arch Award, an award given to the Top 1% of McDonald's Franchisees of more than 38,000 restaurants across the globe.

DG Caycay is married to Robert "Bobby" Andrade, a past president from the Rotary Club of Tacloban. They are blessed with five children – Carl, a specially gifted child; Tanya, a lawyer; Meggy, a graduate of Hotel Restaurant and Institution Management; Sean, a certified public accountant; and youngest Denise, an incoming College student.

RCDS, TMF, IHomes inaugurate first two housing units By HC Pres. Alex Rey Pal

July 28 was a special day for the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South and for its adopted community—the Friendly Homes Association.

On this day, the first two homes constructed by IHomes would be blessed and inaugurated. Joven and Lucita Beranio and Ramil and Shenaline Barillo were the first two couples at Friendly Homes to finally have a house of their own at Friendly Homes.

District Governor Rozanne "Twinkle" Gamboa had to take an early dawn trip from Davao to Manila and then to Dumaguete just to be able to spend time with us as this project is also close to her heart. She and District Learning Facilitator Archie Gamboa had joined the ground breaking ceremonies when they came for DG Twinkle's Governor's Visit in September last year.

Pres. Alex Pal gave the welcome remarks. He revealed that before he started his term as President last July, he met with PP Greg, who heads the TMF and IHomes, what the Club can do to become an outstanding club and bring the Club back to its glory years. PP Greg suggested that the Club might want to do this socialized housing project and the rest is history.

PP Greg gave the background of the Friendly Homes. He said the land was originally owned by his cousin, whom he convinced to sell it to the informal settlers at an affordable price. So the Ting Matiao Foundation, the NGO of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete South, purchased the lot and is now managing the collection of payments from the renters. Once the settler has paid a certain sum for the land, they are qualified to build homes through IHomes. They pay P1,500 a month. As IHomes is a non-profit organization, the money is allocated to build more low-cost housing units for others.

Mariane Beranio, the president of the Friendly Homes Workers Association, expressed her thanks to everyone involved in making the hopes of their members come true. A message of support from the Barangay was also given by Kagawad Ma. Emily Olivo, who also announced plans to launch a sewing program at Friendly Homes so the residents could earn more income. She asked the Rotarians if someone could donate sewing machines for this program. This could be part of the Community Economic Development Team's projects.

District Governor Twinkle Gamboa praised the Club for building socialized housing units and thanked the Club for making her a part of the event. She recalled that she was here last September for the groundbreaking and she is happy to see that we are already inaugurating two units.

Gov. Twinkle also advised the residents of Friendly Homes to take good care of their community and engage in activities that promote unity and togetherness.

The homes were then turned over to the residents and Rev. Fr. Juniper Toreno from the Diocesan Social Action Center gave the blessing. Everyone partook of some food prepared by the beneficiaries, who learned empanada and siopaomaking skills from Rotary Ann Wendy Fungo during the Rotary Week in February.

Magical President Elmore Baylon pledged to continue the club's involvement with Friendly Homes, as the residents are now excited at the prospect of finally becoming homeowners.
