BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CLUB OF DUMAGUETE

Rotary reached the shores of Dumaguete, the capital city of Negros Oriental Province, after a lapse of two decades when it secured its footing in the Philippines upon the formation of the Rotary Club of Manila in January 1919- the first Rotary Club in Asia.

The formation of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete in 1939 was spearheaded by two men- Justice George Malcolm and Dr. Emilio M. Javier. The former was at that time Governor of Rotary District 81 (which covered the existing six Rotary Clubs in the Philippines) and the latter, his former student, was Dean of the College of Law at Silliman University. Inspired and encouraged by Justice Malcolm, Emilio was fully convinced that a Rotary Club should be formed in Dumaguete, conducted a one-man campaign, sowing the seeds of Rotary in the community. A provisional club was organized when twenty-one businessman and professionals were meeting regularly around a luncheon table and who were indoctrinated in the object, principles and programs of the Rotary. It is of great interest that in addition to the recommendation of the District Governor transmitting the application of the provisional Rotary Club of Dumaguete for Membership in Rotary International, was an appendage which reads as follows:

"The provisional Rotary Club of Dumaguete is situated in a rather small community with a University background. This is the reason why so many members are classified as coming from Silliman University. If this classification overstep the uttermost boundary of Rotary regulations, one or more can be dropped, but I hope this will not be necessary on account of the divergent interest of those connected with Silliman University as University Administration, Law, Science, etc."

Per Club constitution, the territorial limits of the club was the town of Bais to North, 45 kms. from Dumaguete and the town of Zamboanguita on the South, 29 kms. from Dumaguete. The annual meetings shall be held in the month of April or May and the regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall fall on a Saturday, monthly. The weekly meetings shall on a Saturday at 7:30p.m., place, Luzon Hotel.

The Rotary year began on July 4, 1939 under the leadership of Don Jesus Montenegro. In an atmosphere of the threatening clouds or war, the Rotary Assembly was held in Dumaguete which was attended by no less than the President of the Manila Rotary Club, Huge Miller and the District Governor, Ted Hall. No sooner had these distinguished Rotarians returned to Manila when World War II broke out on December 8, 1941. Members of the club of American nationality were scattered all over the province of Negros Oriental. Some were captured and those who evaded took to the hills and provided inspiration and leadership in the resistance movement. Those who we re forced by circumstances to stay in the occupied areas served as underground agents.

n addition, responding to the call of times, we launched the "BONDPAPER MO KAUGMAON KO" with Junob Elementary as the recipient school. RCD donated 40 reams of bondpaper, 10pcs ink re-fill and INEO 164 toner to be used in the preparation of the school children's module program.

Furthermore, upon learning of the possible challenges of the newly adapted learning platform for the public school pupils which is the module program, RCD set in motion the "ROTARY MENTORS THE YOUTH" program. By partnering with various Sangguniang Kabataan in 4 different Barangays and with the blessings of the Department of Education City Division, we tapped the vast resource of un-employed college grads affected by the pandemic, gave them incentives and utilized them to coach and mentor the school-children on this new learning initiative. The "rotary mentors the youth" program enabled the school-children to gain confidence in tackling their modules. The video-doc short video-doc which was shown earlier.

Also as part of the Clubs yearly ritual during the holiday season, RCD conducted its traditional "CHRISTMAS SHARE A MEAL" program in NOPH this time with certain restrictions and modifications due to the threat of the Covid 19. Recipients were the nurses, patients and their bantays of both pediatric and maternity wards numbering to over 300. All this while being serenaded with Christmas songs by our RCD's carolers.

Similarly, on the morning of Feb 27 this Rotary year, to jump- start the celebration of our 82nd charter day anniversary, RCD as part of its annual commitment, went to Talay Rehabilitation Center and provided the patients, care-givers and staff nurses packed meals numbering to around 100 total recipients on a campaign called "Charter day share a meal project".

With covid 19 still posing as a serious threat to our way of life in Dumaguete and around the globe, RCD set about a program dubbed as "Rotary Kontra Covid". The project identified high risk carinderia's and sari2x stores all over Dumaguete, and became recipients of free plastic barrier installation to help in the prevention of community transmission of the dreaded covid 19.

While it appears we have accomplished much, there are still much to do in the near future. My salute, sincere gratitude and deep respects to all members of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete for your steadfast support during my tenure when all of us "Opened Opportunities".
