## BRIEF HISTORY OF THE CLUB OF DUMAGUETE

Rotary reached the shores of Dumaguete, the capital city of Negros Oriental Province, after a lapse of two decades when it secured its footing in the Philippines upon the formation of the Rotary Club of Manila in January 1919- the first Rotary Club in Asia.

The formation of the Rotary Club of Dumaguete in 1939 was spearheaded by two men- Justice George Malcolm and Dr. Emilio M. Javier. The former was at that time Governor of Rotary District 81 (which covered the existing six Rotary Clubs in the Philippines) and the latter, his former student, was Dean of the College of Law at Silliman University. Inspired and encouraged by Justice Malcolm, Emilio was fully convinced that a Rotary Club should be formed in Dumaguete, conducted a one-man campaign , sowing the seeds of Rotary in the community. A provisional club was organized when twenty-one businessman and professionals were meeting regularly around a luncheon table and who were indoctrinated in the object, principles and programs of the Rotary. It is of great interest that in addition to the recommendation of the District Governor transmitting the application of the provisional Rotary Club of Dumaguete for Membership in Rotary International, was an appendage which reads as follows:

"The provisional Rotary Club of Dumaguete is situated in a rather small community with a University background. This is the reason why so many members are classified as coming from Silliman University. If this classification overstep the uttermost boundary of Rotary regulations, one or more can be dropped, but I hope this will not be necessary on account of the divergent interest of those connected with Silliman University as University Administration , Law, Science, etc."

Per Club constitution, the territorial limits of the club was the town of Bais to North, 45 kms. from Dumaguete and the town of Zamboanguita on the South, 29 kms. from Dumaguete. The annual meetings shall be held in the month of April or May and the regular meeting of the Board of Directors shall fall on a Saturday, monthly. The weekly meetings shall on a Saturday at 7:30p.m. , place, Luzon Hotel.

Here is the complete list of Charter Officers and Charter Members of the Provisional Rotary Club of Dumaguete dated February 6, 1939: and on February 27, 1939, the Rotary Club of Dumaguete was granted its charter.

The Rotary year began on July 4, 1939 under the leadership of Don Jesus Montenegro. With Don "Sus" at the helm, the club grew steadily in membership and was able to make itself known to the community through its worthwhile community projects. The following year, Don "Sus" was reelected President, with Jose P. Martinez, Vice President and Placido B. Matta, Secretary (RY 1940-41 ).

In an atmosphere of the threatening clouds or war, the Rotary Assembly was held in Dumaguete which was attended by no less than the President of the Manila Rotary Club, Huge Miller and the District Governor, Ted Hall. No sooner had these distinguished Rotarians returned to Manila when World War II broke out on December 8, 1941. Members of the club of American nationality were scattered all over the province of Negros Oriental. Some were captured and those who evaded took to the hills and provided inspiration and leadership in the resistance movement. Those who were forced by circumstances to stay in the occupied areas served as underground agents.

We are three months behind in our club e-bulletin as of writing because of the succeeding service projects and activities we have for the last quarter of 2021. Nevertheless, our goal is to capture every moment unfolded.

This month, we welcome two new baby Rotarians, Ugine M. Mendez, a banker by profession and Carlo Andre Martin E. Baroa, a chef and entrepreneur by profession.

With the upcoming TRF awards next month the club aims to have members that will be included as Sustaining Members and Paul Harris Fellow. We are pleased to announce that we have members who will qualify and will be included in the TRF Awards as Sustaining Members, PP Judge Candelario V. Gonzalez PHF, Rtn Pablito C. Benedian Jr., PE Rico Ligutom and Rtn Fely M. Gonzalez PHF. And yours truly as Paul Harris Fellow with the 500\$ matching grant from Mr. Edgar R. Chiongbian, Chiongbian Foundation, Rotary Club of Cebu, District 3860.

This month we will finally be launching one of our signature project under Maternal and Child Health, "Gasa sa Kahimsug". This is a nutritional augmentation program in collaboration with Dumaguete City Nutrition Office and the honorable Brgy. Captain of Calindagan, Hon. Maisa Sagarbarria. The nutrition program will run for the duration of three (3) months for the undernourished children of Brgy. Calindagan as our pilot beneficiary for this service project. This project is made possible because of the generous donations of club members, non-Rotarians, and some businessmen in the area.

This service project aims to catch up to a normal weight and minimize health complications especially during this COVID-19 pandemic, to help the undernourished children consume the minimum acceptable diet through actual supplementation and parental education, to advise and educate the parents of other cheap, yet healthy, alternatives for their child's meals, and to improve the academic performance and even behavior in class of day-care students through nutritional balancing. With the help of the barangay Nutrition Scholars, we will provide them with daily Chewable proprietary blends of 20 fruits & vegetables (no sugar, no artificial coloring) with Iron bisglycinate, zinc, calcium, Vitamin A Vitamin D, Vitamin C, B-complex, and once a week Aminein Soya Drink (for repair of muscle wasting).

As we move forward, I encourage all members to be proactive, and continue to be generous of your time, talent and resources. There are a lot of ways to express your support to Rotary. First, is by donating to the Rotary Foundation. Second, volunteer your time to club service projects and third, by participating in all our club meetings either in person or virtually.

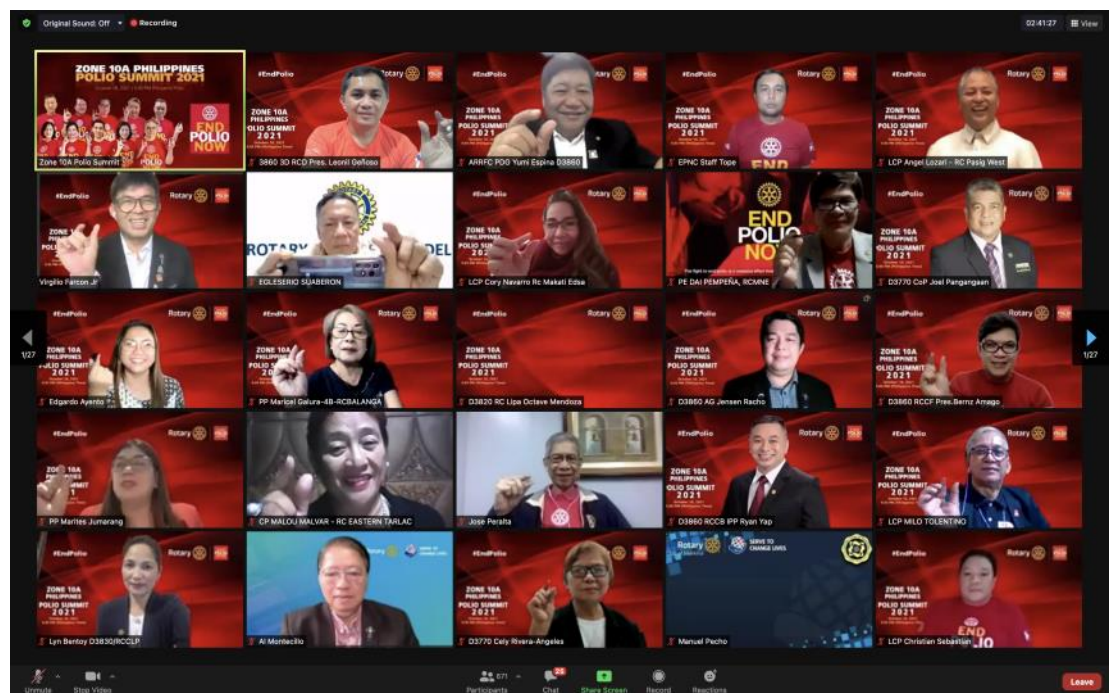

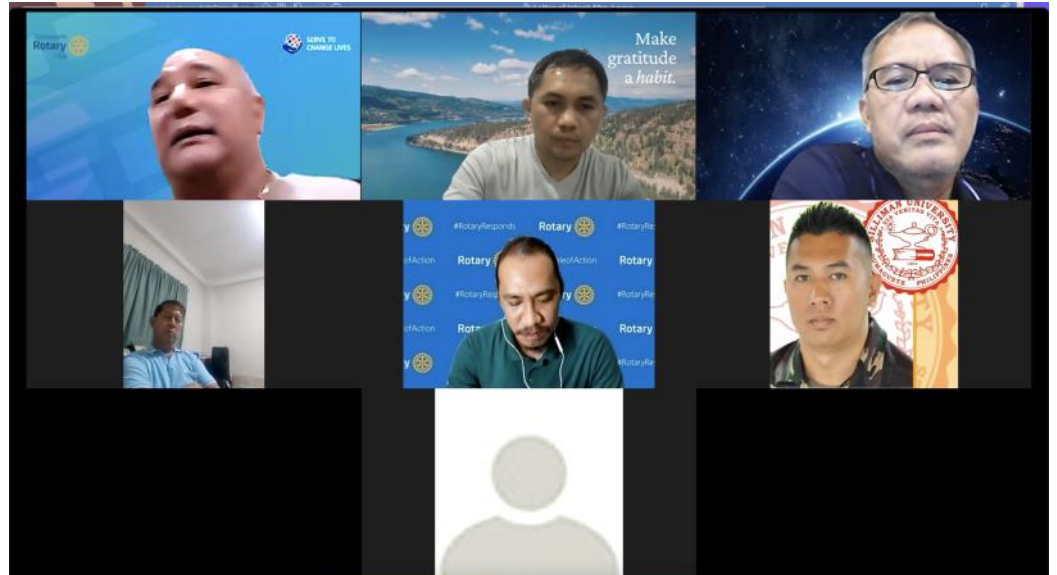

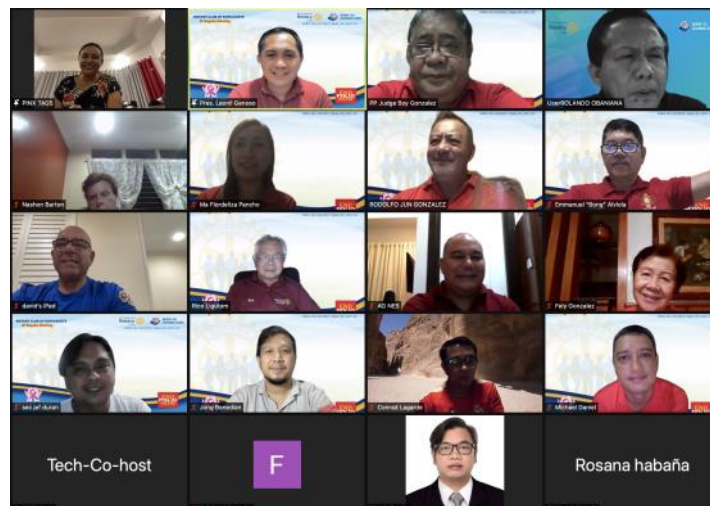

### PROGRAMS FOR YOUNG LEADERS IDEAS

- Encourage Interact clubs to take part in the Interact Awards and submit videos, photos, and essays that are about empowering girls.
- Support the creation of new Interact clubs, either at traditional or all-girl schools, to help empower girls through leadership development and community service.
- Consider events and activities related to Global Youth Service Day, which is 29 April to 1 May 2022, to emphasize how youth service can empower girls.
- Use your Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (and virtual RYLA events) to empower girls through leadership development activities.

### DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT AND MATERNAL CARE

*Suggested Activities for Each Area of Focus*

- Support programs that provide sexual and adolescent health care, including reproductive care services.
- Facilitate education about preventing and treating sexually transmitted diseases, such as HIV and HPV.
- Promote vaccinations that prevent the transmission of HPV and hepatitis B and C.
- Contact Rotary Action Groups that support these areas of focus, such as the Rotary Action Group for Reproductive, Maternal, and Child Health, which has an interest in adolescent health, gender equality, and the empowerment of girls.

### ENVIRONMENT

*Suggested Activities for Each Area of Focus*

- Promote the use of traditional and Indigenous knowledge to empower girls in natural resource management practices and understand how it affects their lives.
- Educate girls about the importance of sustainable agricultural methods to improve food security, reduce food waste, and increase access to fresh, healthy food.
- Support activities that educate and empower girls to influence family decisions about food security, family nutrition, and health.

### IDEAS YOU CAN START WITH

- Consider planning events and activities related to 11 October, the International Day of the Girl Child.
- Think about how you can apply the principles of diversity, equity, and inclusion in projects and programs that emphasize gender equity and empower girls.
- Advise clubs to use the tags EmpoweringGirls2021 or EG2021 on their project posts to the Rotary Showcase Empowering Girls campaign.

### ROTARACT IDEAS

- Develop projects that focus on empowering girls and submit them to the Rotaract Outstanding Project Awards, which showcase innovative, sustainable service activities aligned with our areas of focus.
- Establish near-peer mentor relationships between Rotaract and Interact members with a focus on mentoring girls.

### WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE

*Suggested Activities for Each Area of Focus*

- Develop projects that improve water, sanitation, and hygiene services at schools so that girls can safely manage their menstrual hygiene without sacrificing their education. This would include, among other things, gender-specific toilets, access to sanitary napkins, and convenient and environmentally safe waste disposal.
- Work with groups that ensure that sanitation initiatives in schools include gender-specific toilet facilities.
- Promote projects that encourage girls to assume leadership positions in hygiene promotion programs, such as the creation and implementation of school health clubs.

### PEACE BUILDING AND CONFLICT PREVENTION

*Suggested Activities for Each Area of Focus*

- Support projects that educate people about how to protect young women from being trafficked.
- Facilitate the education and engagement of young women in peacebuilding processes.
- Promote rehabilitative services programs for victims of domestic violence.
- Work to promote health education throughout a girl's school years.
- Focus stories from your club or district on how COVID-19 has affected women and girls.

### BASIC EDUCATION & LITERACY

*Suggested Activities for Each Area of Focus*

- Consider projects that include an investment in training female teachers.
- Work to create or improve the teaching of science, technology, engineering, arts, and math for girls as part of a school curriculum or in an after-school program.
- Set up after-school mentoring and tutoring programs for girls.
- Include adult literacy programs for mothers in your education projects.
- Facilitate professional development opportunities for teachers on gender-sensitive topics.
- Find ways to increase the conversation opportunities for boys about cultural and societal practices that affect girls.
- Provide menstrual hygiene education to boys and girls in the community.

### DISEASE PREVENTION AND TREATMENT AND MATERNAL CARE

*Suggested Activities for Each Area of Focus*

- Advocate for mental health services specific to young girls and teens, such as those that focus on preventing suicide and dealing with substance abuse and addiction.
- Support early prevention and treatment services focused on teen pregnancies and fetal alcohol syndrome.
- Consider projects that work to prevent and treat adolescent-onset diabetes.

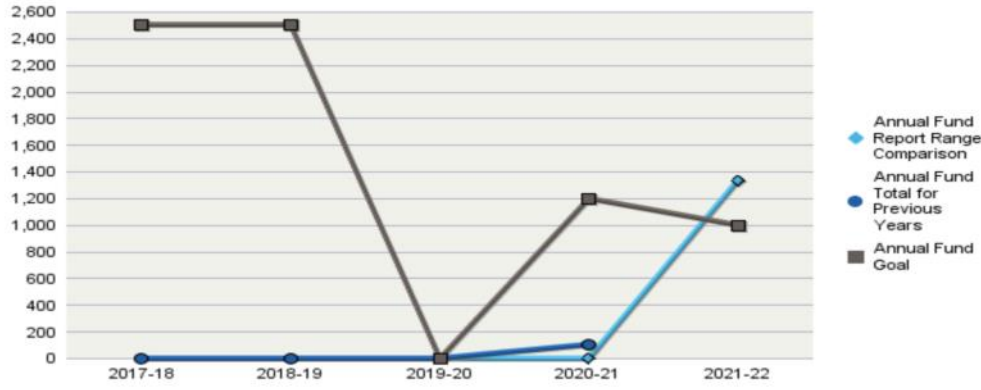

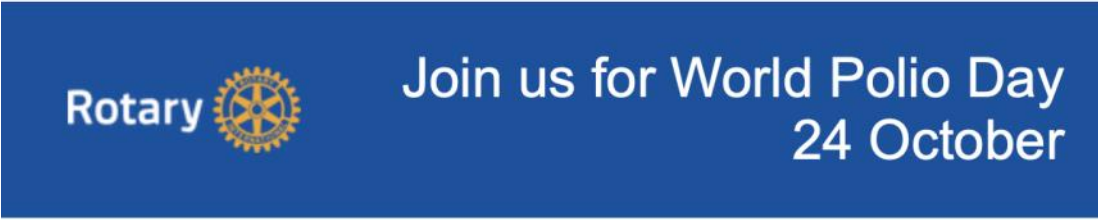

### 2020 Rotary All-Member Survey Findings

### How the club experience shapes the Rotary membership experience

Rotary conducts annual surveys to gauge member satisfaction, find opportunities to improve program participants' experience, and monitor trends in membership. A recent analysis of the results gathered by surveys from 2019 to 2021\* revealed that a good and fulfilling club experience is necessary for members and is a key factor in their decision to continue their membership.

What makes for a good club experience? Rotarians and Rotaractors were asked what they liked and disliked about their club meetings. The five most prominent factors that they liked are:

- Friendship and personal interaction
- Getting involved in the local community
- Learning new things from guest speakers and discussing interesting topics
- Well-structured meetings that start and end on time
- Leaders who listen to and engage members

If you want to learn more about membership patterns, the newly updated *State of Rotary Membership* presentation shows how Rotary is doing as of 1 July 2021. The 16-slide PowerPoint presentation can be shared and is easy to customize to meet your region's needs. You can also watch a recording of *The State of Membership webinar*. The webinar examines current trends in Rotary's membership, discusses ways to elevate Rotaract as an equal partner in service, and emphasizes the importance of inclusivity.

\*The data for this analysis was taken from five sources: the 2019 Member and Participant Experience Feedback Survey, the 2020 All-Member Survey, the 2021 DEI Survey, the 2021 Leadership Survey, and the BI Membership Universe.
