THE ZONE: Rotary Institute

We continue our education on the Zone and the Rotary Institutes...

## On ROTARY INSTITUTES

Rotary institutes are informational meetings designed for the past, present, and incoming RI officers. A Rotary institute may be organized for a zone, a section of a zone, or a grouping of zones.

#### **Purpose**

The purpose of a Rotary institute is to:

- 1) Provide current, incoming, and past RI officers with updates on RI and Rotary Foundation policies and programs
- 2) Provide a forum for Rotary leaders to make comments and recommendations to the Board of Directors
- 3) Provide fellowship and a participative learning experience that will inspire current, incoming, and past governors to continuing leadership and service.


### **Organization**

The president designates one or more conveners to organize and direct the program of each institute. Usually, conveners are directors or immediate past directors who serve as the president's representatives to the institutes. Those organizing the institute are appointed by the convener and prepare the arrangements and agenda for the convener's approval.

#### **Program**

Institutes normally last two to three days. Past RI officers who live in the zone should be provided opportunities to articipate in the program as speakers, panelists, discussion leaders, and members of institute committees. Components should include:

 ✓ A major address on the Foundation delivered by a Foundation representative to update participants on Foundation programs, objectives, finances, and problems
 ✓ A status report on Polio Plus each year until polio is eradicated



In the year of the Council on Legislation:

- 1. A separate session limited to representatives and alternates to discuss the operation and procedures of the Council
- 2. A plenary session to discuss the substance of selected proposals, for the purpose of allowing voting representatives to hear the views of Rotarians from their area of the world (RCP 60.050.)

An open forum for participants and Rotary senior leadership to exchange ideas

The five-year forecast presented by a director or other representative of the Board

Each institute program must include a copy of the written report of the previous year's institute (including any resolutions) that was submitted to the RI Board, along with a copy of any Board action taken.

## **Regional Seminars**

Governors-elect training seminars, or GETS, are considered mandatory adjunct meetings. Other sessions or seminars, such as regional Rotary Foundation seminars or regional membership seminars, may be held at the same time and in the same location as an institute or nearby. These separate sessions or seminars do not interfere with or duplicate the institute's main program or the International Assembly program and are promoted as quite distinct from the institute itself. Any events coming before or after an institute, such as GETS, regional Rotary Foundation seminars, or recreational events, are clearly described as pre- or post-institute events that may involve a different audience from the institute






# HOW DO YOU WANT TO BE REMEMBERED?

# Bits & Pieces

## 3 BIKE SAFETY TIPS FROM PROFESSIONAL MOUNTAIN BIKER...

Before hitting the trails, it's important to be attentive, check your gear (days before the ride), and keep watch of your surroundings

Recreational Outdoor Exchange organized a seminar called Ride Safe and Ride Hard featuring professional bike rider, coach, and race organizer Eboy Roselada on Aug. 29, Wednesday. Roselada, who has been in the mountain bike community for 30 years now and is an advocate of bike gear and equipment safety, says the top three factors that can determine whether or not accidents occur include surroundings, equipment or gear, and human factors (such as physical and emotional states). It's easy to blame your bike skills as the main cause of an accident, but in reality it has more to do with those three factors. And so the number one rule to a safe outdoor bike session is to make sure that your surroundings, apparel, and physical and emotional conditions are all secure.

## Don't Take Your Surroundings For Granted

Before you hit the trail, Roselada says it's important to first check the weather, terrain, and temperature. If you tend to take outdoor conditions like the weather for granted, remember that regardless of how skilled you are, these conditions are crucial to your performance. But besides the weather forecast, the coach suggests to always be mindful of basic safety rules, road rules, and appropriate gear (for instance, reflective gear is especially necessary during night time).

## Check Your Equipment Before Race Day

"Whenever I organize adventure rides,

I always require [the team] to have their bikes checked at least three days before the actual ride," says Roselada. Don't wait for the actual race day before giving your bike a thorough check. It's something that has to be done during your training sessions or at least days before the actual race. Roselada stresses the importance of making sure your brakes, tires, helmets, protective gear, and drivetrain equipment are ready before you hit the road. Even if it's a sunny day and you're confident about your bike skills, there's still a good chance to experience an accident if your gear is not in good condition. Other things you must master before you hit the road are the attack position, front stops and rear slow brakes, and control and cornering, which are basic biking skills that can save you from an accident.

## **Have the Right Mindset (and Skill Set)**

"I always ask my [team] if they're okay with biking on a trail with a mix of signal tracks, downhill, and some grounded rocks. I ask them if they're up for it. If they say yes, then they're good to go. But if they say no, then that's a problem," Roselada says.

Before you start biking, it's important to have the right mindset: That is, you have to be sure of yourself once you hit the trail. This assurance is largely indebted to first making sure that your proficiency level is at par with the kind of biking trail you've chosen. If you feel that a trail is too complicated, and you're not too confident about your current biking skill, don't bike on that trail. It's better to cycle through a "safe" track in which you're a hundred percent sure of what you're doing. Because even if your bike is in good condition and the weather is ideal, if you're at a level that's not aligned with the track's difficulty level, an accident can still happen.

He also put his money where his mouth is -- He is a Paul Harris Society member and a Major Donor. He believes that this financial contribution demonstrates his commitment to serve others. Aside from being a Rotarian, he is also actively involved in other socio-civic and religious organizations. He is currently the Vice Chair - Visayas of Philippine Business for Social Progress (PBSP); Board of Regents of Cebu Technological University (CTU), a certified Fellow of the Institute of Corporate Directors (ICD), Past President of the Mandaue Chamber (MCCI) and eleven other prestigious civic,

religious and non- governmental organizations, both local and national.

His dedication to serve the country was twice recognized by former President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, for promoting productivity and innovations in his advocacy and contributions that benefited businesses groups, government agencies, LGU's and particularly, the **Department of Labor and Employment.** In 2014, former **President Benigno Aquino III** appointed him as one of the Management Representative to the Regional Tripartite Wages and Productivity Board of **DOLE Region 7.** In 2016, **SGV / Ernst and Young** awarded him INNOVATION ENTREPRENEUR OF THE **YEAR** in the Philippines. He was conferred the honorary degree as **Doctor of Philosophy** in **Technology** Management by Cebu Technological University, with concurrence by the Commission on Higher Education (CHED) for strengthening Vocational Technology education.

As an **entrepreneur**, he started his micro business from scratch with limited financial resources and no formal education in **Engineering**. Slowly but surely, he brought his company to success without sacrificing the betterment of his employees, which includes **PWD's**. He is the founding **Chairman**, **President & Chief Executive Officer** of **Wellmade Motors & Development Corporation**, an **ISO-9001:2015** international certification in respect for its quality management system, manufacturing and metalworking technologies, with **subsidiary** companies, **joint ventures** and **franchisees** in the **Philippines** and **South East Asia**.

A servant leader, he is happily married to spouse *Judith*, raising four children and with their first newly born 4<sup>th</sup> generation **grandson**. His eldest son, *Jeffrey*, is also an awarded **Rotarian** and an active member of the *Rotary Club of Cebu Port Center*.
