UNDERSTANDING RI (3)

Starting the First Week of February 2020 I started a series of articles that should give you a better idea of ROTARY INTERNATIONAL (RI) ... THE LARGER ORGANIZATION. I do hope you will also learn something more about RI, its structure, its plans and goals, etc. I picked a few things from the manual of procedure that are good to know:

On the Officers of Rotary International

President

The president is the highest officer of RI. The president is the principal person to speak on the organization's behalf, presides at conventions and meetings of the RI Board, counsels the general secretary, and performs other related duties.

President-elect

The president-elect has only those duties that arise from the RI Bylaws and from membership on the RI Board, but may be assigned further duties by the president or the RI Board.

Vice President

The vice president is selected by the incoming president at the RI Board's first meeting each year from among the members of the RI Board serving the second year of their terms. The vice president serves for a one-year term beginning on 1 July.

Treasurer

The treasurer is selected by the incoming president at the RI Board's first meeting each year from among the members of the RI Board serving the second year of their terms. The treasurer serves for a one-year term beginning on 1 July.

The treasurer regularly receives financial information from, and confers with, the general secretary on the management of RI finances. The treasurer makes appropriate reports to the RI Board and also makes a report to the RI Convention.

General Secretary

The general secretary is the chief operating officer of RI. As chief operating officer, the general secretary is responsible for the dayto-day management of RI and under the direction and control of the RI Board. The general secretary is responsible to the president and the RI Board for the implementation of its policies and for the operations and administration, including the financial operation, of RI. The general secretary also communicates RI Board policies to Rotarians and Rotary clubs. The general secretary is solely

responsible for the supervision of the Secretariat staff.

Upon approval by the RI Board, the general secretary submits an annual report to the convention. The general secretary's term shall be no more than five years, but a person may be re-elected.

The general secretary

- 1) Implements the policies of RI, the RI Board, and the Foundation Trustees
- 2) Supervises all operations of the Secretariat, including but not limited to those functions related to finance, program, communication, planning, The Rotary Foundation, and administrative matters
- 3) Assists the RI Board and the Trustees in long-range planning and policy formation
- 4) Makes decisions on behalf of the RI Board, as authorized, and executes all legal documents and contracts on behalf of RI and its Foundation
- 5) Works in close cooperation with the president in carrying out the responsibilities of the general secretary's office

Effective ways to prevent the Coronavirus. Worth a read.

About the virus:

- 1. It is pretty large in size (cell is about 400-500nm diameter), so any normal mask (not just the N95 feature) should be able to filter it out. However, when someone who's infected sneezes in front of you, it will take a great 3 meters (about 10 feet) before it drops to the ground and is no longer airborne.
- 2. When the virus drops on metal surface, it will live for at least 12 hours. So remember if you come in contact with any metal surface, wash your hands with soap thoroughly.
- 3. The virus can remain active on fabric for 6-12 hours. Normal laundry detergent should kill the virus. But if you are really worried, you can add some non-chlorine bleach or oxygen bleach . For winter clothing that does not require daily washing, you can put it out under the sun to kill the virus.


About the symptoms of the pneumonia caused by Coronavirus:

- 1. It will first infect the throat, so the throat will have the dry sore throat feeling which will last for 3 to 4 days
- 2. Then the virus will blend into the nasal fluid and drips into the trachea and enter the lungs,

- causing pneumonia. This process will take 5 to 6 days.
- 3. With pneumonia, comes high fever and difficulty in breathing. The nasal congestion is not like the normal kind. You will feel like you are drowning in water. It's important to go seek immediate medical attention if you feel like this.

About prevention:

- 1. The most common way of getting infected is by touching things in public, so you must wash your hands frequently. The virus can only live on your hands for 5-10 mins, but a lot can happen in those 5-10 mins.
- 2. Aside from washing your hands frequently, you can gargle with a strong Chlorhexidine based mouthwash (i.e. Orahex Oral Rinse) to eliminate or minimize the germs while they are still in your throat and moving elsewhere

So, now that you've actually heard of Rotary, you're probably thinking, "Wait, should I be one of these Rotarians?"

I would never pressure you to do something that will improve your life in every conceivable way, but how about I just tell you the benefits I've personally seen from being involved in Rotary for seven years? And then you can decide on your own that you should absolutely, definitely join.

1. You'll make local connections.

Rotary can introduce you to other like-minded and wonderfully diverse people from your

community. Ultimately, to most of us, this is what it's all about: local frnds, local colleagues, clients and contacts. Heck, it's actually why Rotary was started by a group of young professionals in Chicago back in 1905. When it comes to networking and advancing your business, Rotary membership isn't like the fickle, transactional networking and "referral" groups you've likely been encouraged to join. We trust your kind understanding as our primordial concern is your welfare.


