Q: What is the most important personal quality that must be displayed by an effective Rotary President?

Cille: "For me it is being courageous to take on great responsibilities and the ability to adapt to changes in a pragmatic way. On top of these traits I also believe that having empathy and compassion strengthens one's ability to lead especially in a challenging time like the pandemic."

Q: In your term, what was the major organizational change and challenges that the pandemic has brought and how did you adapt to it?

Cille: "We faced a lot of challenges during the lockdown, the creativity and resourcefulness of each member had been tested. We held meetings via video calls through Zoom applications and made use of our available resources."

Q: What helped that change take place effectively?

Cille: "Apart from doing all meetings and some of the projects virtually, another thing that helped us conduct Rotary projects is the collaboration and sponsorship of different organizations and LGUs. They supported, and provided us with materials that would be used for our projects.

I could say that a big part of the success of my term was because of all greater ladies. We learn from each other and conquer the struggles thrown at us for the sake of the general public. With the dedication, compassion, and cooperation of every one of us, we were able to manage and execute rotary projects that would benefit other people in the community"

Q: What was the most important thing you had to consider when starting a Rotary Project during the pandemic?

Cille: "One of the challenges for the organization is the limited resources since we were all confined in our homes. The availability of our resources depends on what is available inside our houses. Although there are still ways how to gain resources, that way is surely costly as we need to pay for service and delivery fees."

Q: Please tell us about your terms journey during pandemic. How did you manage to execute rotary projects despite of the lockdown situations etc.?

Carl: "By the grace of God. With the help and support of the Greater Ladies who continue to serve and to deliver the community service projects of the club. The pandemic did not hinder the Greater Ladies from doing what they do best, that is to deliver and implement the club's community service projects especially those for the women and the children like the feeding program. The technology is also of great help during the pandemic."

Q: What was your biggest motivation in becoming a Rotarian?

Carl: "The sense of having a family in the Greater Ladies. To be in the company of the amazing Greater Ladies, some of whom I already knew before I became a Rotarian."

Q: Who introduced you to Rotary?

Carl: "My college barkada in the University of the Philippines-Visaya, and also Atty. Psyche Rizsavi Fontanilla-Mamadra who invited me to the club."

Q: How long have you been a member?

Carl: "Since July 1, 2018"

Q: Tell us about your chosen career and what advantage does it gives you in order to become an effective Rotarian and President in your term?

Carl: "I am a lawyer. I was in litigation for 12 years before I entered the government service.

When I was the Club President, I was then active in litigation. Being a lawyer for more than a decade helps me in my journey as Club President.

The network that I already have also helps in the implementation of the club's community service projects especially during the height of the pandemic in 2020.

However, those are mere add ons. The biggest advantage in becoming an effective Rotarian and Club President came from the support given by the Greater Ladies who made everything possible, and who made my journey as President smooth, beautiful, stressfree, and successful. Beside an effective President is a group of supportive and amazing club members."

Q: What is the most important personal quality that must be displayed by an effective Rotary President?

Carl: "Every Rotarian has the ability to lead; they already have that innate ability to be a leader. Aside from this, I think, one has to have the ability to listen, the willingness to learn more, the willingness to delegate, to think outside of the box, and to be compassionate."

Q: In your term, what was the major organizational change and challenges that the pandemic has brought and how did you adapt to it?

Carl: "There are a lot of challenges at that time. First, the areas of focus was increased from 6 to 7, Supporting the Environment was added. Second, majority of the members in the club belong to the age group of 55 and up who are most susceptible to the risks of COVID-19. Third, the extended lockdown due to COVID-19 pandemic. Fourth, the lack of preparations for the pandemic. We are not prepared. We have no basic medical supplies to address the pandemic. Fifth, the new technology of doing almost everything online. Finally, those challenges from first to fifth became opportunities for the club. We take advantge of the technology in doing things. We are able to implement projects despite the lockdown. We became more creative and inventive.

In sum, the club immediately acted and implemented community service projects aimed to address the pandemic.

For example, the club in partnership with the Red Cross and London Beach Resort was able to provide 15 units of Portable Hand Washing Facility to the LGU. Also, the club was able to provide the local frontliners through the City Health Office with face masks, face shields, alcohol, bottled water, food, and others. Likewise, during the said pandemic when the face to face classes are not possible, our club in partnership with the Rotaract Club of Stratford International School launched the Klehe'w Akbasa project. Our rotaractors held small group tutorials to elementary students in General Santos City and in Sarangani Province. Those were a few of the opportunities that open the doors for time-bound and situation-appropriate projects during the pandemic."

Q: What was the most important thing you had to consider when starting a Rotary Project during the pandemic?

Carl: "The availability of the resources, the supply of materials, the logistics of getting and delivering the supplies, and the manpower."

Q: How did you ensure that every member of the club engaged and active during your term?

Carl: "We set our meetings and fellowships virtually on regular basis, at least once a week.

We sometimes do virtual get together parties with themes. This way, we are able to continue our creativity and productivity despite the lockdown.

Also, we are able to spend time with each other, check each other's health and well-being, and etcetera."

Let's get a bit personal.

Q: What are hobbies and interests you would like to share with the ladies in the club. What satisfaction do you get out of doing these activities and how often do you do it?

Carl: "Going outdoor like the beach or the park- walking or running. Baking and being a plantita which I acquire and learn during the pandemic/lockdown.

I do them whenever I have time. Going to the beach with the family is a must at least every 2 months; and a weekly walk in the park or a visit to a museum is mandatory. Aside from the relaxation it brings, it brings me closer to nature and allows me to breathe. But most importantly, it gives me the most important one, quality time with the family."

Q: How do you find work life balance:

Carl: "I enjoy my work as much as possible but I also find time for self growth, time to enjoy with my family and taking care of my child."Q: Quotes to live by.

With the generous members' "bayanihan and malasakit" attitude, we were also able to raise cash and goods donation on top of the club fees which has enabled the club to be able to reach out to more beneficiaries.
