Partnership MOU Signing with USAID PbEd Youth works PH

The Rotary Club of Greater General Santos led by President Ester Marian S. Balolot partnered with United States Agency for International Development (USAID) to collaborate on Youth Recruitment and Private Sector Engagement for PBEd's "YouthWorks PH", an industry-led development project which targets to improve the relevance and quality of workforce development programs in the country especially for marginalized at-risk youth not in education, employment, and training. Rotary Club of Greater General Santos agrees to assist in promoting the program to its beneficiaries and families in the community, provide list of pre-qualified applicants and assist in identifying and referral of private sector partnership to participate in work-based training programs. The partnership signing was done last September 29, 2022, at Grand Summit Hotel together with other industry partners which will open 700 training slots in construction, automotive, agriculture and retail for the youth in General Santos City, Sarangani and South Cotabato.


Q.: What is the most important personal quality that must be displayed by an effective Rotarian?




