## **BOARD MEETINGS:**

Our 2<sup>nd</sup> Board Meeting was held on August 5, 2020 through Zoom. There was a quorum with 10 directors present. The following topics were discussed during the meeting.

## 1. Streetlight Grant

- Sec. Kathleen Quintero and Pres. Lolit Escano met with Streetlight headed by its President,

Erland Johannesen and Neva Johannesen. Our decision now is to move forward so we can go ahead with the project. Sec. Kathleen Quintero emphasized that the role of RC Kandaya, is just to monitor the project and not do the auditing. It is the role of Rotary International to audit the project. We shall be waiting for the meeting of Neva with TESDA regarding the new procedures. In the meantime, we will just have to inform Rotary International and Rotary Norway regarding the status of the grant and the request for an extension.

- We have already prepared the reports. However, there is an ongoing problem of the web portal of Rotary International being unavailable.

## 2. Report of Treasurer Caroline Andrade

- Treas. Caroline Andrade emphasized that the TRF Fund is really \$100 per member. Since we have 33 members, the total is \$3,300 for RC Kandaya. For the EREY, it is \$25 per member. For the polio fund, it is only \$200.00 per club.
- We were able to pay our SAR on time on July 30, 2020.

Our 3<sup>rd</sup> regular meeting was held on August 12, 2020 hosted by Peony team with its team leader, Bless Javier. 17 attendees joined our virtual meeting. 





Sharing with you the seventh area of Focus for Rotary year 2020-2021 - Supporting the Environment,
