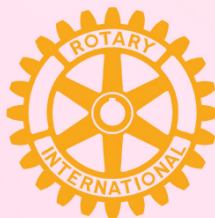

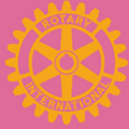

Our Regular meetings were amazingly joined by a very encouraging number of beautiful Kandayans, who actively participated in the activities prepared for us by our Team Hosts, Game Changers and Catalysts of Change. During the finest moments, we willingly shared as we appreciate each and every Kandayan, all worthy of our praises. Our Induction and Handover Ceremonies, as District Governor Anna described, was a very organized and seamless event. Thanks to the Working Committee led by our Club Administration Chair VP Liza Calda, Dir Vickie, DES Caroline, Sec Bless, PE Miranda, SAA Annabel and our club Clerk Daben!

And because we are all enjoying what we are doing, we didn't notice that despite our busy schedules, we already did five (5) Projects for this month. First, we were able to extend financial help to three (3) Breast Cancer patients. Second, we extended care and help by distributing food packs to 160 homeless families due to fire disaster in Punta Dumalag, Davao, in partnership with the Rotary Club of Sta Ana. Third, we tied-up with the Philippine Red Cross and UP Tacloban in sponsoring the Bloodletting Activity together with the other Rotary clubs in Tacloban. Fourth, we forged a partnership with the Blood Samaritan Program, a new venue to reach out to the needy, introduced to us by baby Rotarian, Joy Valledor, making us their pilot partner in Region 8. And the fifth project for the month is, Local Wifi Orientation and Training Program with Northern Tacloban City National High School (NTCNHS), in coordination with the Electronic Engineering Department of Eastern Visayas State University (EVSU) and the Institute of Electronic Engineers in Eastern Visayas. This is a continuing project with the An Taclobanon Association of Southern California.

This is just a start, the spirit is so high, the passion to help is so intense! Thank you all for your cooperation and support to our cause. These are just some of the exciting things we will push as we continuously Serve to Change Lives

God bless us all in this exciting journey towards greatness. Together, let us dare to excel!

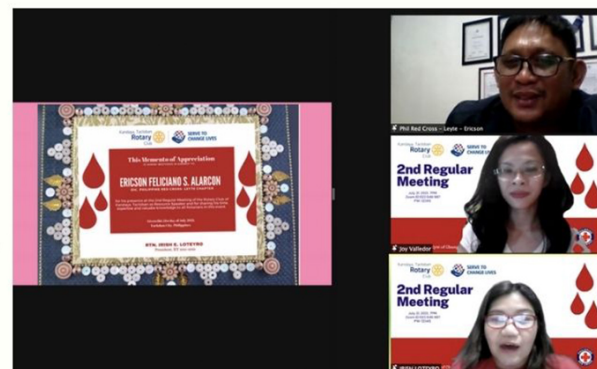

SECOND REGULAR MEETING

The Rotary Club of Kandaya, Tacloban held its Second Regular Meeting led by the Catalysts of Change Team. We had eighteen (18) Rotarians attend the meeting, together with one (1) guest, and four (4) Rotaractors. The team was able to raise P8,000 during the finest moment.

As July has been designated as National Blood Donor's Month pursuant to Presidential Proclamation No. 1021, dated July 9, 1997, the Catalysts of Change Group, headed by Rtn. Joy Valledor, chose to have a theme related to this. The team has invited Mr. Ericson Alarcon, OIC for Philippine Red Cross - Leyte Chapter as guest speaker. He talked about the Blood Samaritan Program which aims to assist indigent patients needing blood transfusion. Although the blood is free, the money donated covers the blood processing fees of the legitimate indigent patients. The Catalysts of Change Team was able to raise P10,000 for this cause.
