Fundamentals of Followership

Much emphasis is given on leadership, so little is placed on followership. "A good leader is a good follower." ...so goes the adage. But then, what does it really take to be a good follower?

Allow me to enumerate some fundamentals of followership (FF):

FF1 – Participate. Get involved and take part in Rotary activities, meetings, projects. A good follower is an active participant.

FF4 – Be ready to lead. Shared leadership is a hallmark of effective teams. It is a sign of dynamic succession planning when organization finds it hard narrowing its choice of new leaders. When needed, are Kandayans willing and capable to assume leadership? A good follower is a leader waiting to be.

As we start the Rotary New Year, we rely upon the greatness of those who follow. Lovely Kandayans, let us all practice good followership.
