Rotary Club of Kandaya is also set to donate printers to nearby schools, to support the Brigada Eskwela, Program of the DEPED.


We also tied up with our Rotaract Clubs, Community based and School based, and theDaycare Teachers under the City government of Tacloban to facilitate literacy activities with the children.

TRUE EDUCATION



(In line with our September theme, let me share with you a story that never fails to grip me. The lesson is powerful: real education is a journey of transforming the human being in to being human. Unless education makes one a good person, it is of no use! The same wisdom in Joseph Addison's "What sculpture is to a block of marble, education is to a human soul." Please read on...)

An old man meets a young man who asks: "Do you remember me?" Old man says no. The young man informed he was his student. Teacher asks: "What do you do in life?" Young man answers: "Well, I am a teacher... because you inspired me to be like you." Teacher, curious, asks student at what time he decided to become a teacher. And the young man tells him the following story:

"One day, a classmate, came in with a nice new watch, and I decided I wanted it. I stole it. Shortly after, the missing watch was reported to you, our teacher. You then annouced, 'A watch is missing, please return it.' No one did. You closed the door and told us all to stand up and form a circle. You were going to search our pockets one by one, with our eyes closed. We did as instructed. You went from pocket to pocket, and in mine , you found the watch and took it. Yet, you continued searching... then you instructed "Open your eyes. We have the watch." You didn't tell on me, no word about the incident. That day you saved my dignity forever. It was the most shameful day of my life. But that was also the day I decided not to become a thief! There was no reproach from you, not a word, but I understood your message clearly. Thanks to you, I discovered what true education is."Teacher, do you remember this episode?" Teacher answered: 'Yes, I remember that situation with the stolen watch. I did not remember you, because I also closed my eyes while searching.'
