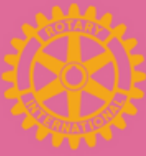

Our members and our foundation work to strengthen local entrepreneurs and community leaders, particularly women, in impoverished communities.

How Rotary Makes Help Happen

We create opportunities to help individuals and communities thrive financially and socially. We provide training and access to well-paying jobs and financial management institutions such as:

- **Microloans** - Entrepreneurs use microloans to become street vendors, rickshaw drivers, weavers, and tailors.
- **Agricultural Opportunities** - Entrepreneurs in rural communities can borrow money to buy livestock or plant crops, or get training in sustainable farming.
- **Adopt A Village** - Rotary members use a multifaceted and coordinated strategy to break the cycle of poverty in extremely impoverished communities.
- **Training** - Rotary International and Heifer International are teaching farmers to extend their growing season and help residents eat healthier, local food.
- **The Power of Light** - Rotary members team up with the Navajo Nation to bring solar lights to remote, off-the-grid homes, allowing people to work and learn at night.
- **Human Rights** - Rotary helps Tanzanians with albinism overcome stigma and superstition to find safety and a livelihood.

Our Impact on Local economies

Rotary members train people to become resources for their community, offering networking activities, advice on new business development, and mathematics and financial management training.

Rotarians make amazing things happen, like:

Breaking the cycle of poverty for women: Most of the women living in rural Guatemala do not have the collateral to get loans from regulated financial institutions. The Rotary Club of Guatemala de la Ermita helped 400 local women complete financial literacy courses so they could pool their money and fund their own microlending program.

Skills development, business training: In Esmeraldas, Ecuador, Rotary members helped grant more than 250 microloans and train more than 270 community members in sewing, baking, plumbing, microcredit, business management, and leadership.

Sustainable farming: In west Cameroon, soil erosion and loss of soil fertility have significantly reduced farmers' harvests. Rotary members gave farmers the skills they needed to improve soil fertility, control soil erosion, and market their produce. The results: increased crop yields and profits.

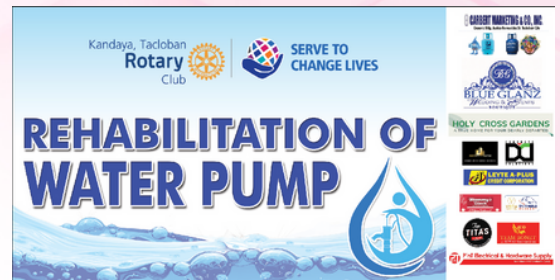

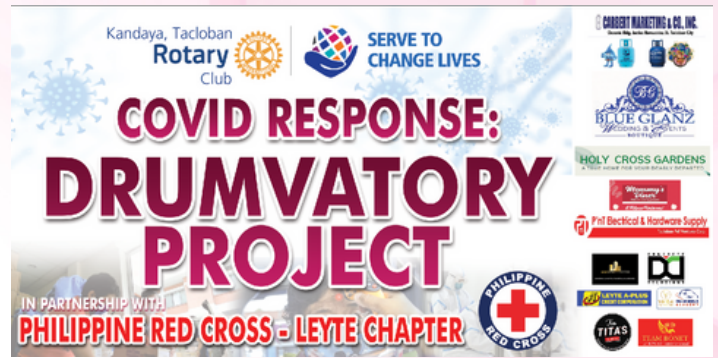

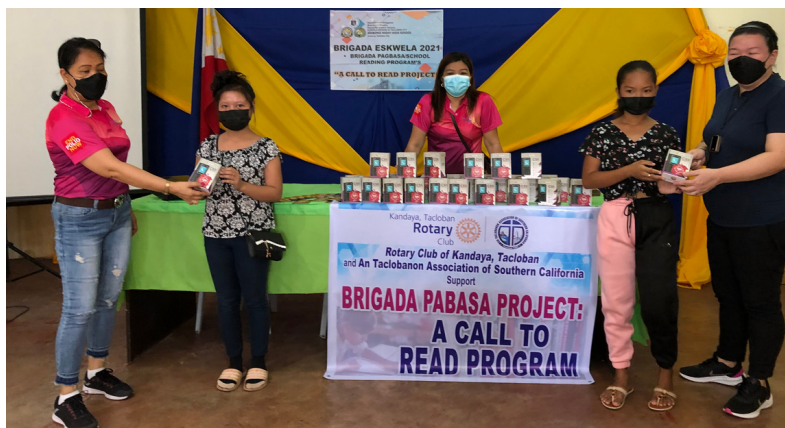

This type of cancer may start in the mammary glands, the part of the breast that produces milk, or in the milk ducts leading to the nipple.

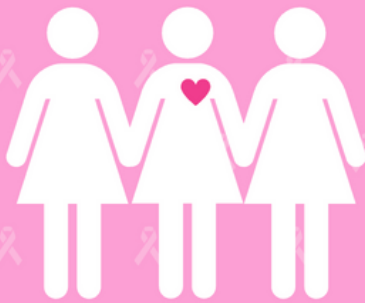

Early diagnosis of cancer generally increases the chances for successful treatment.

The Risk Factors

1. Age - Growing Older
2. Family History - Especially if close relatives such as your mother, child or sister suffered from breast cancer.
3. Personal Medical History - if you have had breast cancer before
4. Early onset of menstruation - before the age 12
5. Late Menopause - After the age of 55
6. Not having borne children or not having borne them before the age of 35.
7. Being Overweight - The risk becomes higher when overweight during menopause.
8. Alcohol consumption
9. Smoking
10. Prolonged use of Hormonal Replacement Therapy HRT or Estrogen Replacement Therapy or ERT



Self-Breast Exam



01

Lie down with your back resting on a flat, comfortable surface. Raise your left arm. Put a pillow or folded towel below your shoulder.



02

Use the three middle fingers of your right hand to feel for lumps, making sure they are pressed together. Use the convex of these three fingers together (not the fingertips) to feel for lumps.



03

Keep your fingers straight and press them together on your left breasts.



04

Using vertical movements, begin from armpits and move fingers downward until below the breast. Move toward the middle and back up. Repeat through chest and entire breast.



05

Feel under and around the nipple.



06

Repeat on your right breast using your left hand.

What Every Filipino Rotarian Should Know

The Philippines by 2040: *Matatag, Maginhawa, at Panatag na Buhay*. By then, the country is a prosperous middle-class society where no one is poor. People live longer and healthier and are smarter and more innovative. The Philippines is a high-trust society, where families thrive in vibrant, culturally diverse, and resilient communities. "*Ito ang AmBisyon Natin 2040*" -- this is the collective long-term vision and aspirations of the Filipino people for the Philippines. It is a vision, not a plan.

There are three major pillars to achieve *AmBisyon Natin 2040*: *Malasakit* (Enhancing the social fabric), *Pagbabago* (Inequality-reducing transformation), and *Patuloy na Pag-unlad* (Increasing potential growth).

Pagbabago means that for each economic sector, there will be more opportunities for growth of output and income. This is otherwise called economic development, where the Rotary tries to make significant contribution, especially, that our monthly theme for October is Economic and Community Development.

It is important to recognize that while economic development and community development are not the same, they both serve a common purpose: to change lives for the better. All Rotarians would agree how closely aligned this is to the Rotary Motto: *Serve to Change Lives*.

Community development is a process of making a community a better place to live in and work at. It seeks to empower individuals and groups of people with the skills they need to effect change within their communities. Economic development is a process by which emerging economies become advanced economies. Put simply, economic development is all about improving living standards, which equates to the process in which people become wealthier, healthier, better educated, and have greater access to good quality housing. Apart from these living standards, it also looks at the freedom that citizens have to enjoy those living standards.

Knowing the essence of this month's theme and its impact on our aspirations as a people, it is one sure way to have a heightened sense of citizenship that is most needed in this most trying times.
