

Major Donor

Major Donors may elect to receive a crystal recognition piece and pin(s) commemorating the gift at each new recognition level. Major Donors are listed in the Major Donor, Arch Klumph Society, and Bequest Society Report.

Rotary members are passionate about finding sustainable PRESIDENT ELECT solutions to ending poverty. The issue has become even more important because of how the COVID-19 pandemic has affected poverty levels and advanced inequality in communities around the globe. During Community Economic Development Month, consider how you can address community needs and challenges.

Involve community members in your work:

- Sponsor or work with an existing Rotary Community Corps, to engage members of the community where you're working and help a project become sustainable by empowering local leaders.
- Contact your district community service chair, who can advise you about developing local projects to address your community's local needs. The service chair can also connect you to local organizations, district committees, and other Rotary groups that focus on service.

Increase your impact by working with one of Rotary's service and project partners:

- Ashoka helps find creative solutions to social problems.
- Habitat for Humanity International provides safe and affordable shelter to families in need.
- The Peace Corps promotes peace and community development.
- ShelterBox provides disaster relief such as emergency shelter and aid to families.

Connect with community economic development experts to ensure that your projects are effective and sustainable:

- Contact your district international service chair, who can connect you with other local experts in this area of focus.
- Contact a Rotary Action Group to get expert advice on planning and implementing a project and help finding partners, funding, and resources. Many of these groups focus on economic issues, like the action groups for community economic development, disaster assistance, and food plant solutions.



EDITOR'S NOTE

Bits of Facts on BCA and WPD

The Rotary Club of Kandaya's (RCK) observance of Breast Cancer Awareness (BCA) Month and World Polio Day (WPD) in October amid the global Corona Virus 19 pandemic epitomizes two essentials: vigilance and solidarity. RCK has consistently played a pivotal role in launching and propagating Rotary International's decades-long global BCAM campaign and polio eradication initiatives.

Let us refresh ourselves with some interesting facts about these two important events:

BCA is an annual campaign to raise awareness about the impact of breast cancer and support women to reduce the risks. It aims to remove the fear and stigma of cancer and help people recognize the early signs and symptoms, thus, enabling them to seek treatment at an early stage. Cancer awareness can also lead to people making healthier lifestyle choices.

The pink ribbon is the most prominent international symbol of BCA. Pink ribbons and the color pink, promotes the breast cancer brand and express moral support for women with breast cancer, thus coining the term Pink October. People wear pink ribbons to remember those lost to the disease, support the progress we are making together to defeat breast cancer, and to honor survivors. On this score, we salute beautiful and resilient Kandayan breast cancer survivors – Rotarians Beth, Elaine, Liza.

Rotary, World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention launched in 1988 the Global Polio Eradication Initiative. In 2007, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation joined Rotary in its commitment to ending polio.

Polio virus is a highly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. There is no cure, but polio is preventable with a vaccine. Unless polio is ended forever, every child is at risk. Cases are reduced by 99.9% since 1988. Three countries left where polio remains endemic: Afghanistan, Pakistan, Nigeria.

Rotary has contributed more than \$2 billion dollars to fight polio, including matching funds from the Gates Foundation, and countless volunteer hours since launching its polio eradication program, Polio Plus, in 1985. Worth mentioning now, would be the generosity and best examples of humanitarian service of the RCK lovely ladies in the club's efforts of becoming 100% Paul Harris Fellows.
