Presidential Message

We have overcome so many challenges these past two years and changed numerous lives. It brings me great joy that we have worked so hard this year to grow Rotary through the Each One, Bring One initiative. The result has been excellent growth in membership. Let us keep up the momentum. I am happy that you have put a spotlight on all we do by organizing projects around the world in our Rotary Days of Service. The future looks brighter than ever for Rotary and our 1.4 million members.

On 11 March 2020, the World Health Organization declared that COVID-19 constituted a pandemic, and two years later it is important that we continue to draw on our expertise in our disease prevention and treatment area of focus to help people worldwide cope with the continuing challenges. The pandemic continues to defy all expectations, but we cannot be frozen in fear. Our work is too important. It is also important that we make time for each other, and I urge you to register for the upcoming 2022 Rotary International Convention in Houston. It is a great way for all of us to safely celebrate Rotary service.

We can continue to build hope and spread peace in the world by using our resources to help the most vulnerable and keeping our faith in the future. The pandemic has had an especially devastating impact on girls worldwide. On the first anniversary of the pandemic, Henrietta Fore, the executive director of UNICEF, said that "immediate action is needed to mitigate the toll on girls and their families." This need, unfortunately, remains just as strong a year later. The ripples of the pandemic have affected girls in unique ways — stunting their educational attainment, weakening their job prospects, and contributing to other terrible results such as child marriages and increased human trafficking.

Data from UNICEF reveals why our action is so essential. In the 2010s, important progress was made toward eliminating the practice of child marriage, and UNICEF estimates that 25 million such marriages were averted worldwide. Unfortunately, the pandemic reversed those positive trends, and as a result an additional 10 million girls are vulnerable to becoming child brides by the end of this decade.

This is why our focus on Empowering Girls is such vital work, and I am delighted that at this year's virtual International Assembly, President-elect Jennifer Jones committed to continuing this initiative for another year. In my travels, I have witnessed many wonderful examples of club projects that back our Empowering Girls goals. But all Rotary members know that real change requires big efforts sustained over many years. This is the power of our global grants and actions taken within our areas of focus.

I encourage clubs to think of innovative ways to empower girls when designing their grant projects. Every step we take to improve education, health care, and economic opportunities for girls makes an important difference in helping them achieve their full potential. With opportunity we create hope, and with hope we address the root causes of conflict around the world, setting the stage for sustainable peace.

None of us know how long the COVID-19 virus will linger — and as an organization that has worked tirelessly for decades to eradicate polio, we understand better than most the difficult work that lies ahead for the world. That is why we need to remain focused on the future and on what is possible — not feeling nostalgic for the way our lives were, but looking hopefully to a future that uses this opportunity to *Serve to Change Lives*. I look forward to continuing this good work with you.

Congratulations Rotarians! We have done a great job! Having said this, with heads held up high , I am proud to present our club to the person with the highest position in our District.



History of Rotary International

Rotary started with the vision of one man — Paul Harris. The Chicago attorney formed the Rotary Club of Chicago on 23 February 1905, so professionals with diverse backgrounds could exchange ideas and form meaningful, lifelong friendships.

Over time, Rotary's reach and vision gradually extended to humanitarian service. Members have a long track record of addressing challenges in their communities and around the world.



History of Kankabato

The Rotary Club of Kankabato's story starts with the history of the name "Kankabato". According to historians, the place near Balyuan in the present day Brgy. Sto. Nino, Tacloban City, used to be called "Kankabatok". This was before the Spanish missionaries from Basey, Samar, changed it to "Takluban" in the 17th century.

Kankabato Bay is a beautiful shallow bay stretching along the length of Real Street, reaching around the corner where Brgy. San Jose's mini-peninsula protrudes. Kankabato, thus represented the community of Taclobanons who lived by this beautiful bay.

The Rotary Club of Kankabato (Club #84232) was formally recognized as a club of District 3860 by Rotary International on the 20th of December 2011 with ___ () charter members. It was the Rotary Club of San Juanico who sponsored the club, as a response to a positive call and challenge by then District Governor Nonoy Villa-Abrille.

The Rotary Club of Kankbabato has also sponsored one (1) Rotary Club in the Province of Biliran Island, the Rotary Club of Biliran, based in Naval. Presently, it also has two (2) Rotaract Clubs, namely, Rotaract Club of Kankabato (Community-based) and Rotaract Club of Kankabato – AMA (School-based). The Rotary Club of Kankabato also has three (3) Sister Clubs, namely, the Rotary Club of Quirino, the Rotary Club of Makati Poblacion and the Fukui Ajisai-Japan Rotary Club.

This Rotary year, the Rotary Club of Kankabato is steered by Rtn. Sigmundo Catingub, the club's 10th president under this year's theme: "SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES."











The echoes of Rotarians of the Rotary Club of Kankabato reverberates beyond words, continuously manifesting through a determined approach to assistance for others, identified through a meticulous process in planning and implementation in programs and projects. 10 years on, the resolve remains steadfastly the same, "service above self!"

Yes, there is no stopping Rotary Club of Kankabato!

Now on its 10th Rotary Year as a premier club of Rotarians, the Rotary Club of Kankabato sees itself as continuing its mantra of providing service to others, promotion of integrity, and advancing goodwill, peace, and understanding in Tacloban City and the whole part Eastern Visayas Region. As a group composed of men and women from business and professional fields drawn to serve communities, the mantra of "service above self " continues to draw inspiration for all members as we stive to make a better Tacloban City and even the best Region 8 there could be.

When Typhoon Odette brought horrific destruction in the provinces of Surigao del Norte and Dinagat Islands in Mindanao, in five provinces of Visayas, and in the island of Palawan in Luzon on December 16 2021, we thought we had seen enough from Super Typhoon Yolanda. And out of grief, looking over the news of the extent of damage of Typhoon Odette, something had to be done. As Taclobanons, we felt it was time for us to help back.

"We should not forget that there are people still suffering from the effects of Typhoon Odette. 2 months since Typhoon Odette wretched areas in Southern Leyte, it is time for Rotary Club of Kankabato to be of service to people of Southern Leyte so that they can get back on their feet," RC Kankabato President Sigmundo Rio A. Catingub shared his sentiments to the club.





As Rotary clubs serve communities around the world, each with unique concerns and needs, the Rotary Club of Kankabatok immediately extended help to Typhoon Odette-struck communities in Southern Leyte through donation drives. And most recently, it has donated lend a Solar Charging Station for Barangay Tigbao, Libagon Southern Leyte.

"We need our cellphones to work so we can call others for help!"

Mired by an overwhelming workload for the electric company in the locale as electricity remains a problem for several barangays in the town of Libagon, Southern Leyte, on Monday, February 15, 2022, with the constituents of the barangay in attendance, a Solar USB Charging Station which can generate up to 32A Amperes max for about 16 phones at 2 Amperes each was installed by the Rotary Club of Kankabato. As fisherfolks rush towards the seas for food in the table for their families, the women of the house saw the new equipment as a tool towards further help.



For Barangay Tigbao Chairman Emilio Ranque, he shared with Rotary Club of Kankabato President Sigmundo Rio A. Catingub the concerns of their barangay. Aside from food and health kits, communication was hard as their barangay has yet to be reenergized.

"We will never lose hope. Help will come in different ways. I am glad God sent the Rotary Club of Kankabato through President Sir Sigmund Catingub. This solar charging station will help us hasten work in our place," Chairman Ranque said.

With a population of 1,976, communication is set to hasten aid and development for their barangay as residents continue to struggle to rebuild their homes and provide food on their tables during this time of pandemic.



The Solar USB Charging Station uses sunlight to charge the battery. There are 16 USB devices via the solar panel. Even at night, the battery continues to charge USB devices until the battery discharge protection kicks in. It is estimated that there will be about 2 hours of night charging for everyone.

Engr. Roxcella Reas of EVSU ECE Dept. explains how to use the USB Charging system to barangay officials and staff.







The biggest appliance that can plugged in for charging would be tablets and chargeable emergency lights. Even if the place will have cloudy or rainy days, it can still charge gadgets. And as there are no moving parts, the chance of damage is minimal. Moreover, in case of malfunctioning they can call the Rotary Club of Kankabato.

For Rotary Club of Kankabato President Sigmundo Rio A. Catingub, "Much can be done to help alleviate other people's lives. For us to have experienced the onslaught of Super Typhoon Yolanda in Tacloban City, our help comes as a gesture of repaying what has been shared as generosity during our most trying time. The people of Barangay Tigbao needs help. And Rotary Club of Kankabato will extend all possible means to assist them get back on their lives."

Economic and Community Development, the call of the Rotarian and that of the Rotary Club of Kankabato to respond continues.

It has been a meaningful 10th year anniversary for Rotary Club of Kankabato. And the quest to help others remains its goal. And together we all exclaim:


December 23, 2021















Tomeco Office, Abucay January 26, 2022



Minimum health standards were observed during the conduct of the activity.








BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH




ROTARY CLUB OF KANKABATO'S 10th YEAR ANNIVERSARY






