CLUB HISTORY

Others may wonder, "Why waste one's effort, time and money just to help other people?" With that being said, RC Kankabato believes that helping other people is an act of benevolence. It is what the universe needs. To do good with other people with different characters and background is the vocation that one could have while he's still breathing and standing on the ground. You must do what you can, with what you have – the reason why Rotary Club of Kankabato-Tacloban continues to shines through their rays of compassion and service above self.

The Rotary Club of Kankabato-Tacloban was chartered in the year 2011. Rotarian Antolin Ofonda was elected and served as the Charter President. From 25 pioneering members, the RC Kankabato has now 23 active members, with the current Hope-Creating President, Rtn. Ralph Lavador Martel for the Rotary Year 2023-2024 as the 12th president of the organization. This organization is composed of established professionals and businessmen with diverse characters and background who came together and believed in one goal which is to make a difference. This international organization is a non-profit and non-partisan union. Members of this club are called as rotarians. Also, they sponsor young rotarians called as rotaractors. These inspiring rotarians believe in the inherent goodness of other people as it results to the ripple effect of kindness in the community. When we show kindness to other people, it creates a chain of reaction which causes kindness to find its way back to us.

Every Rotary Club like the RC of Kankabato-Tacloban is grounded with guiding principles which are Object of Rotary, 4-Way Test and Avenues of Service. These principles have been developed to serve as the bible for every Rotarian as they venture themselves in humanitarian acts of kindness as well as making themselves for another time a servant-leader who aims to uplift the status of the community they belong to. Rotarians of this organization initiate transformational projects not only in the region and national level but also in the international stage. Their projects are based on areas of focus such as Basic Education and Literacy, Disease and Prevention Treatment, Rotary Day of Service and Supporting the Environment.

Since 2011, the RC Kankabato-Tacloban engages in several projects that are timely and relevant to the needs, issues and concerns of the society. They have conducted several projects such as distribution of school supplies and hygiene kits, bloodletting activities, raising awareness and funding to end Polio and Breast Cancer, and Mangrove and tree-planting activity. This organization also did an adopt-a-school campaign to donate facilities such as handwashing facility, books for their library and repair some old school buildings in Guindapunan Elementary School. Moreover, donation drives and feeding programs were also conducted to send help to those victims of natural and man-made calamities such as typhoons, earthquakes, landslides, and fires. Now that the entire community is still experiencing, pandemic, still the club lends a hand and do an extra mile just to be of help to the community. They have donated essential medical supplies such as medical facemasks, alcohols, vitamins and PPEs to the hospitals in the city and province. These programs may be less extravagant but it is, for the meantime necessary and beneficial.

Because of the successes of their projects, the RC of Kankabato-Tacloban is recognized not only in the local community but also in the international level. They bagged local and international awards for their community involvements. Their recent prestigious recognitions are Rotary International Citations for helping Rotary Open Opportunities, a plaque for End-Polio Campaign for being a Polio Fund District Goal Achiever, RY 2019-2021, Katambulig Award from the DepEd - Schools Division of Tacloban City, RY 2019-2020, and Outstanding Rotary Club in D3860, RY 2014-2015 & 2018-2020. These sets of awards serve as an inspiration for them to continue to work side by side to execute action and impact through fellowship and service.

Jane Goodall once uttered, "You cannot get through a single day without having an impact on the world around you. What you do makes a difference, and you have to decide what kind of difference you want to make." It implies that we are the legacy of the past generations — it is up to us how are we going to make an impact and better change to the community by the choices that we make every day. We must find ways to better ourselves in order to get great results. As long as we are living and part of the continuous cosmic evolution, let us not forget to lend little drops of love to the less privileged. A little act of kindness, charity and generosity creates a magical effect on the heart of a person; hence, we call it as the true evidence of authentic and genuine love.
