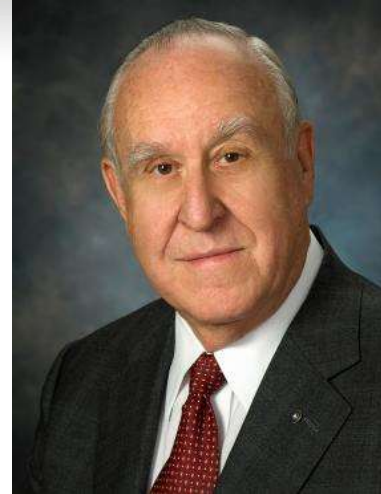

Finally, “madamo na salamat” to those who supported and attended our first club project in Tupi and Area 3H bloodletting activity. It was successful because of your presence.

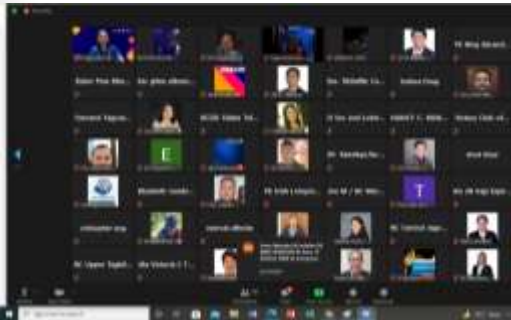




The Secretary's Report

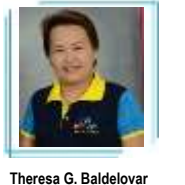
