
#### Invocation

#### Presidential Message

#### Stephanie A. Urchick Rotary International President 2024-25

With World Polio Day on 24 October, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now.

I had the honor of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of Delmont-Salem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 millions.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

And I was thrilled to see Team End Polio raise global awareness around the 2024 Paris Olympics. This worldclass roster of athletes, global leaders, and polio eradication supporters came together to advocate for a world where no child has to live in fear of being paralyzed by polio. Some of the athletes on Team End Polio are polio survivors themselves, adding weight to their advocacy.

These are just a few examples of the many ways Rotary has teamed up recently to End Polio Now. It is vital that we continue to seek out and recruit teammates in polio eradication, especially after the challenges our eradication efforts have faced this year.

The Rotary world was heartbroken to learn about the tragic passing in August of Aidan O'Leary, director for polio eradication at the World Health Organization.

I knew Aidan and worked with him directly. He was a tireless advocate in the fight against polio and a kind, genuine man. We will remember him both for his advocacy and his warmth.

But where there is hardship, there is also hope. I feel hopeful whenever I consider the countless ways Rotary supports the fight every day to eradicate polio.

As people of action, we don't have the luxury of giving in to despair, even in the face of tragedy. The best way to honor Aidan's memory is by teaming up and reaching our goal to End Polio Now.

We made a promise to the children of the world and their families. It is incumbent upon us, together with our global partners, to end this threat once and for all.

There are so many ways we can team up to eradicate polio. You can donate to the End Polio Now campaign, join or initiate a PolioPlus Society in your club or district, or take inspiration from the fundraisers I mentioned above.

I encourage Rotary members around the world to continue to seek out new teammates, so that together, we end polio.






## Ollessage from the Club President Rtn. Janine Francesca C. Pring, PHF





## The Secretary & Report Rtn. Baltazar A. Fresco, Jr., PHF

## Club History Decades of Service Above Self

The origins of the Rotary Club of Marbel trace back to
Attorney Paul Harris's vision for camaraderie among business
associates, who initially convened in downtown Chicago.
After rotating meeting locations, they formalized into what
would become the Rotary Club - an international organization
dedicated to service and fellowship, encapsulated in its
motto: "Service Above Self."



As Rotary expanded globally, members pooled their talents and resources to serve their communities. Today, there are over 46,000 member clubs worldwide, comprising 1.4 million Rotarians - neighbors, friends, and community leaders - who work collaboratively to foster positive, lasting change globally.

Initially established as the sole Rotary Club in Marbel municipality (now the City of Koronadal), the Rotary Club of Koronadal identified opportunities for expansion. Under the leadership of the late Rey Tolosa, Extension Committee Chair and Past President (PP), the club aimed to establish or sponsor another Rotary club in the growing city. In mid-1979, they began recruiting young, dynamic professionals to join this new initiative.

On June 30, 1980, Rotary International (RI) approved the establishment of the Rotary Club of Marbel. Charter President, the late Gerardo Calaliman, led the club through its formative years, establishing a name synonymous with respect and prestige, emblematic of all Rotary Clubs. Over the years, the club welcomed diverse new members, irrespective of religion, gender, or political affiliation.

The club's impactful initiatives span a wide array of projects aimed at enhancing community welfare, including medical, dental, and surgical missions; literacy programs; feeding schemes; career orientation for graduating high school students; anti-bullying campaigns; "I Love English" initiatives; establishment of Adopt-a-Day Care Centers; support for the school for the deaf at Koronadal Central Elementary School 1; annual December gift-giving and feeding programs; breast cancer awareness campaigns; bloodletting activities; End Polio initiatives; and various environmental projects such as tree planting in mountain areas like Lake Sebu and Koronadal City, and coastal clean-ups along Sarangani Bay, General Santos City, and B'lok Creek, in collaboration with different national and local government and private agencies. The club actively participates in One Rotary, One District activities and area-wide projects, amplifying its impact across broader communities.

The Rotary Club of Marbel has also nurtured youth leadership through its sponsorship of the Rotaract Club of Notre Dame of Marbel University in 1988 and the establishment of the Interact Club of Koronadal National Comprehensive High School (KNCHS) in 2014. In 2018-2019, the club expanded its youth initiatives with the formation of the school-based Rotaract Club of Korbel and the Interact Club of Korbel. During the challenging times of the pandemic in 2021, the club pioneered the establishment of the community-based Rotaract Club of Marbel, comprising young professionals committed to service and community development.

In dedication to expanding influence and promoting collaboration for the advancement of humanity, the Rotary Club of Marbel forged sisterhood agreements with the Rotary Club of Japan and the Rotary Club of Singapore, represented by Past President Dr. Oliver Hennedige. Upon Dr. Hennedige's return to the Philippines, he introduced Dr. Angamuthu Rajoo, Past President of the Rotary Club of Johor Bahru (Malaysia) in District 3310, which later became a sister club. In the Rotary Year 2018-2019, a sisterhood agreement was also signed with the Rotary Club of Alabang LAMPARA through the then President, Atty. Elbert S. Cruz. In 2024, another sisterhood agreement was inked with the Rotary Club of Cheonan West from South Korea under District 3620. These initiatives signify auspicious beginnings for the relationship between the clubs.





The Rotary Club of Marbel has proudly received multiple grants from The Rotary Foundation (TRF). These include a notable Adopt-a-Harelip Project in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Johor Bahru, as well as initiatives for Vitamin A supplementation and cataract operations. Additionally, the club has benefited from World Community Service projects supported by District 2790 in Chiba, Japan. These projects encompass activities such as school building construction, feeding programs, literacy initiatives, water supply and sanitation improvements, and further cataract and harelip surgeries. In 2024, the Water for Schools Project of the Rotary Club of Cheonan West provided safe and clean drinking water to the selected schools.

In partnership with international and national medical societies, the club has organized impactful medical and dental missions serving indigent communities in South Cotabato. These efforts were recognized as the Most Outstanding Project by District 3860. Furthermore, the club has earned numerous exceptional awards, including the Rotary International Citation, underscoring its unwavering dedication to community improvement and service. These prestigious awards from Rotary International and District 3860 reflect the esteemed reputation it has cultivated within the community - an undeniable testament to achieving its goals and acknowledging its significant contributions as one of the outstanding civic organizations in the community.

Beyond its renowned service projects, the club has made significant contributions to The Rotary Foundation (TRF). A milestone was reached with the creation of its first Paul Harris Fellow (PHF), Rotarian Benjamin M. Garcia, in the Rotary Year 1994-1995. Additionally, the club takes pride in his achievement as the first District 3860 Governor from the club and served for the Rotary Year 2018-2019 under the RI Theme "Be the Inspiration." Through his generous donations to the Foundation, he became the club's first TRF Benefactor and reached Major Donor Level 2. Since then, annual contributions to TRF have become customary, leading to the club's recognition as a Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) Club in 2018 - a tradition of generosity that continues steadfastly today.

The strength of the Rotary Club of Marbel lies in each member's unwavering commitment to the motto 'Service Above Self' and in fostering a sense of unity within the Rotary Club of Marbel family. Whether celebrating successes through collaborative club projects or supporting each other during personal hardships, their bond remains resilient. Recognizing that maintaining membership retention is crucial for a strong foundation, continuous membership development ensures the club's enduring legacy.

The club takes pride in its members who are distinguished leaders not only in their respective professions or businesses but also in their passionate dedication to Rotary service, enriching the community through their diverse contributions.

Over 44 years, the club has dedicated time, effort, and resources to uplift those most in need, making a meaningful impact through countless projects benefiting the less fortunate members of their community.

The Rotary Club of Marbel demonstrates unwavering commitment to service. It remains steadfast in its mission to inspire and transform lives, showcasing the spirit of Rotary. Together, they envision a future where their service continues to make a profound difference in
