

ROTARY INFORMATION

History of Rotary International:

Paul P. Harris, an attorney, wanted to create a professional group with the same friendly spirit he felt in the small towns of his youth. On 23 February 1905, Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. This was the first Rotary club meeting. They decided to call the new club "Rotary" after the practice of rotating meeting locations.

Within five years, clubs had formed across the county, from San Francisco to New York.

In August 1910, Rotarians held their first convention in Chicago. The 16 clubs that existed at that time united to form the National Association of Rotary Clubs.

In 1912, the name changed to International Association of Rotary Clubs to reflect the addition of clubs in other countries. The name Rotary International was adopted in 1922.

By July 1925, Rotary had grown to more than 2,000 clubs and an estimated 108,000 members on six continents.

Rotary's reputation attracted presidents, prime ministers, and a host of other luminaries to its ranks – among them author Thomas Mann, diplomat Carlos P. Romulo, and composer Jean Sibelius. As Rotary grew, members pooled their resources and used their

talents to serve their communities. The organization's dedication

to this ideal is best expressed in its motto: Service Above Self.

In 1932, Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor created The Four-Way Test. The test, which has been translated into more than 100 languages, asks the following questions:

Of the things we think, say or do-

Is is the TRUTH?

Is it FAIR to all concerned?

Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?

Will it be **BENEFICIAL** to all concerned?

Lord Jesus, Son of God, You humbled Yourself to become man, in order to serve and not to be served. We humbly ask You to teach us the ideals of service: that what matters most is not how much we have got, but how much we have given; not how much we have won, but how much we have done; not how much we have saved, but how much we have sacrificed; not how much we were honored, but how much we have served.

God, our Father, always uses those closest to Him. Grant us therefore the privilege and the grace to be closest to You, His Son, to be truly Your servants amidst the people we serve.

Amen.

We invite You today, Loving Father, to join us in welcoming our new member. It is always wonderful to have a new friend and a new ally in the service of Rotary and for the glory of God.

Thank you very much, Lord, for inspiring him to join our club and reward with Your kind blessings his resourceful sponsor.

As we exhort our new member to wear his pin with pride, grant unto us, O Lord, the strength and the courage to continue and persevere in honoring Rotary with faith and enthusiasm.
