



With the theme "Leafy Greens in Water: A New Wave in Sustainable Farming," this initiative showcases Rotary's commitment to economic development and sustainability, reinforcing our mission to create lasting change in communities.





# **Empowering Communities Through Hydroponics: RCMB's 2nd Signature Project on Economic and Community Development**

The Rotary Club of Midtown Butuan (RCMB) continues to make a lasting impact on the community through its 2nd Signature Project—Economic and Community Development through Hydroponics. This innovative and sustainable farming initiative was spearheaded by Irresistible President Ma. Theresa M. Salise, aiming to provide alternative livelihood opportunities while promoting environmental sustainability.

Hydroponic farming, a method of growing plants without soil, offers a cost-effective, water-efficient, and high-yield approach to agriculture. Recognizing its potential to empower communities and generate sustainable income, RCMB launched this initiative as a way to help local farmers, unemployed individuals, and families looking for additional income sources.









### The Beginning of the Project

The journey began with a vision—to introduce an accessible and eco-friendly farming solution that requires minimal space and resources but yields maximum benefits. RCMB partnered with key stakeholders, including ANECO DMCOO District V and local farming experts, to construct two hydroponic greenhouses in Barangay Bonbon, Butuan City. The first wave of lettuce planting was met with enthusiasm, and after just 40-45 days, the project saw its first successful harvest. Fresh, high-quality lettuce was distributed to the community and Friends of Rotary, highlighting the potential of hydroponic farming as a viable income-generating activity. The project proved to be more than just farming; it became a symbol of innovation, sustainability, and empowerment.

#### Second Visit - January 30, 2025

On January 30, 2025, RCMB members returned to the hydroponic site for the second wave of planting. This visit reinforced the club's commitment to long-term sustainability and economic empowerment. With the continued guidance of experts and unwavering support from Rotary members, the project is now set to expand its reach—helping more families, local farmers, and entrepreneurs venture into hydroponic farming.

The visit was attended by RCMB members, partners from ANECO DMCOO, and local farming advocates, all excited to witness the progress of this project. The day was filled with hands-on learning, as participants actively engaged in planting the next batch of lettuce, discussing expansion plans, and exploring new ways to market the produce.
