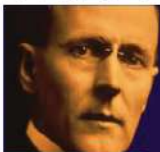

# Give where the need is greatest

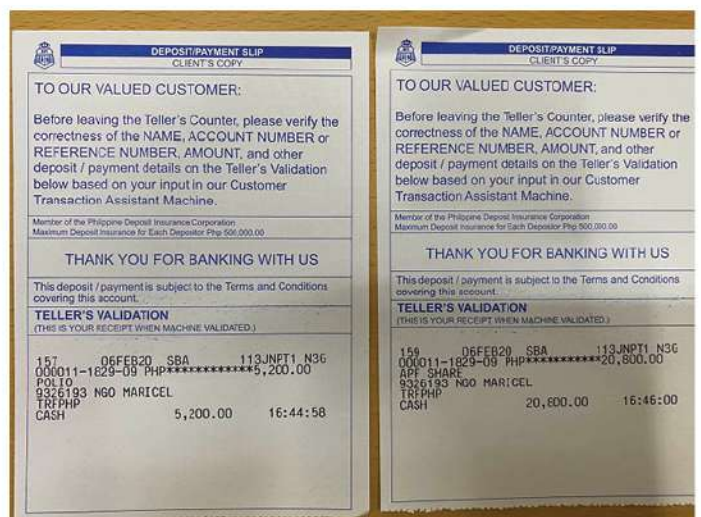
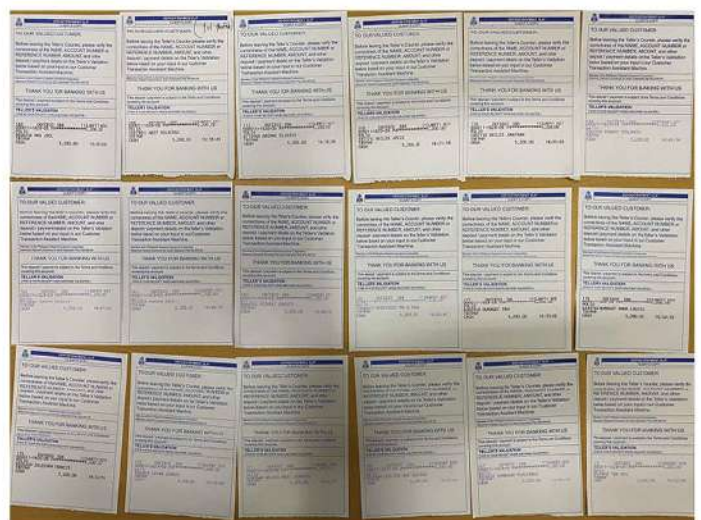
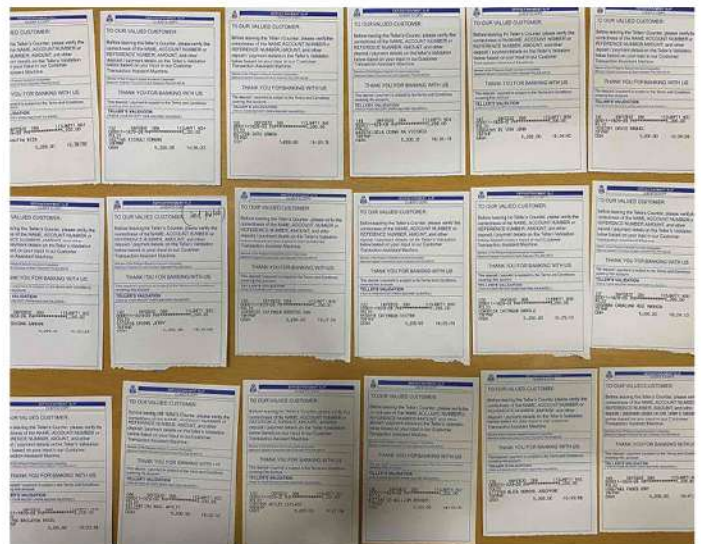
When you give to The Rotary Foundation, you fuel our service projects - projects that eradicate polio, promote peace, and improve developing communities.

For the past two months, the TRF Chair PP Toots Pongos assisted by the Club President Maricel Ngo, aggressively campaigned among their members to contribute to the TRF. Their efforts paid off as members' TRF contributions started to pour. For a period of five weeks, the club exceeded its target with \$4,956 actual contribution which is \$356 more than club's target of \$4600.

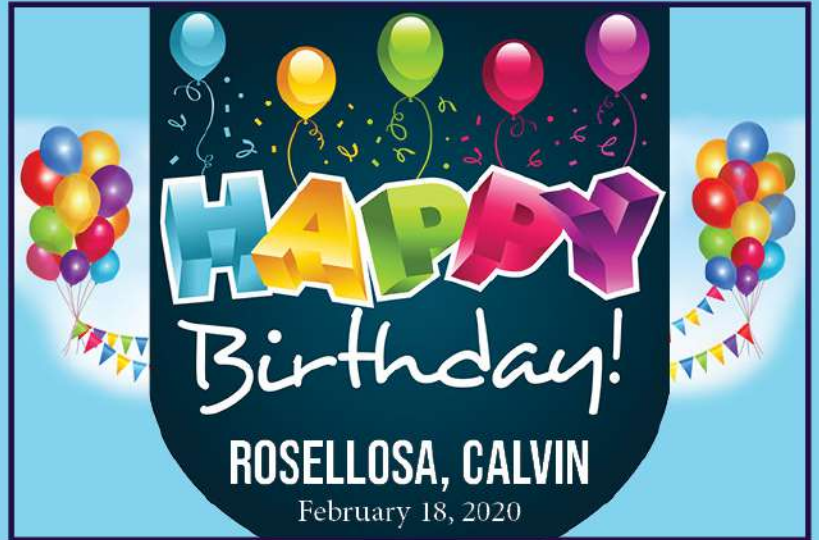

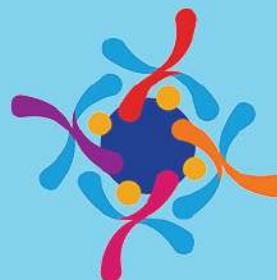
