TRF Performance of the Club for Rotary Year 2019-2020:


Give where the need is greatest

Their efforts paid off as members' TRF contributions started to pour. For a period of five weeks, the club exceeded its target with \$4,956 actual contribution which is \$356 more than club's target of \$4600.

Below is a bar graph showing the TRF Contribution Performance of the Club over a 5-week period. Seen below are some photos of the deposit slips paid by each member to the TRF.




