### SITIO LARAY SITE VISIT

#### Adopt-a-DayCare Project

On August 21, the Rotary Club of Ormoc embarked on a heartfelt mission to Sitio Laray in Barangay Valencia, conducting an official site visit that would mark the beginning of their Adopt-a-Daycare Center project. Led by President Eric alongside Rotarian Joe, Kagawad Lolito Eisma, Engineer Victor, and Past President Wesley, the team witnessed firsthand the educational challenges facing 31 young learners in this remote community.



This site visit was no coincidence—it followed the club's successful "Unang Lakang: Rotary Day of Children" event held in the same community on July 1, which first opened their eyes to the urgent need for intervention. Now, with Engineer Victor's technical expertise and Past President Wesley's architectural vision, the club is moving forward with concrete plans to build a proper daycare facility that will give these children the foundation they deserve, right in their own backyard.



#### The Sobering Reality

The visit revealed a sobering reality: children in Sitio Laray face an impossible choice between quality education and financial survival. To reach the main barangay daycare center, families must shoulder ₱80-100 daily for round-trip habal-habal rides-an insurmountable expense for farming households already struggling to make ends meet. Instead, these determined children attend a local daycare center that falls below minimum educational standards, where their devoted teacher has fighting а lonely battle improvement.

What struck the Rotary team most was the unwavering dedication of the lone educator, who earns just \$2,500 monthly yet continues to fund facility improvements from her own pocket. Despite her persistent appeals to local administration, her pleas for support have gone unanswered, leaving her as the sole advocate for these children's educational future.
