My fellow transforming rotarians, in doing some good deeds such as distribution of IEC materials containing information on Anti-bastos Law, VAWC, health protocols and guidelines in this time of pandemic and distribution of masks to market vendors, habal habal drivers and to kids, we already have contributed much in acquiring peace and some conflicts in our community.

The Rotary Club of Panglao Island also continues to serve the underprivileged and economically challenged families in our community and even extended our services to other municipalities by giving food for the children and cribs for infants at the Holy Trinity Angels orphanage in Albuquerque, Bohol.

Officers and members of our club who are professionally trained doctors, nurses and dentists extended their hands and quality care to the children of Purok 6, Poblacion , Panglao aged 2-6 years old. According to studies, nearly 6 million children die each year because of poor health care and inadequate sanitation. That is why during the celebration of the Rotary Week 2021, our club distributed toothbrushes and tubes of toothpaste to the children, accompanied by our rotarian dentist who conducted lectures and demonstrations on the proper toothbrushing technique. Then we distributed some books to preschool children in the same area. These projects promote one of our club's causes, the caring of young children.

In this juncture, my heartfelt gratitude to you my fellow transforming rotarians of RCPI for your full and wholehearted support to the programs and projects of our club. Your involvement in these programs solidifies our purpose as rotarians.

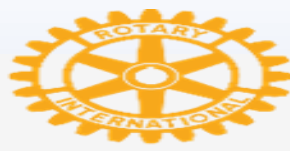
Gathering chickens

Take time to utilize the multitudes of technologies and apps (many free) that can help you stay in touch with those you love. Our busy lives before the COVID-19 may have limited how often we connected with distant loved ones, now's the time to fully exploit these modern capabilities for fellowship, companionship, and camaraderie.

4 ways to build peace through Rotary

According to [UNHCR](#), 65.6 million people are currently displaced by conflict, violence, or persecution. Rotary members refuse to accept conflict as a way of life and are committed to pursuing projects that address the structural causes of conflict, including poverty, inequality, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources.

Rotary projects provide trainings that fosters understanding and equip communities with skills to resolve conflicts. During February, Rotary Peace and Conflict Prevention/Resolution Month, build peace and mitigate conflict by:

1. Incorporating conflict resolution and mediation strategies into service projects involving local schools, orphanages, workplaces, and community centers.
2. Supporting marginalized groups in risk of violence or persecution by providing relief to those who have fled areas of conflict.
3. Participating in fellowship and service activities with Rotary clubs in other parts of the world to promote greater international understanding.
4. Recruiting candidates for a [Rotary Peace Fellowship](#). Up to 100 peace fellowships are offered annually at Rotary Peace Centers at universities around the world.
