



This year, let us challenge ourselves to do more such projects and programs that have national reach and impact. This year, let us Serve to Change Lives.







I would also like to congratulate The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 for the unveiling of our Official Club Bulletin– The Club 101.









The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was officially chartered as a legitimate club by Rotary International, through the efforts of its mother club — the Rotary Club of Midtown Gensan on August 31, 2005. As early as February 2003, there were already numerous attempts to organize a Rotary club in the municipality of Polomolok, but it was only in January 2005 when persistence finally paid off-

The club's name is suffixed with the number 101 for two significant reasons: one, the club was founded on Rotary International's 101st foundation anniversary; and the club was the 101st club to be chartered under District 3860 with CP Omar Gallinero became the new club's Charter President leading 25 other charter members with various classifications.

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 is a dynamic service organization actively involved in worthwhile community projects which make a difference in the lives of our beneficiaries and the members as well-



This Rotary year, our club marked its 16th Charter Anniversary. The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 is still continuing its service to the community despite the difficulties endured during the pandemic. Our club utilizes technology and social media to connect with other Rotary Clubs outside the Philippines.

To celebrate peace and actively participate in the promotion of conflict resolution, the club sponsored The Moro Voice- (Song for Peace): "Awit ng Bangsamoro para sa kapayapaan ng Mindanao, a singing search competition in partnership with PNP Region 12, open to all Muslim brothers and sisters who were residents of Region 12. Another one of the club's unique passion projects is The Pink Stilleto Run, a fundraising activity that supports the Breast Cancer Foundation and campaigns for breast cancer awareness month. Our club also actively participates in the Tree Planting and Tree Growing activity. The Field 116 of Dole Pineapple Plantation is permanently assigned to our club by the Mahintana Foundation, Inc. as our adopted gully. We make sure that all trees we planted grow, thus, it will prevent flooding and soil erosion when calamity comes.

Part of the Rotary spirit is building lasting relationships with other clubs with the common goal of serving the community. This is exemplified by our club's sisterhood with other local Rotary clubs such as, The Rotary Club of Harrison-Pasay, Rotary Club of Bagumbayan-Manila, Rotary Club of Ubay-Bohol, Rotary Club of Davao 2000, and Rotary Club of Dadiangas & Rotary Club of Metro Dadiangas. Through these sister clubs we came together to serve and build long lasting friendship.

One of the proudest moments of our club is having a sister club in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia with The Rotary Club of Lake Gardens, Kuala Lumpur, wherein we signed the Memorandum of Sisterhood last Rotary year 2017-2018 in Kuala Lumpur. This sisterhood brought to us another opportunity to connect with another Rotary club outside the Philippines. Last 2019, seventeen of us took a break from our busy schedules and travelled to Japan together where we met the Rotary E-Club Osaka. We were able to meet their president and some members. We promised that our clubs will keep in touch and hoping that in the near future we could do joint projects together. It was indeed a fruitful travel and a great pleasure having to meet another Rotary Club in Japan.

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was registered under District 3860, Area 3F with Club Number 70517. It is the first Non-Government Organization recognized by the Local Government Unit of Polomolok and making us their partner in service together with our two RCCs – Twin circa Marketing & Dole Philippine School in their various projects. To date, the Club runs on man-strength of 27 committed individuals.



Plant lover's corner! by Joy Torres

Caring for your "Indoor Houseplant"

How much water? - Water the plants when the top of the inch of the soil is dry to the touch. Use enough water that it begins to drain out of the bottom of the pot.

What kind of light? – Plants need sunlight to grow properly. The amount required will vary from one species to another. In general, however, most plants require 8-16 hours of light each day.

Feeding the plants – Use an all-purpose water soluble fertilizer throughout the growing season. During the rainy months, use fertilizer at half-strength. **The perfect spot** – Tropical plants love humidity and thrive with daily misting. For additional humidity, place a water tray nearby to improve dryer conditions.

Temperature – always avoid hot or cold drafts from doors or heating vents.

House Plants Care Guide

Follow these simple steps to let your cute plant grow and thrive...

- 1. Give it enough light, but not direct sunlight all day
- 2. Water twice a week
- 3. Fertilize once every two weeks
- 4. Add humidity if necessary with spray water or humidifier
- 5. Check and cut off dead branches regularly
