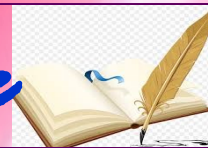

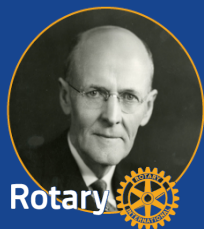

Treasurer's Report

The Rotary Foundation History

At the 1917 convention, outgoing Rotary president Arch Klumph proposed setting up an endowment “for the purpose of doing good in the world.” That one idea, and an initial contribution of \$26.50, set in motion a powerful force that has transformed millions of lives around the globe.

WAYS TO GIVE:

1. ANNUAL FUND

- Your gift to the Annual Fund helps Rotary clubs take action today to create positive change in communities at home and around the world. Your contributions help us strengthen peace efforts, provide clean water and sanitation, support education, grow local economies, save mothers and children, and fight disease.
- The Every Rotarian Every Year initiative asks every Rotarian to support The Rotary Foundation every year. In addition to contributing to the Annual Fund on a regular basis, members are encouraged to get involved in a Foundation project or program.

2. WORLD FUND

The Origins of Paul Harris Fellow Recognition

The Paul Harris Fellow recognition acknowledges individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to [The Rotary Foundation](#).

Rotary established the [recognition](#) in 1957 to encourage and show appreciation for substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation's only program, Rotary Foundation Fellowships for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Schol-

The first Paul Harris Fellows included past RI Director Allison G. Brush, who served during the 1937-38 Rotary year, and longtime RI Treasurer Rufus F. Chapin, both for donations made in 1946. Mrs. Adan Vargas was the first woman to receive the recognition, for a gift made in 1953. Mrs. Harry L. Jones was the second, and one of only five people recognized for contributions actually made in that inaugural year.

Early Paul Harris Fellows received a certificate of recognition. In 1969, the Foundation unveiled the first Paul Harris Fellow medallion at the Rotary Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA. Japanese metal artist Fiju Tsuda created the piece under the direction of former Foundation Trustee Kyoza Yuasa. Today, Paul Harris Fellows receive a certificate and pin. They are also eligible to buy a Paul Harris Fellow medallion.

Rotarians have a tradition of supporting the Foundation by honoring others. Ida LeTulle Taylor became a Paul Harris Fellow in 1978 when her husband, Vann Taylor, who was serving as a district governor, made a donation in her name in honor of their 34th wedding anniversary. The gift also made her the 25,000th Paul

At the International Assembly in 1979, incoming RI President James Bomar challenged each Rotary club to make one non-Rotarian a Paul Harris Fellow. The Rotary Club of Pikesville, Maryland, USA, responded by making a donation in the name of Mother Teresa in 1980. The entertainer Pearl Bailey also became a Paul Harris Fellow through a joint effort of the Rotary clubs in Cape Cod, Massachusetts.

Many other notable figures have been named Paul Harris Fellows, including U.S. President Jimmy Carter, Russian President Boris Yeltsin, U.S. astronaut James Lovell, UN Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar, and polio vaccine developer Jonas Salk.

The number of Paul Harris Fellows reached the 1 million mark in 2006.

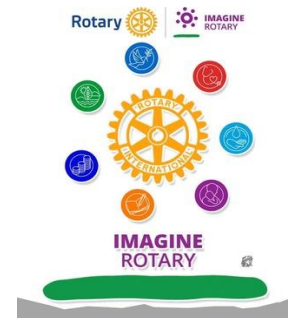

Sundays and Relationship Goals



It seems that a lasting relationship is becoming rare in these days of "instant-everything." The hiccups of relationships: difficulty in communication and unmet expectations resulting to break-ups. Because in the mind of the couples, there's a bigger ocean out there with lots of other fishes.

So here's a set of ingredients for all those who would want to "work" for and enjoy long and happy relationships.

1. Chemistry: It starts with attraction, usually physical, but can be any other thing; a mind, a voice, a gesture, a song. And when you have been together for a long time, always remember that old feeling; and exert effort to see something new to admire in your partner.

2. Self-Awareness. Get to know your core personality profile and that of your partner. Stop believing in the concept of "accept me for who I am, or else..." It only works in an ideal world, where lovers give unconditional love. Most love affairs are premised on give-and-take relationships. You will find it too difficult to always be the "giver," and you will not nourish the relationship if you're always the "taker."

3. Common goals: Dreaming together. Usually, about being together in the now and the future. Call this a "shared future." Imagine yourself rowing a boat made for two, paddling in one direction.

4. Commitment: One of the most critical aspects of relationships. This must be defined early on. Usually, it entails a pledging for each other. As you go along your life together, each must renew this pledge frequently, in small or big ways.

5. Communication: Miscommunication is the most common source, then and now, of relationship breakup. Clear communication seems easy to do, but is not. Because one's communication system is heavily influenced by one's personality, family system, environment, and upbringing.

Thus, really get to know each other well, and explore the limits and possibilities of truly opening one's mind and heart to another. You will feel vulnerable; but be brave and trust your partner enough to do so.

Remember, the inability to communicate effectively lies at the root of many relationship problems.

6. Consensus: Relationships become more mature when there is compromise and negotiation involved the couple's relationship. These are all important factors, and the most important one is on working on your communication. Even "love" won't be enough without this. And make sure to state your "non-negotiables" too!

Be aware that there are different forms of communication as there are different ways of showing love, and those are mostly shown in non-verbal ways.

In giving service. Duty. Bringing of gifts and thoughtful expressions. Simple caring gestures. A smile that brings with it the shared experiences of the past and all that it brings.

For you, my wish: Live to love, love to live.

History of the Rotary Club of Polomolok 101

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was officially chartered as a legitimate club by Rotary International, through the efforts of its mother club – the Rotary Club of Midtown Gensan -on August 31, 2005. As early as February 2003, there were already numerous attempts to organize a Rotary club in the municipality of Polomolok, but it was only in January 2005 when persistence finally paid off. With the blessing of RC Midtown Gensan, Omar Gallinero became the new club's Charter President, leading 25 other charter members with various classifications. Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was formed under the leadership of Len Magno as then the District Governor of 3860.

The club's name is suffixed with the number 101 for two significant reasons: one, the club was founded on Rotary International's 101st foundation anniversary; and the club was the 101st club to be chartered under District 3860.

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was registered under District 3860, Area 3F with Club Number 70517 . To date, the Club runs on man-strength of twenty five(25) committed individuals.

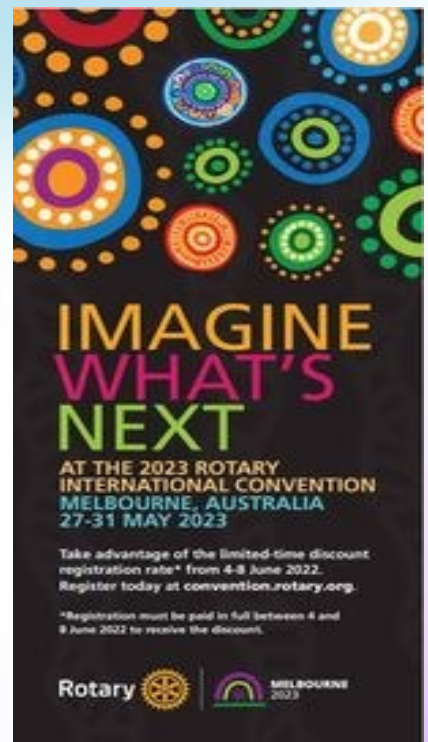
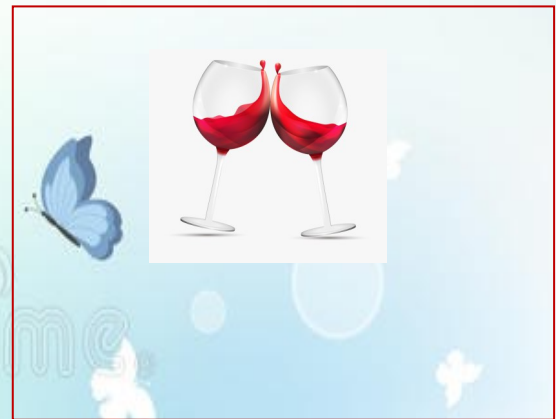


