# R.I. PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Next year, Rotary takes a step toward supporting peacebuilding in the Middle East and North Africa region when recruitment begins for our newest peace center in partnership with Bahçeşehir University (BAU) in Istanbul.

A series of events in the coming year will recognize the new center at BAU and Rotary's work to promote peace. The 2024 Rotary International Convention in May will mark 25 years since the first Rotary Peace Centers were announced – coincidentally at the Rotary Convention in Singapore in 1999. Recruitment for the first cohort of Rotary Peace Fellows at BAU also starts in 2024, and selected candidates will begin their program in early 2025.

Since its beginning, the peace centers program has prepared more than 1,700 peace fellows working in more than 140 countries to create a more peaceful world. That is certainly worth celebrating, but Rotary Peace Fellows are more than statistics on a page. Their actions have helped Create Hope in the World and will continue to do so.

For example, Jennifer Montgomery and Gorett Komurembe – peace fellows from the program at Makerere University in Uganda – are co-founders of Magenta Girls Initiative. The international nongovernmental organization equips Ugandan girls and young women with the support and tools to overcome harmful gender norms, generational poverty, gender-based violence, trafficking, and trauma.

Ndzi Divine Njamsi, another peace fellow who studied at Makerere, has taken lessons learned about Positive Peace and is sharing them with students of his own in Cameroon. He became interested in the Rotary Positive Peace Activator training program after witnessing extremism, online hate speech, and violence in Cameroon. Since completing the program, he has brought his lessons on peace to students at the Yaoundé International Business School and other organizations in the Central Africa country.

The world needs more people like the graduates of the program at Makerere and our other peace fellows. To that end, we can all advance peace by encouraging our local peacebuilders to learn more about Rotary and apply for this impactful fellowship. Rotary members can also mentor candidates for the fellowship. Or you can work with peace fellows who have already graduated. They probably have an initiative or two that would benefit from your help.

Our peace centers in North America, Europe, Africa, Australia, and Asia depend on financial support as well. The program at BAU was made possible thanks to a generous gift of \$15.5 million to The Rotary Foundation from the Otto and Fran Walter Foundation.

This new Rotary Peace Center will offer a one-year professional development certificate in peace and development studies for fellows focusing on peacebuilding within the Middle East and North Africa region.

Peace must be waged persistently; it is the soil where hope takes root. But as with any journey, we take one step at a time. Let's take those steps together.

# **THE ROTARY FOUNDATION**

# The month of November is Rotary Foundation month.

The Foundation is the charitable arm of the Rotary organisation. In order to carry out its very considerable programme of charitable donations each year, it has to raise money. And it does this from a number of different sources.

These include member contributions through programmes such as:

#### (a) The Annual Fund

- Every Rotarian Every year (EREY) - minimum contribution per member \$25 pa but you can achieve

- Sustaining membership with a minimum contribution per member of \$100pa

#### (b) Endowment fund

- Benefactor, when you include the Endowment Fund as a beneficiary in your estate plans or when you donate \$1,000 or more to the fund outright. Benefactors receive a certificate and insignia to wear with a Rotary or Paul Harris Fellow pin.

- Paul Harris Fellow, when you give \$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant. You are recognized as a Multiple Paul Harris Fellow with each additional gift of \$1,000.

- Paul Harris Society member, when you give \$1,000 or more annually to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant.

- Bequest Society member, when you give \$10,000 or more via your estate plans. All society members receive recognition from the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation, and donors can choose to receive an engraved crystal recognition piece and a Bequest Society pin.

Funds raised through the Annual Fund are held by RI and invested for three years. RI funds its expenses from the investment income generated during those 3 years. At the end of the three year period, the annual contributions become available for District and Global Grants.

RI makes available to each District 50% of the funds raised by the District, which are then available to fund District Grants and Global Grants.

- District Grants are a hybrid of the previous District Simplified Grant, though the amount available per grant is somewhat higher. Our District has for the current year agreed to allocate 50% of the total funds made available to District Grants. There is no formula for calculating the amount of a Grant based on the value of the project. District Grants are administered by a committee comprised of District officers and Club members.

- Global Grants; The remaining 50% of funds released by the Foundation are set aside for Global Grants. If a project is approved, District will match a Club's contribution 50c for each 1\$ contributed by the Club. TRFT will then match \$ for \$. All Global Grants must have an International partner club (or clubs)from another District. The funds they contribute will be matched at their District and Foundation levels. It is possible to leverage a Club contribution 5 or 6 times, and hence projects funded by way of a Global grant are highly efficient way to fund a project.

As a Club, and a District, we cannot expect to be allocated funds under either a District or Global Grant unless we contribute to the Annual Fund. Members are all strongly encouraged to be a sustaining member by donating to the Annual Fund at least \$100 annually. Please support the Rotary Foundation. Without the support of members like yourselves the great work of Rotary cannot continue. Please give generously.

From teaching children to read in Ecuador to a microcredit program in Indonesia, Rotary members identify local problems and use Rotary's vast network and the resources of The Rotary Foundation to take action in their communities.

#### 5. Bringing about peace

Peace holds a unique status in Rotary. We approach peace not as an abstract concept, but as a living, dynamic expression of human development. As a humanitarian service organization, it is both a cornerstone of our mission, and one of our six areas of focus – one of the main ways in which our members make their mark on the world.

Each year, the Rotary Peace Centers train some of the world's most dedicated professionals to resolve conflicts and promote national and international cooperation. Rotary Peace Fellows study in a two-year master's degree program or a professional certificate program at Rotary's partner universities. Rotary members themselves also address the underlying causes of conflict, including poverty, inequality, ethnic tension, lack of access to education, and unequal distribution of resources. Our collaboration with the Institute for Economics and Peace is providing free, self-guided training to individuals who want to be peacebuilders in their communities.

#### History of the Rotary Club of Polomolok IOI

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was officially chartered as a legitimate club by Rotary International, through the efforts of its mother club – the Rotary Club of Midtown Gensan on August 31, 2005. As early as February 2003, there were already numerous attempts to organize a Rotary club in the municipality of Polomolok, but it was only in January 2005 when persistence finally paid off. With the blessing of RC Midtown Gensan, Omar Gallinero became the new club's Charter President, leading 25 other charter members with various classifications. Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was formed under the leadership of Len Magno as then the District Governor of 3860. The club's name is suffixed with the number 101 for two significant reasons: one, the club was founded on Rotary International's 101st foundation anniversary; and the club was the 101st club to be chartered under District 3860.

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was registered under District 3860, Area 3F with Club Number 70517. To date, the Club runs on man-strength of twenty five(25) committed individuals.
