










MESSAGE FROM THE **EDITOR**

Your gift to the Annual Fund helps Rotary clubs take action today to create positive change in communities at home and around the world. Your contributions help us strengthen peace efforts, provide clean water and sanitation, support education, grow local economies, save mothers and children, and fight disease.

The Every Rotarian Every Year (EREY) initiative asks every Rotarian to support The Rotary Foundation every year. In addition to contributing to the Annual Fund on a regular basis, members are encouraged to get involved in a Foundation project or program. This can be accomplished online via My Rotary or just search for The Rotary Foundation and the "Give Now" box. A goal which many set for themselves is \$100 per year or you can also donate as little as \$25. It may be more or it may be less. Let's try for 100% of our club to give something.

At the end of every Rotary year, contributions directed to the Annual Fund-SHARE from all Rotary clubs in the district are divided between the World Fund and the District Designated Fund, or DDF. At the end of three years, your district can use the DDF to pay for Foundation, club, and district projects that your club and others in the district choose. Districts may use up to half of their DDF to fund district grants. The remaining DDF may be used for global grants or donated to PolioPlus, the Rotary Peace Centers, or another district. This amount is separate from the Polio Plus giving. A percentage of the Polio Plus money does not return to our district to be used as DDF. The DDF is used for our smaller projects as opposed to minimum \$30,000 projects which are Global grants. Let's support our district so we can ask the district to support our projects!



TRF DIRECTOR

The Rotary Foundation (TRF) is the philanthropic arm of Rotary International, empowering Rotarians worldwide to create lasting change through meaningful service. By focusing on Rotary's seven areas of priority—such as disease prevention, education, environmental protection, and poverty alleviation—TRF enables sustainable projects that address the world's most pressing challenges.

Through its robust grant programs, TRF supports initiatives that combat issues like malnutrition, illiteracy, and economic instability, making a tangible impact on communities across the globe. This work is driven by the dedication of Rotarians who contribute not just funds but also their time, energy, and expertise.

A Legacy of Excellence in Philanthropy The Rotary Foundation's commitment to transparency and impact has earned it global recognition. Since 2008, it has consistently received Charity Navigator's highest four-star rating, an honor bestowed on only 1% of charities worldwide. This accolade highlights TRF's exceptional stewardship of donor contributions and its effectiveness in maximizing its resources to "do good in the world."

About The Rotary Foundation Established in 1917 by Arch Klumph, the sixth president of Rotary International, TRF began as an endowment fund with a modest initial contribution of just \$26.50 from the Rotary Club of Kansas City. Over the years, it has grown into a philanthropic powerhouse, now managing assets exceeding \$1 billion. Today, TRF disburses over \$1 million daily to fund transformative projects led by Rotarians, making it one of the largest and most respected international fellowship programs in the world.

To date, The Rotary Foundation has allocated more than \$4 billion toward sustainable initiatives that improve health, advance education, and alleviate poverty. Its mission remains steadfast: to "advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace."

A Unique Approach to Giving The Rotary Foundation stands apart from other charitable organizations by encouraging both donations and active involvement. It is entirely sustained by contributions from Rotarians and their allies, underscoring the grassroots nature of its work. Contributions to TRF are not merely financial transactions—they are investments in a better future, driven by the passion and hands-on efforts of its members.

How TRF Funds Make an Impact One of TRF's key funding mechanisms is the Annual Fund. Donations to this fund are divided equally: half supports the District Fund, and the other half is allocated to the World Fund. This dual distribution allows Rotary clubs to implement impactful local and global projects through district and global grants, turning ambitious goals into life-changing realities.

A Beacon of Hope From its humble beginnings to its current status as a global philanthropic leader, The Rotary Foundation continues to inspire and empower Rotarians to make a difference. Through its financial stewardship, innovative grant programs, and unwavering dedication to service, TRF embodies Rotary's motto of "Service Above Self," creating a brighter future for communities worldwide.



THE ROTARY FOUNDATION'S FOCUS: A LEGACY OF SERVICE AND GLOBAL IMPACT

THE ROTARY FOUNDATION (TRF) HAS CONSISTENTLY LED THE WAY IN GLOBAL ROTARY INITIATIVES, MOST NOTABLY IN THE ERADICATION OF POLIO AND THE PROMOTION OF PEACE AROUND THE WORLD. AS A KEY DRIVER OF ROTARY'S COMMITMENT TO SERVICE, THE FOUNDATION CONTINUES TO MAKE A PROFOUND IMPACT IN COMMUNITIES EVERYWHERE BY ADDRESSING SOME OF THE MOST PRESSING GLOBAL CHALLENGES.

A LEGACY OF GIVING AND SCHOLARSHIPS

THE FOUNDATION'S JOURNEY BEGAN IN 1930 WHEN IT MADE ITS FIRST GRANT OF US\$500 TO THE INTERNATIONAL SOCIETY FOR CRIPPLED CHILDREN. THIS GESTURE WAS THE BEGINNING OF A TRADITION THAT HAS SINCE GROWN INTO AN ENDURING LEGACY OF GLOBAL SERVICE. FOLLOWING THE PASSING OF ROTARY'S FOUNDER, PAUL HARRIS, IN 1947, THE FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED THE FIRST MAJOR PROGRAM IN HIS HONOR: THE ROTARY SCHOLARSHIPS. THESE SCHOLARSHIPS HAVE SINCE EMPOWERED MORE THAN 350,000 STUDENTS TO PURSUE EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES ABROAD, CREATING A RIPPLE EFFECT OF KNOWLEDGE AND LEADERSHIP THAT CONTINUES TO IMPACT COMMUNITIES GLOBALLY.

THE GLOBAL FIGHT AGAINST POLIO: POLIOPLUS PROGRAM

AMONG THE MOST SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION IS ITS RELENTLESS FIGHT TO ERADICATE POLIO. IN 1985, THE FOUNDATION LAUNCHED THE POLIOPLUS PROGRAM, MARKING A PIVOTAL MOMENT IN ROTARY'S HISTORY. THIS INITIATIVE GAINED MOMENTUM IN 1988 WITH THE FORMATION OF THE GLOBAL POLIO ERADICATION INITIATIVE, A PARTNERSHIP THAT INCLUDED THE WORLD HEALTH ORGANIZATION (WHO), UNICEF, AND THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION (CDC).

AT THAT TIME, OVER 125 COUNTRIES WERE STRUGGLING WITH MORE THAN 350,000 CASES OF POLIO. ROTARY'S DEDICATED EFFORTS, ALONGSIDE MATCHING FUNDS FROM THE BILL & MELINDA GATES FOUNDATION, HAVE RESULTED IN OVER 3 BILLION CHILDREN BEING IMMUNIZED AGAINST POLIO. THE RESULT? A STAGGERING 99.9 PERCENT REDUCTION IN POLIO CASES GLOBALLY. BY 2021, ROTARY'S CONTRIBUTIONS TO THIS INITIATIVE SURPASSED US\$2 BILLION, MAKING IT ONE OF THE MOST EFFECTIVE GLOBAL HEALTH CAMPAIGNS IN HISTORY.

PROMOTING PEACE AND DEVELOPING LEADERS: THE PEACE FELLOW PROGRAM

IN ADDITION TO ITS WORK ON POLIO ERADICATION, THE ROTARY FOUNDATION IS ALSO DEEPLY COMMITTED TO PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION. IN 2002, TRF ESTABLISHED THE PEACE FELLOW PROGRAM, WHICH LED TO THE CREATION OF THE ROTARY PEACE CENTERS. THESE CENTERS OFFER A UNIQUE GRADUATE-LEVEL EDUCATION IN PEACE AND CONFLICT STUDIES TO SELECTED INDIVIDUALS, TRAINING THEM TO BECOME LEADERS IN GLOBAL PEACE INITIATIVES. SINCE ITS INCEPTION, THE PROGRAM HAS TRAINED OVER 1,400 PEACE FELLOWS WHO HAVE GONE ON TO HOLD PROMINENT POSITIONS IN GOVERNMENTS, NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS (NGOS), LAW ENFORCEMENT, AND INTERNATIONAL BODIES SUCH AS THE UNITED NATIONS AND THE WORLD BANK.

THESE PEACE FELLOWS ARE LEADING EFFORTS IN CONFLICT RESOLUTION, HUMANITARIAN AID, AND DIPLOMACY, HELPING TO BUILD STRONGER, MORE PEACEFUL SOCIETIES AROUND THE WORLD.

TRANSFORMING COMMUNITIES: ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER, HEALTHCARE, AND EDUCATION

BEYOND POLIO AND PEACE, THE FOUNDATION'S IMPACT IS SEEN IN ITS NUMEROUS HUMANITARIAN PROJECTS, WHICH HAVE IMPROVED THE LIVES OF MILLIONS. THANKS TO TRF'S PROGRAMS, COMMUNITIES IN NEED NOW HAVE BETTER ACCESS TO CLEAN WATER, HEALTHCARE, AND EDUCATION—RESOURCES THAT ARE FUNDAMENTAL TO IMPROVING THE QUALITY OF LIFE. THROUGH ITS VARIOUS INITIATIVES, THE FOUNDATION CONTINUES TO UPLIFT AND EMPOWER COMMUNITIES, ENSURING THAT INDIVIDUALS IN EVERY CORNER OF THE GLOBE HAVE THE OPPORTUNITY TO THRIVE.

THROUGH ITS FOCUS ON POLIO ERADICATION, PEACEBUILDING, AND SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT, THE ROTARY FOUNDATION REMAINS AT THE FOREFRONT OF GLOBAL HUMANITARIAN WORK. BY EMPOWERING INDIVIDUALS AND COMMUNITIES, TRF CONTINUES TO MAKE A LASTING IMPACT IN THE WORLD, EMBODYING ROTARY'S VISION OF "DOING GOOD IN THE WORLD" AND INSPIRING OTHERS TO JOIN IN THE MISSION.







History of the Rotary Club of Polomolok IOI

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was officially chartered as a legitimate club by Rotary International, through the efforts of its mother club – the Rotary Club of Midtown Gensan on August 31, 2005. As early as February 2003, there were already numerous attempts to organize a Rotary club in the municipality of Polomolok, but it was only in January 2005 when persistence finally paid off. With the blessing of RC Midtown Gensan, Omar Gallinero became the new club's Charter President, leading 25 other charter members with various classifications. Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was formed under the leadership of Len Magno as then the District Governor of 3860. The club's name is suffixed with the number 101 for two significant reasons: one, the club was founded on Rotary International's 101st foundation anniversary; and the club was the 101st club to be chartered under District 3860.

The Rotary Club of Polomolok 101 was registered under District 3860, Area 3F with Club Number 70517. To date, the Club runs on man-strength of twenty five(25) committed individuals.




