The Earth Moved, But So Did Our Hearts...

I will never forget the morning of June 8... We were about to have breakfast when suddenly, I felt the earth move. At first, I thought it would only last for a few seconds. But within moments, the shaking became so violent that I could hardly keep my balance. I struggled to walk, but somehow managed to make my way to the fire exit of our 3-storey building where we reside on the third floor.

I remember praying over and over while shouting in fear as I heard debris crashing around me. "Lord, please make it stop... Please, Lord, make it stop." Those were the only words I could utter. It felt like forever before the shaking finally stopped. Then I heard my sister calling my name. She thought I was still inside my room. She didn't know I had already made it outside. Hearing her voice reminded me how precious life is and how, in just a matter of seconds, everything can change.

When it was finally safe to go back inside, my heart sank. The house was in chaos. My cherished collection of jars, delicate china, and figurines that I had lovingly kept for more than three decades were shattered all over the floor. Seeing them broken was painful, but deep inside I knew they were only things. They could never compare to the lives that had been spared.

Just as I was trying to gather myself, another powerful aftershock struck. My heart started racing again. I could hardly breathe. I rushed outside, desperate for fresh air, wondering if it would ever end.

Even now, we continue to experience aftershocks. Some are so light they're barely noticeable, while others still make our hearts skip a beat. Every tremor brings back the fear of that unforgettable morning. Despite everything, I thank God with all my heart that my family and I are safe. We consider ourselves truly blessed. Many families were not as fortunate.



As news and photos of the devastation reached us, my heart broke. Buildings and homes in General Santos City suffered serious damage, while communities in Sarangani Province were among the hardest hit. Looking at the aftermath, I couldn't help but cry for the families who had lost so much.

In the middle of all the devastation, something beautiful happened.

A dear friend reached out to me and asked if she could send financial assistance through our Rotary Club to help the earthquake victims. It was her foreign husband who, without hesitation, generously sent the donation. Soon after, our sister club, Rotary Club of Ubay(Bohol), also extended financial support. Along with generous donations from our own Rotary members and compassionate individuals who answered our call, we were able to immediately put those contributions into action.

On the second day after the earthquake, using the funds we had received, our club purchased 101 sacks of rice and delivered them to our relief goods repacking area. There, volunteers from Area 2FG, together with members of our club and partner organizations, came together with one heart and one purpose—to prepare relief packs for families whose lives had been turned upside down by the disaster. Watching everyone work side by side—packing rice, canned goods, water, biscuits, hygiene kits, and other basic necessities—was a powerful reminder that hope is built through unity. Every bag packed represented a family that would not go hungry. Every helping hand reflected the compassion that binds our community together. My heartfelt gratitude goes to every donor—our Rotary members, kind-hearted individuals, Rotary and Rotaract Clubs, and even those who chose to remain anonymous. Your generosity became a beacon of hope for families facing one of the most difficult moments of their lives. Your kindness reminds us that the greatest acts of giving are often those done quietly, without expecting recognition in return.



The earthquake taught me that in a matter of minutes, we can lose the things we treasure. But it also taught me that kindness can never be buried under the rubble. While the ground beneath us may shake, our faith, compassion, and willingness to help one another remain unshaken. That is a lesson I will carry with me for the rest of my life...

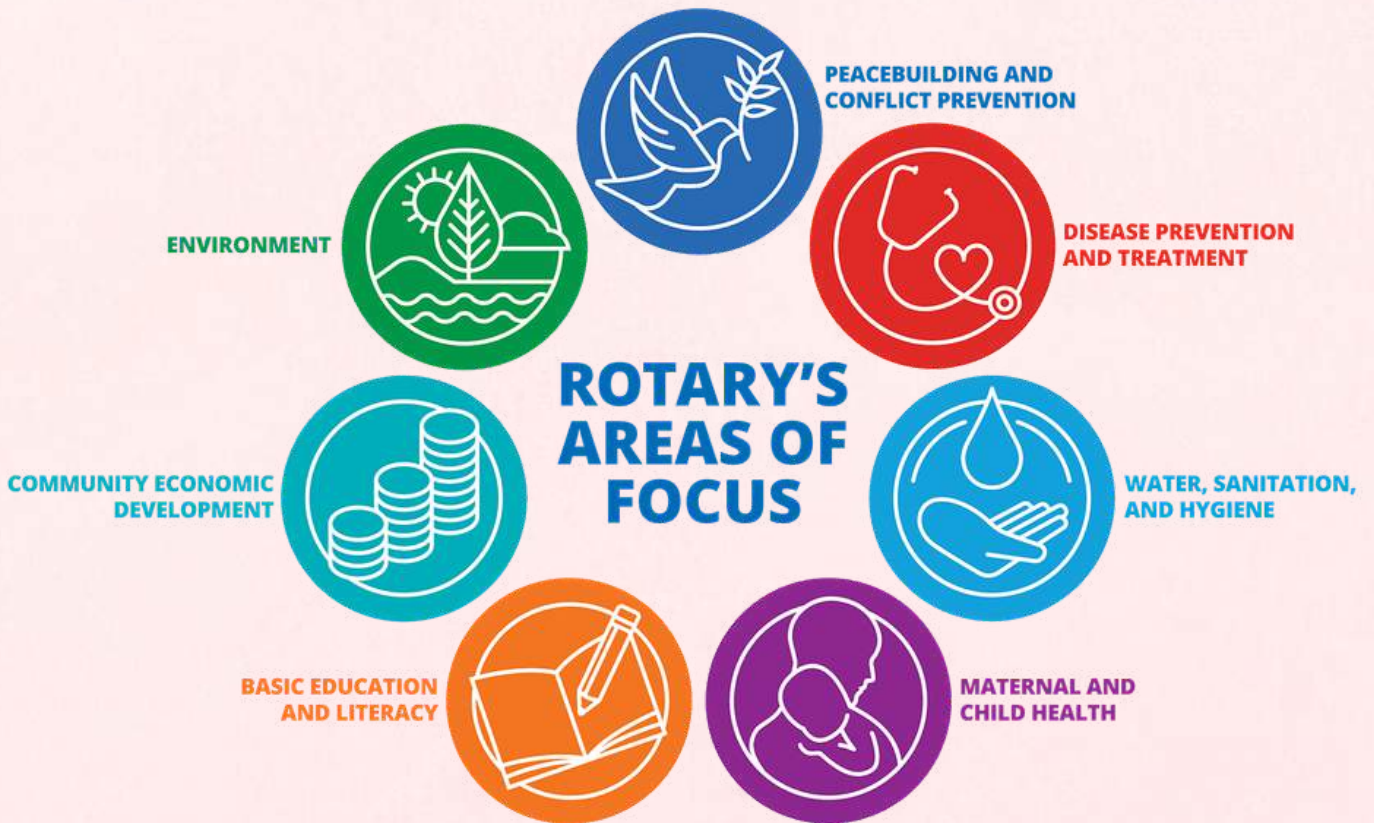

- Recognize the honour and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
- Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business and profession;
- Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.


