RCSF Free Birth Registration Brings Hope to Sitio Pudlosan

Sixteen individuals in Sitio Pudlosan, Barangay Borbon, have taken their first official step towards a brighter future through Bright Beginnings, a free birth registration initiative that aims to ensure every individual's legal identity and access to basic rights.

With the partnership from the Local Civil Registry of the municipality of San Francisco, the program addressed a long-standing challenge in remote areas where many residents face difficulties in securing proper documentation due to financial constraints and geographical isolation.

Without a birth certificate, access to education, healthcare, and other government services often remains out of reach.

Through Bright Beginnings, local leaders and volunteers worked tirelessly to process and deliver birth certificates to the 16 beneficiaries, providing them with not only a piece of paper but also a key to opportunities.

RCSF brings manhood to less fortunate children

A transformative initiative unfolded in Sitio Pudlosan, Barangay Borbon, as 45 boys became the proud beneficiaries of Project TULI (Transforming Uncircumcised Children to Leveled-up Individuals).

This outreach program, aimed at promoting both physical health and cultural growth, was held in partnership with local health workers, volunteers, and community leaders.

Circumcision, a rite of passage deeply ingrained in Filipino culture, marks an essential step towards manhood for many young boys. However, in remote areas like Sitio Pudlosan, access to healthcare services can often be limited.

Recognizing this, the organizers of Project TULI provided not only the medical procedure but also a nurturing environment to ensure a holistic experience for the boys.

The program went beyond the procedure itself, incorporating health education sessions for both the boys and their parents. Topics covered included post-procedure care, general hygiene practices, and tips for maintaining a healthy lifestyle.

Families were also provided with post-operative kits containing essential supplies such as antiseptics, bandages, and pain relievers, ensuring proper recovery.

The success of Project TULI was made possible through the collaboration of the local barangay council, medical professionals, and dedicated volunteers. Residents of Sitio Pudlosan expressed their gratitude for the initiative, noting how it addressed a significant need in their community.

"This program shows that even in remote areas like ours, we can access quality health services and feel connected to a larger network of care," shared Analisa Cataluna in bisaya whose son underwent the procedure.

The delighted less fortunate children warmly received the donations, their gratitude shining through smiles and heartfelt words.


The distribution event was marked by a spirit of togetherness, with volunteers engaging with the villagers, listening to their stories, and sharing moments of joy.
