#### **GRANTS**

Dear chairs of district Rotary Foundation committees and the subcommittees for grants, scholarships, and vocational training teams:

With the new Rotary year underway, I'd like to offer a few updates and tell you about resources that may be helpful to you in your role.

#### **Updates**

- Rotaract clubs can now get Rotary Foundation grant funds. Districts that apply for a district grant can
  include Rotaract clubs' activities in their spending plans. And Rotaract clubs may apply for global
  grants to support their service efforts in their own communities or abroad. Learn more by
  downloading our <u>FAQ about Rotaract and grants</u>.
- Districts can apply for expedited <u>disaster response grants</u> to provide relief to people affected by the war in Ukraine. These grants can be used to supply water, food, shelter, medicine, and clothing. The Rotary district in Ukraine and those that border Ukraine can get grants of up to US\$100,000. Other districts can use grants of up to US\$25,000 to support local relief efforts or to partner with a club or district in Ukraine or a neighboring country to send relief supplies there. Multiple districts may combine their grants to fund larger projects and shipments. You can now <u>apply for these grants</u> until **31 December**. Disaster response grants are also available to offer help after natural disasters in all Rotary districts. For either use, districts can apply for one grant at a time and can apply for another grant as soon as the previous one's report is completed and the grant is closed.

#### Resources

- The <u>Grant Center</u> is your hub for all grant-related matters. I encourage you to visit regularly to track your district's grants and to ensure that all necessary authorizations have been given.
- Grants Responsibilities by Leader explains club and district roles and lists useful resources.
- My Rotary has pages about each of our grant types and links to a wide array of grants materials.
- The <u>Grant Management Seminar</u> learning plan in Rotary's <u>Learning Center</u> includes short online courses on qualifying a club for Rotary grants, conducting a community assessment, planning an effective project, making your project sustainable, managing grant finances, and reporting on grants. Your district can opt to supplement or even replace in-person grant management seminars with these courses. You can use Learning Center reports to track participants' progress for the purpose of qualifying their clubs.
- Rotary Grants staff members are available to answer questions and can do a preliminary review of your grant applications before you officially submit them.
- You'll receive the quarterly Giving & Grants newsletter, which includes information on fundraising, grants, and more.
- In a few weeks, I'll send you a list of other districts' leaders and their email addresses to help you communicate with one another and plan projects together. If you don't want your email address included, write to rotarysupportcenter@rotary.org.

We look forward to working with you this year as you develop projects to address your community's needs. Through your service, we continue to make progress on Rotary's goal of <u>increasing our impact</u>. If you have any questions, write to <u>rotarysupportcenter@rotary.org</u>.
