Presidential message for October 2024

With World Polio Day on 24 October, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now.

I had the honor of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of Delmont-Salem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 million for PolioPlus.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

And I was thrilled to see Team End Polio raise global awareness around the 2024 Paris Olympics. This world-class roster of athletes, global leaders, and polio eradication supporters came together to advocate for a world where no child has to live in fear of being paralyzed by polio. Some of the athletes on Team End Polio are polio survivors themselves, adding weight to their advocacy.

These are just a few examples of the many ways Rotary has teamed up recently to End Polio Now. It is vital that we continue to seek out and recruit teammates in polio eradication, especially after the challenges our eradication efforts have faced this year.

The Rotary world was heartbroken to learn about the tragic passing in August of Aidan O'Leary, director for polio eradication at the World Health Organization.

I knew Aidan and worked with him directly. He was a tireless advocate in the fight against polio and a kind, genuine man. We will remember him both for his advocacy and his warmth.

But where there is hardship, there is also hope. I feel hopeful whenever I consider the countless ways Rotary supports the fight every day to eradicate polio.

As people of action, we don't have the luxury of giving in to despair, even in the face of tragedy. The best way to honor Aidan's memory is by teaming up and reaching our goal to End Polio Now.

We made a promise to the children of the world and their families. It is incumbent upon us, together with our global partners, to end this threat once and for all.

There are so many ways we can team up to eradicate polio. You can donate to the End Polio Now campaign, join or initiate a PolioPlus Society in your club or district, or take inspiration from the fundraisers I mentioned above.

I encourage Rotary members around the world to continue to seek out new teammates, so that together, we end polio.

Economic and Community Development is one such area of focus that Rotary has asked all clubs to focus on, especially in October. What is your club doing? Here are some ideas:

- 190 million people are funding their business endeavors through microfinance
- Partner with a local microlender to improve access to financial services and provide financial infrastructure in the community.
- Develop mobile banking resources in partnership with a microlender. Cell phones, which can be used to make deposits and transfer funds, can increase access to banking systems in developing communities
- When supporting service projects in a developing community, purchase goods and supplies locally to stimulate the economy and avoid unnecessary shipping fees
- 1.4 billion people — nearly half of them employed — live on less than \$1.25 a day
- Expand vocational training opportunities, including job placement programming, at local nonprofit organizations
- Send a vocational training team to teach business leaders in developing communities how to create a business plan and maintain accurate financial accounting.
- Partner with a cooperative that provides training, joint economic ventures, and ownership of assets to its members through a democratic structure
- Provide equipment or supplies to a cooperative to increase production and sales in the local market
- Support entrepreneurs and small businesses in developing communities. The success of local business leaders can multiply employment opportunities in the community

Eastern Visayas students to undergo deworming

TACLOBAN CITY, LEYTE, Philippines – Government agencies and civic organizations have agreed to launch a massive deworming campaign in public schools in a bid to combat the high prevalence of soil-transmitted helminth (STH) infections among students in Eastern Visayas.

Lawyer Neil Sia, secretary of the Rotary Club of Tacloban, highlighted the importance of addressing STH infections, saying that the condition negatively impacts students' physical and mental health.

"This deworming initiative is crucial for our schoolchildren. STH infections not only affect their physical health but can also impair their cognitive development and academic performance," he said in a statement.

"By tackling this problem, we hope to improve the overall well-being of our students," he added.

A memorandum of agreement (MOA) was signed by the Department of Education, Department of Health (DOH), Department of Interior and Local Government, and civic groups such as the Rotaract Club of Tacloban and the Rotary Club of Tacloban on Monday, Sept. 23.

This partnership aims to conduct regular deworming activities to improve the health and well-being of school children in the region.

Under the agreement, the first wave of deworming will take place in January 2025, with the second cycle scheduled in July 2025.

The program will initially target seven public schools in Tacloban City, benefiting around 1,000 students. The long-term goal is to expand the program across the region.

The agreement outlines establishing a sustainable partnership, wherein all participating agencies and organizations will work together to plan, implement, and monitor a biannual school-based deworming program.

This initiative aligns with the World Health Organization's Neglected Tropical Diseases roadmap for 2021 to 2030, which seeks to significantly reduce, if not eliminate, STH infections through mass drug administration.

According to the agreement, the deworming program in Eastern Visayas is seen as a potential pilot model for a nationwide school-based deworming strategy. The goal is to support the DOH's national effort to reduce STH infections by 2030.

"The deworming program in Eastern Visayas is not just a response to local health concerns, but also serves as a pilot initiative that could be scaled nationwide," the MOA read.

The collaborative effort represents a significant step toward improving public health in Eastern Visayas, focusing on reducing the impact of neglected tropical diseases among the region's most vulnerable populations: school children.

"This partnership will help lay the groundwork for a nationwide school-based deworming strategy, contributing to the DOH's long-term goals," it added.

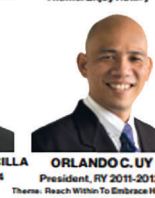
