PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

To my fellow Rotarians,

We are still moving through a full stretch of activities, and I want to acknowledge how many of you have remained present and willing to help whenever the club needed something done. These past weeks have shown steady effort from different members in ways that often go unnoticed but keep everything running. Your initiative has made it easier for us to plan ahead with a clearer direction.

Our next fund-raising activity is the advance screening of Avatar: Fire and Ash. The ticket price is 700 pesos, and each member is asked to sell eight tickets. We are preparing for a mid-December schedule, which will be finalized soon. It's a straightforward project, yet it gives us room to rebuild our resources and support the commitments we plan to continue in the coming months. I encourage everyone to start reaching out early and securing buyers so we can keep our timeline steady.

By January, we begin another major fund-raising activity: the One Million Signature Campaign for a Cause. Each signature represents a 100-peso contribution, and each card holds twenty-eight signatures. Our initial production will be one hundred cards. This will require patience, conversation, and steady follow-up, but the potential support it can raise for projects under the seven areas of focus is significant. If we approach this early and consistently, we can create substantial backing for the work we aim to carry out for the rest of the Rotary year.

Our Christmas gathering is scheduled for December 10, 2025. This will be a bring-and-share dinner, and everyone is welcome to bring their families. The exchange gift will be worth 500 pesos. Members who wish to contribute raffle items may do so. This gathering will also serve as our last meeting for the year, and I hope it becomes a comfortable, easy evening where we can set aside formalities and simply enjoy the company of one another.

On another note, the Global Grant Project is moving forward. We are currently working on the remaining requirements in preparation for submission. The process has been careful and detailed, and I appreciate the patience shown by those involved. We are grateful to Kano San of RC Fukushima for expressing willingness to support the funding. With the way things are progressing, we are getting closer to putting everything in place.

Thank you for the time, initiative, and steady involvement you bring to the club. Everything we hope to achieve depends on how we show up as a group. Your involvement helps us move beyond plans and into actual results on the ground. I encourage everyone to stay engaged, stay responsive, and stay part of the work that strengthens our purpose as a club.

Message from Rotary International President November 2025

This November, as we celebrate The Rotary Foundation, I invite you to consider not only what we give but why we give. The Foundation is more than a fund for projects. It is the beating heart of our promise that service, rooted in trust and friendship, can create lasting change.

Our Action Plan calls us to increase our impact, and the Foundation is how we make this vision real. Since 1988, Rotary and our partners have immunized nearly 3 billion children against polio. We have committed more than \$2.6 billion to this cause, and last year alone we directed \$146 million toward the final push for eradication. These numbers are significant, but the true impact is not in statistics — it is in the lives of children who will never again fear polio. It is in the hope restored to families and the peace built in communities once defined by disease.

But polio is only one story among many. Each year, Rotary Peace Centers train new generations of leaders who will transform conflict into dialogue and division into understanding. In 2023-24, nearly 100 new fellows began their studies, continuing a legacy of more than 1,800 peacebuilders from over 140 countries. When we invest in them, we are planting seeds of peace that will bear fruit for decades to come.

The Foundation also touches lives through district and global grants, supporting projects large and small. A clean water well for a rural community, scholarships for young professionals, medical care in the wake of disaster — these are not temporary gestures, but steps toward dignity, resilience, and opportunity. This is how Rotary service becomes lasting impact. And when natural disasters strike, our Foundation allows Rotary to act quickly with disaster response grants.

Our Foundation is not about what we can do alone but what we can do together. Each contribution, no matter its size, joins with others to create a collective act of faith in humanity and in the future.

The last mile of any great journey is always the hardest. We see this in our final steps toward ending polio, in our work for peace, and in every project that seeks to lift people out of despair. Yet every time we give, we declare that our work will continue regardless of the challenge.

This November, let us give with gratitude, with joy, and with hope. Through our Foundation, we Unite for Good, and in doing so, we leave behind not only projects but a legacy of peace, trust, and Service Above Self.


