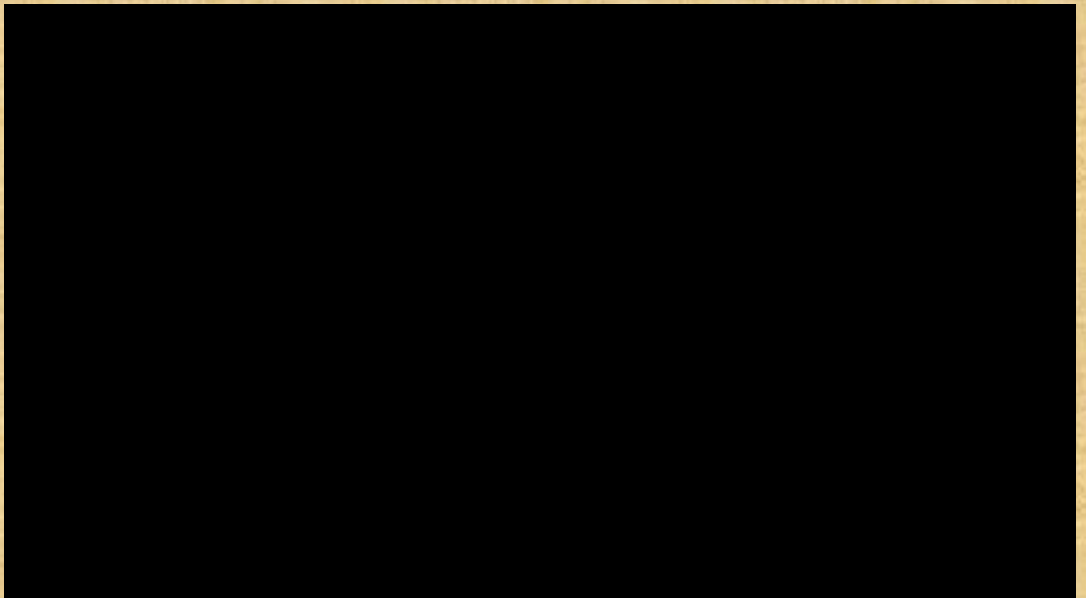

The theme is symbolized by a logo (Drawn from one of Jolomo's paintings - "Scarsdale Point, Isle of Mull") with vibrant colors inspired by Scotland, representing modern Scotland beyond traditional stereotypes. Gordon drew inspiration from a touching experience in Thailand where Rotary's aid brought hope to a woman who had lost everything. He emphasizes the importance of making mental health a priority and expanding Rotary's culture of care to create hope in the world through acts of kindness and connection.
