

The Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES through it's Women Empowerment (WE) Program has been supporting the Alternative Learning System Program of the Department of Education.

The Alternative Learning System (ALS) is a parallel learning system in the Philippines that provides a practical option to the existing formal instruction. When one does not have or cannot access formal education in schools, ALS is an alternate or substitute. Despite the remarkable progress in expanding access to basic education, the education data in 2016 shows that about half of Filipino students are struggling to complete basic education on time.

The Department of Education (DepEd) leads in the delivery of a "second chance" program to build human capital of out of school youth and adults through the implementation of the Alternative Learning System (ALS). ALS enrollees who pass the accreditation and equivalency (A&E) exam receive a government credential that can facilitate access to higher education, vocational training, and overall better employment prospects.

The ALS has a key role in enabling school dropouts to develop their human capital and improve their long-term educational outcomes and employment prospects.

Thanks to all Rotarians particularly Rotarian Leila L. Ibita who is from the Department of Education. She has been actively involved in mending the broken dreams of the inmates-graduates whose pieces of dreams could slowly turn rightfully into reality after their graduation last July 10, 2019 at the Tagum City Jail.

The WE Program of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES was established sometime in 2017 and has made the Tagum City Jail female inmates the recipient of trainings in sewing by providing sewing machines, and materials for Christmas décor making and food processing.

First Names or Nicknames

From the earliest days of Rotary, members have referred to each other on a first-name basis. Since personal acquaintanceship and friendship are the cornerstones of Rotary, it was natural that clubs adopted the practice of setting aside formal titles in conversations among members.

Individuals who normally would be addressed as Doctor, Professor, Mister, the Honorable or Sir are regularly called Joe, Bill, Mary, Karen or Charley by other Rotarians. The characteristic Rotary club name badge fosters the first-name custom.

In a few areas, such as Europe, club members use a more formal style in addressing fellow members. In other parts of the world, mainly in Asian countries, the practice is to assign each new Rotarian a humorous nickname which relates to some personal characteristic or which is descriptive of the member's business or profession. A member nicknamed "Oxygen" is the manufacturer of chemical gas products. "Trees" is the nickname for the Rotarian in the lumber business, "Building" is the contractor, "Paper" is the stationery or office supply retailer. Other members might carry nicknames like "Muscles," "Foghorn" or "Smiles" as commentaries on their physical features. The nicknames are frequently a source of good-natured fun and fellowship. But whether a Rotarian is addressed by a given first name or a nickname, the spirit of personal friendship is the initial step that opens doors to all other opportunities for

Invocation at Club Meetings

In most Rotary clubs, such as ours, it is customary to open weekly meetings with an appropriate invocation or blessing. Usually such invocations are offered without reference to specific religious denominations or faiths. Rotary policy recognizes that throughout the world Rotarians represent many religious beliefs, ideas and creeds (see Tolerance, page 8). The religious beliefs of each member are fully respected, and nothing in Rotary is intended to prevent any individual from being faithful to such convictions.

At international assemblies and conventions, it is traditional for a silent invocation to be given. In respect for all religious beliefs and in the spirit of tolerance for a wide variety of personal faiths, all persons are invited to seek divine guidance and peace "each in his own way." It is an inspiring experience to join with thousands of Rotarians in an international "silent prayer" or act of personal devotion.

Dolly Parton famously steers clear of politics — almost as much as she eschews frumpy frocks — but the country legend's latest track is an explicit celebration of women's rights.

Parton's muse for her new song was the 19th Amendment (that would be women's suffrage, for those of you who skipped history class). Parton sings of the women who marched to bring it about and how women have fought for their rights "since the very beginning of time."

The country music legend has long espoused a sort of folksy feminism (see "9 to 5"), so of course it's no dry historical exegesis. A sample lyric? "They said a woman's place/ Was staying in her hut/Washin', cookin' cleanin'/ Wipin' babies butts./ They said she'd never see the day/We'd equal up to them/But here we are; we've come so far/I guess we sure showed them."

"A Woman's Right" is one of 27 songs by different artists, each inspired by a Constitutional amendment, on an album set to be released Tuesday that was produced by the team behind WNYC Studio's "More Perfect" podcast — a gleefully geeked-out spinoff of Radiolab that looks at the Supreme Court and the country's foundational documents.

ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaňo, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. 


