JC's Roses with LACES

Saturday, September 14, 2019 was no ordinary day for the children of the House of Hope. It was a day when they were invited and anticipated to grace the birthday celebration of one of the Rotakids of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES (RCTGL).

JC, daughter of PAG Arlene Adlawan, has purposely chosen the kids of House of Hope to be her special guests in celebration of her 18th birthday. The kids occupy a special place in the heart of JC as she has been actively exposed and involved in the different projects of the RCTGL while she was in her much younger years and even up to present.

The House of Hope in Tagum City provides temporary shelter for the children who are undergoing chemotherapy at the Davao Regional Medical Center in Apokon, Tagum City. Majority of these children are from Davao del Norte and nearby provinces whose families cannot afford to get a temporary shelter while seeking long-term treatment in Tagum City.

The said project started during the term of PAG Cleofe Llanos, a Pediatric Pulmonologist, who at that time was the club president. The House of Hope started in Davao City thru the initiative of Past President Mae Dolendo, also a physician, who is from the Rotary Club of Waling-waling in the said city.

The site in Tagum City to date has housed 105 children and is under the supervision of the Pediatric Society of Davao del Norte. In relation to this project, the RCTGL has also provided a playroom, air conditioning units and televisions sets to the Pediatric Ward of the Davao Regional Medical Center. It has also been the venue for the annual Christmas party of Rotakids of LACES every December where they give gifts to the children-patients.

JC, now 18 years old, runs Dreamers' Theater, a talent production center where children learn music and dance. JC decided to hold a children's party for the children of House of Hope in Jollibee, instead of preparing for a grand cotillion in a fancy hotel. Her 18th birthday celebration was a project of Dreamers' Theater which offers lessons in classical ballet, voice, guitar, and violin to the public. They also offer scholarships for guitar lessons to the youth who will serve in the church choir in their respective places.

Members of the RCTGL were also present to grace the occasion with the kids of House of Hope. They were the roses that adorned JC's celebration, which was arranged and tied with the lace of love and support for such a noble cause.

Tips for Increasing Club Members: Step Right Up

Know your club's strengths

Most things are strengths if you target the right audience. If you meet in the morning, you're probably a good fit for someone working 9 to 5. Meet at noon and you're more likely to appeal to retirees or parents of schoolchildren. "Not every club is right for every potential member," Gump says. "If someone doesn't fit your format, recommend them to another club." Keep in mind that the point is not just growing your club, but boosting Rotary's capacity to make a difference in communities around the world. And with any luck, that other club will send you a potential member one day. Gump points to one member who joined his club last year after a recommendation from the Rotary Club of Edina, which typically meets middays. "Morning meetings worked better for him than noon meetings," Gump says. "He has already become a Paul Harris Society member, leads our beer tasting committee, and led our 100th anniversary celebration for The Rotary Foundation."

Make membership growth your club's top priority

and make sure every member understands that. "I always tell presidents and presidents-elect that the best way to make their year as president easier is to bring in more members," says Gump. New members bring new energy to a club, he explains, and mean more people to serve on committees, work on projects and events, and raise money for the Foundation.

Look to young Rotarians for fresh perspectives

Want some suggestions about attracting younger members? Look at what's going on at the Roc City Rotary Club in Rochester, New York. "We are the next generation of Rotary," proclaims its website. "The baton has been passed. It's now our turn."

Chartered in February (and a provisional club since June 2016), Roc City targets recent college graduates and young professionals by keeping dues low (\$120 annually) and meetings infrequent. "We meet once a month and have a solid turnout at every meeting," says Kristina Chartrand, who co-founded the club with her longtime friend Kelsey Christiansen (they met in 2005 as Interactors while in high school). "We want the game changers and move makers, people who are busy and thriving in their everyday lives. We attract young people who want to get involved but crave flexibility."

At press time, the club had 24 members, aged 21 to 33, as well as 20-plus "Friends of Roc City." Members are recruited through word of mouth and social media; it helps that Roc City convenes during happy hour at a local pub. "So many people see us and what we're doing and just stop by," Chartrand says. The club plans service projects three months in advance so members can plan ahead, and it regularly schedules speakers for its Adulting 101 series (topics have included "Paying Off Debt" and "How to Buy a House"). "We want this to be something club members look forward to every month" – for years to come.

Rotarian rides again

On his way from his home in California to the Rotary International Convention in Hamburg, Germany, Edwin Velarde took an unusual detour.

In an effort to raise awareness of diabetes, Velarde, 57, rode a bicycle for the last leg of his trip, cycling 525 miles from London to Hamburg. After making stops along the way to visit Rotary clubs and talk about the impact of diabetes, he arrived on 31 May after 13 days of riding. He spoke to clubs in the United Kingdom, France, Belgium, the Netherlands, and Germany.

This was not the first time Velarde, a board member of the Rotarian Action Group for Diabetes, had cycled to a convention.

"I thought I could create awareness by riding to conventions," says Velarde, who was diagnosed with type 1 diabetes when he was 29. He biked from Busan to Seoul, Korea, in 2016, from Chicago to Atlanta in 2017, and from Rotary headquarters in Evanston, Illinois, to Toronto in 2018. This year, the journey had added meaning; Velarde dedicated this ride to his son Davis Edwin Velarde, who died at 22 of lymphoma in April.

Diabetes is a chronic illness that occurs either when the pancreas does not produce insulin (type 1) or when the body cannot effectively use insulin (type 2). When diabetes is not controlled, it can result in severe damage to the eyes, kidneys, and nerves and can double a person's risk of heart attack and stroke.

The World Health Organization estimates that the number of people with diabetes rose from 108 million in 1980 to 422 million in 2014. Several years ago, when Velarde was feeling fatigued and depressed about his illness, a friend gave him a bike. He took it out for a spin.

"That ride woke me up to the fact that I was not fit," he recalls. "I realized I wanted to become a cyclist, and not just someone who rides a bike."

Velarde's goal is to rally support among Rotarians to find a cure for diabetes, and to spread the word that a healthy lifestyle can help people who have type 2 diabetes better control the illness.

"We have what it takes to conquer the diabetes epidemic," he says. "Imagine the 422 million people we could help."

ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaňo, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. Agnes Resurreccion, Dir.; Rtn. Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Dir.; and Rtn. Arisfina Torre, Dir.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
