Recurrence of polio in the Philippines prompts Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES, in coordination with other Rotary Clubs and partners to intensify polio vaccination campaign.

Amidst the COVID 19 pandemic, Rotarians courageously participated in the Launching of Sabayang Patak Polio held last July 20, 2020 at Brgy. Hall, Brgy. Magugpo South, Tagum City, spearheaded by Hon. Mayor Allan L. Rellon.

In attendance were Dept. of Health Regional Officers, Hon. Mayor Allan L. Rellon, City Health Officer Dr. Arnel Florendo and all presidents of the Rotary Club of Tagum City.

In view of the observance of social distancing, clubs were urged to limit the number of participants during the aforementioned event, hence RCTGL was represented by Rtn. May F. Rabot, Rtn. Erma Bendigo, Rtn. PAG Mylene F. Baura and Rtn. Pres. Judy Marie R. Tan.

On the said occasion, RCTGL turned over donations consisting of 550 pcs. of disposable facemasks and 28 liters of ethyl alcohol to barangay health workers of the 23 barangays Tagum City who will administer polio vaccine to children 5 years old and below starting July 20, 2020 until August 2, 2020.

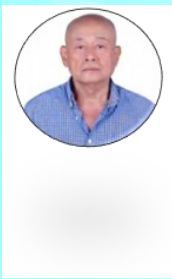

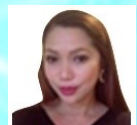

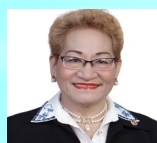

Online club meetings

Meeting online may be right for your club if members have busy schedules, limited mobility, or live in an area without a Rotary club. Clubs that meet online often arrange to meet in person for service projects, social activities, or Rotary events, like the Rotary convention or district conferences. Best Practices for Conducting Online Meetings

As the organizer:

Choose the technology that's right for your needs. Some free services limit the number of participants or the length of your meeting. Use video but provide an audio dial-in option. The ability to see and interact with fellow participants via technology like Zoom, GoToMeeting, and Google Hangouts helps keep everyone connected and engaged. However, not everyone will be able to join your meeting via video. Provide an audio option and consider recording the meeting and sharing it later. Stick to meeting basics. Use an agenda, set meeting ground rules, and clearly outline next steps at the end of the meeting. If background information is required, be sure to share it with all participants beforehand. Rethink your meeting for an online format. Some parts of an in-person meeting don't work well online. Develop your meeting content to eliminate or reformat activities that are best done face-to-face.

Keep it engaging. Keep things interesting by minimizing presentation length and maximizing discussion. Include polls, open Q&A, best practice sharing—anything that focuses their attention on the content and each other.

Ask for support: Building a team allows people to contribute to the success of your meeting. Ask others to monitor chat boxes, answer questions during the call, and troubleshoot technical issues. Be prepared. Do a dry run with any presenters to be sure they know how to request control and share their screens. Log on early to test your audio and make sure all presenters are present.

Successful online meetings also consider the needs of their participants. Encourage your participants to:

Download and test the technology ahead of time. All participants should ensure that they have downloaded the online meeting platform and are comfortable with its features. Some good questions they should ask:

Is my audio working? Will I be able to hear the other participants and will they be able to hear me? Is my camera working? Is my face visible? Have I eliminated background distractions to the best of my ability?

Is my lighting appropriate? Optimize the audio. All participants should mute themselves when they are not speaking.

ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaño, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The names which were submitted to Rotary International on October 30, 1992 are as follows: Nelida Aguillon, Cynthia Catungal, Leonida Decena, Natividad del Rosario, Maria Cleofe Evidente, Corazon Fernandez, Susan Franco, Rebecca Lectura, Flordeliza Magallon, Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Jocelyn Melendres, Ofelia Millan, Anna Geraldine Morante, Nenita Nazareno, Providencia Nuñez, Jocelyn Ong, Evelyn Ross Perdido, Carolina Quirante, Mai Rallos, Agnes Resurreccion, Linda Sicam, Lay Fong Soo-Montero, Arisfina Torre, Conchita Yago, and Amelie Tan-Ramos.

From these charter members: the following were elected as Charter Officers: Rtn. Rebecca Lectura, Pres.; Rtn. Providencia Nuñez, Pres.-Elect; Rtn. Nenita Nazareno, Vice-Pres.; Rtn. Susan Franco, Sec.; Rtn. Jocelyn Melendres, Tres.; Rtn. Linda Sicam, Auditor; Rtn. Conchita Yago, P.R.O.; Rtn. Natividad del Rosario, Sgt-at-Arms; Rtn. Corazon Fernandez, Dir.; Rtn. Agnes Resurreccion, Dir.; Rtn. Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Dir.; and Rtn. Arisfina Torre, Dir.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
