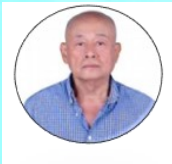

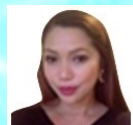

Prior to the outbreak of COVID 19 pandemic, the Knowledge on Wheels vehicle donated by Rotary Club of Tagum Golden Laces was used as a mobile facility for the ALS Program of DepEd that catered to tricycle drivers and dispatchers in various terminals in Tagum City. It was then doing well, as managed.

However, this pandemic has abruptly caused a 360 degrees turn around in the life of every ALS learners and students in the city. Physical presence of learners and students is no longer allowed in school in view of the imposition of health protocols. Hence, learning modules became a must, aside from the online learning or via internet, for those who have the means and could afford. Hardly hit by this phenomenon are students in public schools who cannot afford the online facilities. They have no choice but to resort to learning modules prepared by Deped. Module preparation entails a lot of effort, resources mobility.

Lately, DepEd authorities informed Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES that the Knowledge on Wheels vehicle became a saving grace for DepED it is now become a regular means to transport learning modules to places of residence of students in Tagum City; hence, making possible the prompt and fast delivery of the much awaited modules.

Our profound gratitude to the Rotary Club of Noda Central, Chiba, Japan, our long-time sister club, who donated funds to make possible the Knowledge on Wheels.

With sincerest gratitude, I am deeply honored to be your pandemic club president. Why? Because we as a club have survived the months through virtual meetings and yet we have accomplished our plans and projects on time.

The visit of our District Governor last September 30, 2020 and the successful launching of our project Knowledge on Wheels-Van edition, is a concrete manifestation that we have increased our capability to adapt and we have increased our reach.

In this issue of our Gazette, I would also like to share the article which was requested by our District Governor to be written by your club president as contribution to the Philippine Rotary Magazine.

Knowledge on Wheels: RC Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S.' Way of Reaching Out

Molded by Rotarian values in the heart and giving fair contribution to the cause of helping others get a chance in life is the passion that inspired the members of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Efficient Service) in their project. The influence of the Rotary International strategic goals, and the funding support of it's sister club, the Rotary Club of Noda Central in Chiba, Japan, the Knowledge on Wheels-Van Edition was realized.

Indeed, the COVID-19 pandemic may have stirred the world but this change could bring out the good in people. With collegial effort and resolve of the Rotarians and through the strong partnership with the Department of Education-Schools Division of Tagum City, Davao del Norte, specifically the Alternative Learning System (ALS), the club has helped make education possible to every learner in the city of Tagum.

The Knowledge on Wheels-Van Edition project is a response to Education in Emergency (EIE). It includes a van which was turned over to the Schools Division of Tagum City in a fitting ceremony held at Tagum City National Trade School, in Apokon, Tagum City, Davao del Norte last September 30, 2020. It was timely since it was witnessed by the Transforming District Governor of District 3860, Rodel Riezl S. Reyes. The event filled the members of the club with meaning and purpose, as the teachers shared personal stories of their struggles in adjusting to the new normal of teaching. The target date in terms of inauguration was hit, before opening of classes in the public schools on October 5, 2020, when the Self-Learning Modules (SLMs) need to reach every learner enrolled in the public schools. Right after the turn over, the teachers made sure that the newly inaugurated vehicle was used in the delivery of learning modules to the drop-off points.

The project, which manifests DepEd Tagum City and Tagum Golden LACES' care for all learners, regardless of their status, history and capacity goes beyond the ambition of increasing the literacy rate in the city. It is an advocacy that aims at giving the population the chance to uplift their individual lives while proudly contributing to the development of their family, their community and country.

The Wheel. This project is inspired by the wheel, which is the logo of the Rotary and which has been the Rotary symbol since its earliest days. It is a symbol for civilization, movement and service in action. The spokes of the wheel represent the inner direction and path of the Rotary's vocational service. So to say, the image of the wheel has fueled the dream of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES of helping provide access to education to the city's human resources.

The Knowledge on Wheels before the Pandemic. The Knowledge on Wheels has actually been in operation before the pandemic, in the term of District Governor Philip N. Tan. The club has started with a motor cab which was transformed into a two-in-one learning hub that served as a *library-and-school in a cab* complete with the necessary instructional materials. In partnership with the Department of Education, the learning hub was managed by highly competent ALS teachers. One side of the cab was made into a convertible blackboard while flat-screen television was installed on the other side. Tables and chairs were readily available inside the cab as well as textbooks, visual aids, modules and other necessary instructional materials.

The learning experience was made a notch more sophisticated. Electronic tablets that were readily connected to the internet via portable high-speed Wi-Fi were provided during the sessions. This ensured that the learners were also in-the-flow with the current multimedia trends in knowledge acquisition.

Furthermore, and in order to reach out to more learners, the Knowledge on Wheels was stationed in the most crowded places like the public market and public terminal. It also used to be accessible in far-flung areas including the coastal neighborhoods and the communities where the Indigenous People live. The project beneficiaries included Children at Risk (CAR), Out-of-School Youth (OSY), Persons with Disability (PWD), school dropouts, over-age learners and working adults, mostly tricycle drivers.

The unique learning style of learners were also addressed. The mobile teachers saw to it that varied and appropriate instructional methods were used. The methods consisted of, but were not limited to instruction that was face-to-face, computer-based, and differentiated. Peer learning and tutorials (home visitation) were likewise provided.

So to say, DedEd, through the ALS took charge in the delivery of quality instruction while the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES provided the wheels and the needed instructional materials.

From Three to Four Wheels. However, the changing time, or the COVID-19 pandemic has deprived classroom experience to all learners, those who have access to it included. Face-to-Face (F2F) instruction is not anymore possible. While this period has made this project more essential and crucial and has underscored the need for the club to strengthen its commitment to work for Basic Education and Literacy, this colossal change prompted the lady Rotarians to modify their plan. Instead of a three-wheeled vehicle used as a learning hub, the club administration has realized that a four-wheeled one would be more appropriate. Instead of assisting the ALS mobile teachers in conducting their classes, which is no longer possible in the current situation, it would ferry and transport the distribution and retrieval of the learning modules through the Knowledge on Wheels-Van Edition.

In time, when Face-to-Face (F2F) instruction would be possible, the Department of Education would once again use the Knowledge on Wheels according to the original purpose that intended it to be, a mobile learning hub. It would once again be visible in the city through a four-wheeled vehicle, an addition to the previous three-wheeled learning cab.

At present, both the Knowledge on Wheels-van and motor cab editions have started roaming the city and serving the teachers and learners through the distribution and retrieval of SLMs and collection of learners' outputs. With this, the Rotarians wish that this project will transform dreams and plans into reality, which would in turn, work for the good of all whether in dangerous times of pandemic or in safe and healthy normal situations.

ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaño, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
