Valedictory Address

July 10, 2021 on the occasion of the 30th Induction and Handover Ceremonies of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES

When I became President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES for the Rotary Year 2020-2021, I nurtured in my heart the dream of a journey where the club goes a notch higher in terms of achieving the Rotary's vision of seeing a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change in our communities and in ourselves. Although Club Secretary PAG Mylene always told me that I should not be pressured, I dreamed of the club and the club members to initiate a number of projects and activities that would benefit and serve a number of people and of projects that would be engaging for all of the Lady Rotarians. I dreamed of having fellowships that will ease out the stress of our daily routines in our respective careers and schedules. Dreams, yes, dreams. I had them in my heart.

But my passion with the idea ended as quickly as it came. It is one great dream, I dare say. My term as president came out to be really challenging. While I pondered on my realizations, I entertained the thought that my term might not be rendered well, or even be prematurely ended because of the threats brought about by this pandemic. There was the fear of contracting the virus, of death and uncertainty. There was a time when the best thing I could do for Rotary was to do nothing at all, no meetings and no activities, except that our Facebook groupchat became our prayer room where we prayed for one another. Our expanded skills in navigating the world of online technology became the most important tool in order to survive in the new normal, allowing us to be a step closer to our goals and to each other.

With the guidance of the Almighty, the support of the club members, the coaching and mentorship of past officers and Presidents, the guidance from Rotary International through District 3860 headed by Transforming Gov. Riz Reyes and his team, and the inspiration from my family and friends, I soon realized that to get the club to perform a notch higher means to be humble enough to learn, to be a cup half-empty, and to be prepared to lead even in unfavorable situations. I soon realized that it is not just about me but more about the other members of the club, about lessons to learn, and about people whose lives could be changed. Indeed, "Rotary opens opportunities".

With these accomplishments, we can excitedly claim that we have made our Rotary family proud!

Because of you, I was inspired to serve. Know that I am better because of you—my beautiful, talented, smart, passionate, focused, innovative, generous, courageous, patient fellow Lady Rotarians which I know our President DANG also embodies.

I am likewise giving my thanks to my St. Thomas More School family for the understanding and support that they had given me. Lastly, to my Rapista and Tan family. I know it in my heart that all of us are gifted with hearts that are willing to share gifts to others. That would be our legacy. That would be our impact.

My fellow Rotarians, our story of inspiration, hope and service continues. The tradition that we have started continues.

DEFINITION OF ROTARY

How do you describe the organization called "Rotary"? There are so many characteristics of a Rotary club as well as the activities of a million Rotarians. There are the features of service, internationality, fellowship, classifications of each vocation, development of goodwill and world understanding, the emphasis of high ethical standards, concern for other people and many more descriptive qualities. In 1976 the Rotary International Board of Directors was interested in creating a concise definition of the fundamental aspects of Rotary. They turned to the three men who were then serving on Rotary's Public Relations Committee and requested that a one-sentence definition of Rotary be prepared. After numerous drafts, the committee presented this definition, which has been used ever since in various Rotary publications: "Rotary is an organization of business and professional persons united worldwide who provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations and help build goodwill and peace in the world." Those 31 words are worth remembering when someone asks, "What is a Rotary club?"

Official Rotary Flag



First flown in Jan 1915 in Kansas City Missouri. Carried to the North Pole by Admiral Byrd (RC Winchester, Virginia) in 1926. Formally adopted by RI in 1929 at RI Convention in Dallas.

THE OFFICIAL ROTARY FLAG

An official flag was formally adopted by Rotary International at the 1929 Convention in Dallas, Texas. The Rotary flag consists of a white field with the official wheel emblem emblazoned in gold in the center of the field. The four depressed spaces on the rim of the Rotary wheel are colored royal blue. The words "Rotary" and "International" printed at the top and bottom depressions on the wheel rim are also gold. The shaft in the hub and the keyway of the wheel are white. The first official Rotary flag reportedly was flown in Kansas City, Missouri, in January 1915. In 1922 a small Rotary flag was carried over the South Pole by Admiral Richard Byrd, a member of the Winchester, Virginia, Rotary Club. Four years later, the admiral carried a Rotary flag in his expedition to the North Pole. Some Rotary clubs use the official Rotary flag as a banner at club meetings. In these instances it is appropriate to print the words "Rotary Club" above the wheel symbol, and the name of the city, state or nation below the emblem. The Rotary flag is always prominently displayed at the World Headquarters as well as at all conventions and official events of Rotary International.







ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaňo, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The names which were submitted to Rotary International on October 30, 1992 are as follows: Nelida Aguillon, Cynthia Catungal, Leonida Decena, Natividad del Rosario, Maria Cleofe Evidente, Corazon Fernandez, Susan Franco, Rebecca Lectura, Flordeliza Magallon, Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Jocelyn Melendres, Ofelia Millan, Anna Geraldine Morante, Nenita Nazareno, Providencia Nuňez, Jocelyn Ong, Evelyn Ross Perdido, Carolina Quirante, Mai Rallos, Agnes Resurreccion, Linda Sicam, Lay Fong Soo-Montero, Arisfina Torre, Conchita Yago, and Amelie Tan-Ramos.

From these charter members: the following were elected as Charter Officers: Rtn. Rebecca Lectura, Pres.; Rtn. Providencia Nuňez, Pres.-Elect; Rtn. Nenita Nazareno, Vice-Pres.; Rtn. Susan Franco, Sec.; Rtn. Jocelyn Melendres, Tres.; Rtn. Linda Sicam, Auditor; Rtn. Conchita Yago, P.R.O.; Rtn. Natividad del Rosario, Sgt-at-Arms; Rtn. Corazon Fernandez, Dir.; Rtn. Agnes Resurreccion, Dir.; Rtn. Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Dir.; and Rtn. Arisfina Torre, Dir.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
