FACT SHEET ON THE PHILIPPINE ROTARY MAGAZINE

Basic facts

1. The Philippine Rotary is the official regional magazine of Rotary International for all Philippine Rotary clubs. Its publishing license was renewed in 2020 for three years until December 2022. It is published monthly.
2. The magazine's publisher and owner starting July 1, 2010 is the Philippine Rotary Magazine Foundation, Inc.
3. The maiden issue of the Philippine Rotary magazine (PRM) came out in 1978. 
4. The PRM is a proud member of the Rotary World Magazine Press which consists of 32 regional magazines serving more than half of the Rotarians worldwide. They are distributed in more than 130 countries, published in 24 languages, and have a combined total circulation of 872,000. Each magazine is unique, with local editorial content. At the same time, the magazines include required articles and photographs of international Rotary interest that they receive from Rotary magazine.
5. Besides articles and features about global and local Rotary activities, projects and events, and up-to-date Rotary information, the magazine contains articles of general interest. This is meant to both inform and inspire readers about what Rotary is and does as well help Rotarians to be knowledgeable about the world around them.
6. The Philippines has 10 Rotary districts, comprising of more than 900 Rotary clubs and with around 25,800 Rotarians. There are 23,000 subscribers to the PRM.
7. The magazine is read by male and female Rotarians who are either professionals in the private and public sectors, entrepreneurs, business executives or company owners. The magazine is also read by Rotarians from other countries or by non-Rotarians, who are either in the PRM mailing list or who are pass-on readers.



Additional information

- Rotary International mandates that every active member of a Rotary club is a paid subscriber to either a regional magazine (Philippine Rotary magazine) or to Rotary magazine (published by Rotary International).
- The penalty for non-subscription, under-subscription or non-payment of subscription is suspension of the Rotary club from Rotary International membership.
- The PRM is managed by the Editorial Board and Management Board composed of volunteer and dedicated Rotarians under the overall supervision of the Board of Trustees of the Philippine Rotary Magazine Foundation, Inc. The Editor-in-chief implements editorial policy while the Chairman of the Management Board oversees its daily operations. Members of the two boards help in the areas of subscription, advertising, circulation, finance and collection. It has five salaried office staff that helps the magazine operations run efficiently and ensure that magazines are delivered on time.

- District Governors' Representatives to the PR (DGRs-PR) from the 10 Rotary Districts help in promoting subscription, collection, solicitation of advertisements and submission of articles.

- The PRMFI Board approved the implementation of the PRM Digital Transformation Project beginning July 1, 2021.
- The PRM is committed to be the magazine of choice, by being the source of Rotary and other relevant information from the Philippines and around the world and by continually improving its value in terms of its format, substance, coverage, delivery and service to its subscribers.

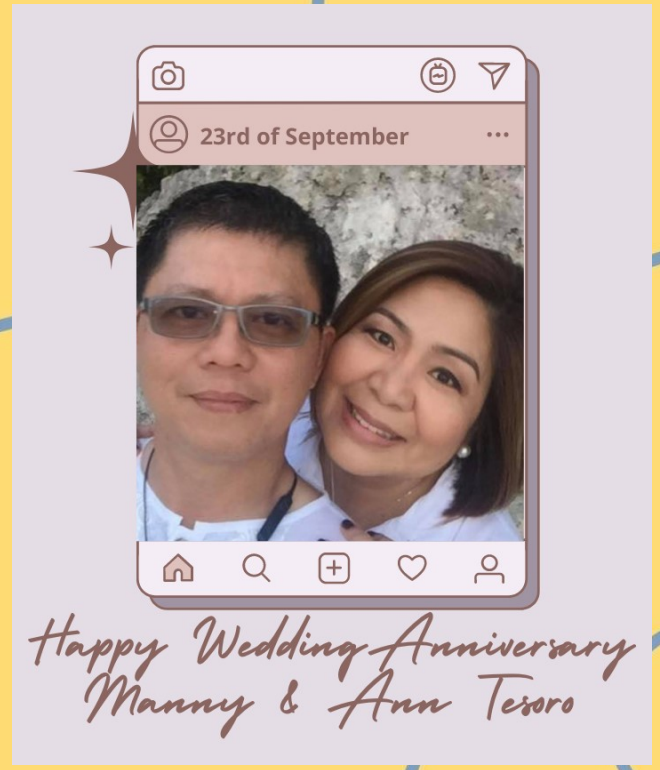

SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

"Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose". This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog - Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - "Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary".

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10, 2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District-funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education - Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

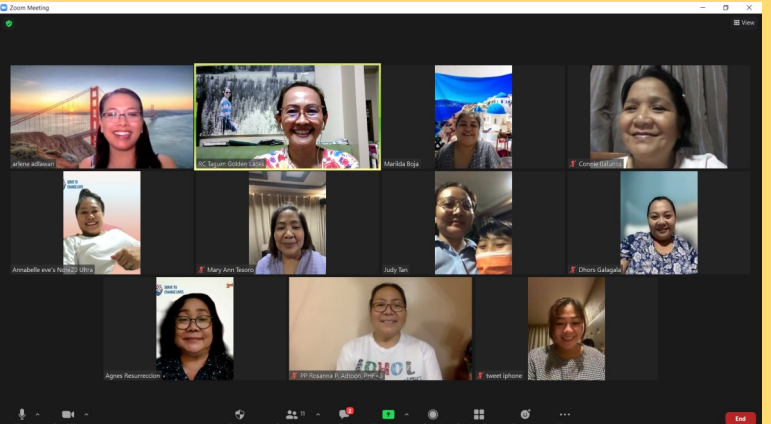

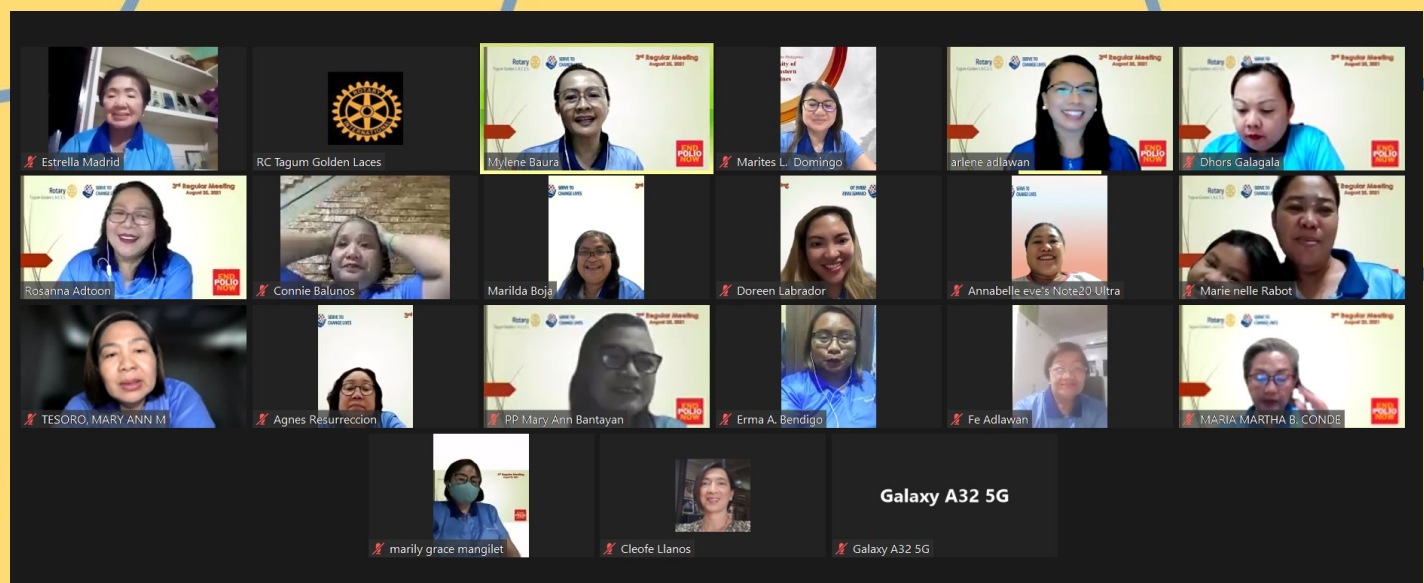
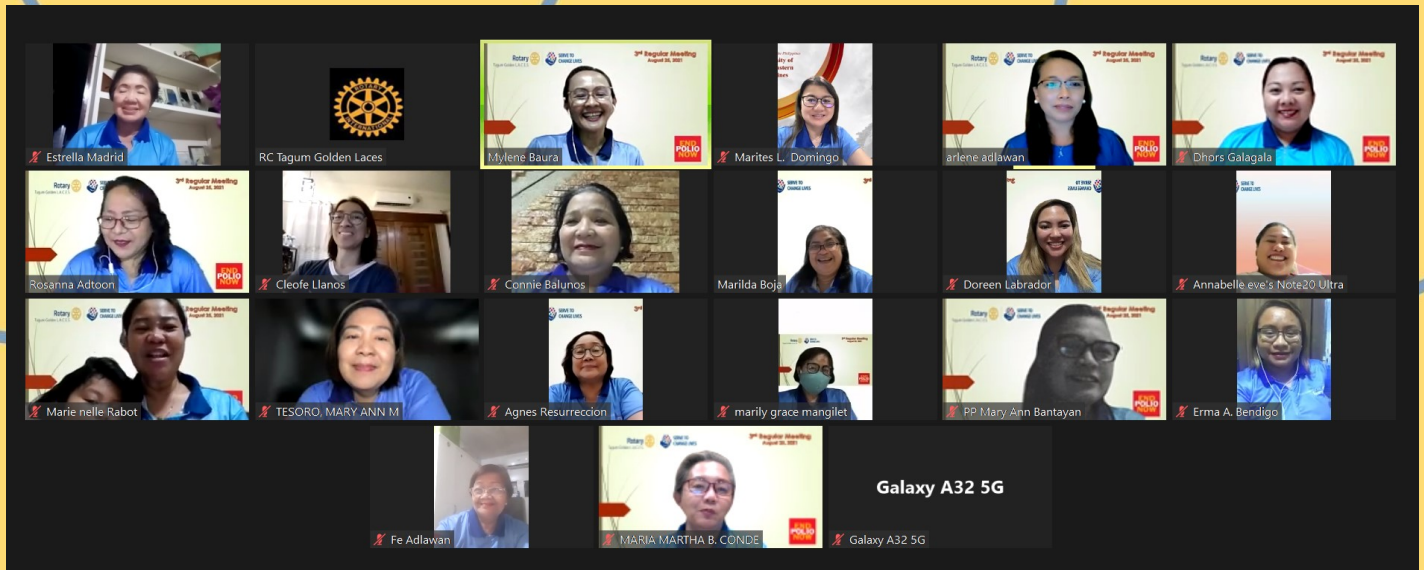

ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaño, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The names which were submitted to Rotary International on October 30, 1992 are as follows: Nelida Aguillon, Cynthia Catungal, Leonida Decena, Natividad del Rosario, Maria Cleofe Evidente, Corazon Fernandez, Susan Franco, Rebecca Lectura, Flordeliza Magallon, Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Jocelyn Melendres, Ofelia Millan, Anna Geraldine Morante, Nenita Nazareno, Providencia Nuñez, Jocelyn Ong, Evelyn Ross Perdido, Carolina Quirante, Mai Rallos, Agnes Resurreccion, Linda Sicam, Lay Fong Soo-Montero, Arisfina Torre, Conchita Yago, and Amelie Tan-Ramos.

From these charter members: the following were elected as Charter Officers: Rtn. Rebecca Lectura, Pres.; Rtn. Providencia Nuñez, Pres.-Elect; Rtn. Nenita Nazareno, Vice-Pres.; Rtn. Susan Franco, Sec.; Rtn. Jocelyn Melendres, Tres.; Rtn. Linda Sicam, Auditor; Rtn. Conchita Yago, P.R.O.; Rtn. Natividad del Rosario, Sgt-at-Arms; Rtn. Corazon Fernandez, Dir.; Rtn. Agnes Resurreccion, Dir.; Rtn. Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Dir.; and Rtn. Arisfina Torre, Dir.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
