Running true to its commitment and relentless support for the total eradication of polio, the Rotary International, inspired by this year's theme; "Delivering on a Promise", pursued the conduct of administering oral polio vaccine to infants in the locality where the Rotary Clubs are serving.

Rotary Clubs of Area 2D, led by Assistant Governor Charles Carpio visited Barangay La Filipina, Tagum City, Davao del Norte to disseminate relevant information on the significant contribution of Rotary to the eventual eradication of polio and to conduct oral polio vaccination.

"Herd Immunity and Vaccination"

The public health care sector is on its knees because of the CoVid-19 pandemic. Government's responses to curb the spread of the disease such as prolonged period of lockdowns and quarantine merely delayed the surge. In the meantime, the people have experienced the spillover effect of the government regulations into the economy translated to employment, business, and investment losses.

Only by attaining herd immunity that the nation would be able to bounce back to the time before this acute liquidity crisis and mass market failures.

Herd immunity is a state of affairs whereby the self-sustaining transmission of disease is halted and the disease is eliminated.

Mass vaccination is indeed a highly contentious issue. The anti-vaxxers have invoked various reasons to support their position against the vaccination. Objections would range from violation of their constitutional right to life, religious freedom, and right to privacy. Detractors of the vaccination program would assert that their lives would be endangered on the basis of unfounded beliefs e.g. the vaccines can alter one's DNA, vaccines use live coronavirus, among others.

The success of the Rotary in reducing polio cases by 99.9% since the first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979 would support the century regard to the efficacy of vaccination. Vaccination works.

It is said that those who refuse to get vaccinated are guilty of participating in the collective imposition of unjust harm or risk of harm. To get vaccinated is considered every citizen's share to the labors and sacrifices incurred for defending the society or its members from injury and molestation. #

"DELIVERING ON A PROMISE"

"Vaccines work – the fact that we are close to ending polio is proof of this. However, we are not yet there and we must fulfill our promise to children to make the world polio-free. We still need to intensify our campaign to raise awareness and raise funds for polio. By doing these together, we can END POLIO NOW," said Ms Mary Anne Alcordo Solomon, Rotary International Zone 10A (Philippines) End Polio Now Coordinator.

Polio is a crippling and potentially fatal infectious disease. There is no cure, but there are safe and effective vaccines. The vaccine almost always protects a child for life. Children under the age of five are most vulnerable to contracting polio.

In the Philippines, children under one year old receive their primary doses of the polio vaccines during routine immunization. In 2020, many Filipino children missed out on oral polio drops for routine immunization due to challenges in accessing health services during the pandemic. On 13 October 2021, DOH launched the catch-up immunization campaign which aims to reach children under two years old with missed vaccine doses, including those for polio.

We, at Area 2D, served for WORLD POLIO DAY by administering oral polio vaccines to children at the La Filipina gym, Tagum City. Rotarians deliver their promise to HELP END POLIO NOW.

The Rotary Club of Tagum Golden Laces (RCTGL) is blessed to have two of the remaining charter members - PP Agnes Resurreccion and PP Marilyn Grace Mangilet, who are both medical doctors. They are simply not contented with having a profession that saves lives and alleviates people's suffering. They have reached beyond themselves in the service of others.

Since 1992, when RCTGL was admitted as a member to the Rotary International, PP Agnes and PP Marilyn have offered their lives in service of the club and of the RCTGL's various community partners.

While membership to RCTGL is only by way of invitation, PP Agnes and PP Marilyn made a conscious decision to pursue their charter membership. As history would tell us, out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. Only because of their strong sense of commitment that PP Agnes and PP Marilyn became a part of RCTGL's determined 25 charter members. And of the 25 charter members, they are the only ones who have carried on as active members of the club to this date.

Juggling work, family, and the RCTGL advocacies, these two superwomen had led the club to reaching new heights during their respective term as Club's President. These women have been nothing but generous with their time, talent, services, and resources to the community, to the club, to the advocacies of the club, and the club members.



PP Agnes took the challenge in commanding the organization in the Rotary Year 1998-1999 with the theme "Show Rotary Cares". Her legacy as President includes forging friendship and alliance between RCTGL with RC Noda Central through the signing of a Sister Club Agreement. The same bond between clubs endures and stays true to this day. PP Agnes' tenure is best remembered by the club sponsoring the Hot Lunch Plus at Magugpo Pilot Elementary School.

In the words of President Marilda "Dang" Boja, PP Agnes is an icon of commitment. PP Maritess Domingo, who is PP Agnes' colleague in the medical profession, sees PP Agnes as a true blooded rotarian imbued with the values of compassion, integrity and service for others. PP Annabelle Eve Sator reminisces with gratitude PP Agnes' mini bar contribution when she was inducted as club President for the Rotary Year 2019-2020.



Eternal Doctors, Lives Beyond Selves

As an obstetrician, PP Agnes extended her services to the club members who have come to love her and trust her as a true sister. Among her patients was PP Rosanna "Sanang" P. Adtoon who entrusted her pregnancy and her life to PP Agnes as PP Agnes helped PP Sanang deliver her eldest child.

PP Marilyn, on the other hand, soared high with RCTGL during the Rotary Year 2005-2006 with the theme "Service Above Self". As a pediatrician by profession, her passion to help children is seen through her notable projects during her presidency. The club provided instruments in the construction of the Gawad Kalinga Sibol Learning Center in Nanyo, Panabo City. Under her guidance, RCTGL launched Project C.H.E.E.R.S with the addition of fortified milk and power flour to intensify the battle against hunger. It was also during PP Marilyn's presidency that the "Livelihood on Wheels" was started to cater the carefully selected differently-abled itinerant and indigent vendors in Tagum City.

One could say that PP Marilyn's youthful looks reflect her inner disposition. Her long-time-friend, colleague, and fellow rotarian PAG Cleofe "Pinky" Llanos describes PP Marilyn as fair, diplomatic, frank and upright. For PP Estrella Madrid, PP Marilyn is inspiringly patient akin to punctiliousness in everything she undertakes to do and in honoring her commitment to people she cares about *i.e.* her patients, her family, the club and the club's partners. PP Marilyn's taking on the responsibility of taking real good care of her aging parents resonates with PAG Rae Kara "Tweet" Malbog who is a parent herself. PP Marilyn is also remembered by her sisters in the club for her generous contribution to replenish the club funds during the presidency of PAG Arlene J. Adlawan.

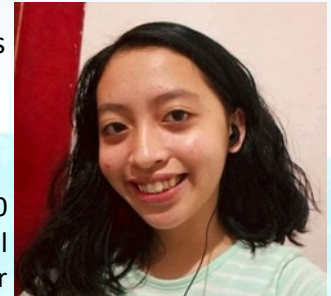

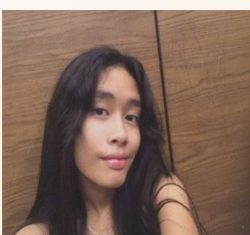


I definitely enjoyed this event. Here is what I think of the 8th RYLA bootcamp 2021.

SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

"Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose". This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LAC-ES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog – Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - "Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary".

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10, 2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District-funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education – Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

An active, dynamic and nurturing Rotary club meets a group of volunteers, a generous Rotarian patron, a project granted right after the satellite's creation. indeed, it was the hand of destiny.

ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN LACES HISTORY

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaño, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The names which were submitted to Rotary International on October 30, 1992 are as follows: Nelida Aguillon, Cynthia Catungal, Leonida Decena, Natividad del Rosario, Maria Cleofe Evidente, Corazon Fernandez, Susan Franco, Rebecca Lectura, Flordeliza Magallon, Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Jocelyn Melendres, Ofelia Millan, Anna Geraldine Morante, Nenita Nazareno, Providencia Nuñez, Jocelyn Ong, Evelyn Ross Perdido, Carolina Quirante, Mai Rallos, Agnes Resurreccion, Linda Sicam, Lay Fong Soo-Montero, Arisfina Torre, Conchita Yago, and Amelie Tan-Ramos.

Susan Franco, Sec.; Rtn. Jocelyn Melendres, Tres.; Rtn. Linda Sicam, Auditor; Rtn. Conchita Yago, P.R.O.; Rtn. Natividad del Rosario, Sgt-at-Arms; Rtn. Corazon Fernandez, Dir.; Rtn. Agnes Resurreccion, Dir.; Rtn. Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Dir.; and Rtn. Arisfina Torre, Dir.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.

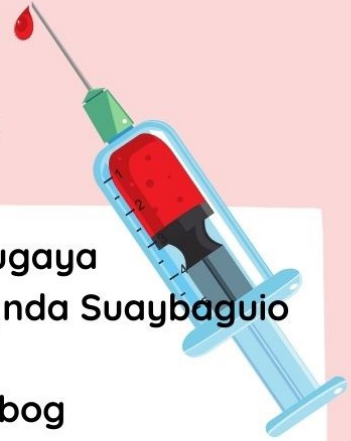
The Object of Rotary
