

THE ORIGINS OF PAUL HARRIS FELLOW RECOGNITION

The Paul Harris Fellow recognition acknowledges individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary established the recognition in 1957 to encourage and show appreciation



for substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation's only program, Rotary Foundation Fellowships for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Scholarships.

The first Paul Harris Fellows included past RI Director Allison G. Brush, who

served during the 1937-38 Rotary year, and longtime RI Treasurer Rufus F. Chapin, both for donations made in 1946. Mrs. Adan Vargas was the first woman to receive the recognition, for a gift made in 1953. Mrs. Harry L. Jones was the second, and one of only five people recognized for contributions actually made in that inaugural year.

Early Paul Harris Fellows received a certificate of recognition. In 1969, the Foundation unveiled the first Paul Harris Fellow medallion at the Rotary Convention in Honolulu, Hawaii, USA. Japanese metal artist Fiju Tsuda created the piece under the direction of former Foundation Trustee Kyozo Yuasa. Today, Paul Harris Fellows receive a certificate and pin. They are also eligible to buy a Paul Harris Fellow medallion.

Rotarians have a tradition of supporting the Foundation by honoring others. Ida LeTulle Taylor became a Paul Harris Fellow in 1978 when her husband, Vann Taylor, who was serving as a district governor, made a donation in her name in honor of their 34th wedding anniversary. The gift also made her the 25,000th Paul Harris Fellow.

At the International Assembly in 1979, incoming RI President James Bomar challenged each Rotary club to make one non-Rotarian a Paul Harris Fellow. The Rotary Club of Pikesville, Maryland, USA, responded by making a donation in the name of Mother Teresa in 1980. The entertainer Pearl Bailey also became a Paul Harris Fellow through a joint effort of the Rotary clubs in Cape Cod, Massachusetts.

Many other notable figures have been named Paul Harris Fellows, including U.S. President Jimmy Carter, Russian President Boris Yeltsin, U.S. astronaut James Lovell, UN Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar, and polio vaccine developer Jonas Salk.

SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

"Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose". This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LAC-ES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog – Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - "Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary".

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10,2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District- funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education – Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

An active, dynamic and nurturing Rotary club meets a group of volunteers, a generous Rotarian patron, a project granted right after the satellite's creation. indeed, it was the hand of destiny.

THE DISTRICT ASSEMBLY

In view of the annual turnover of Rotary leadership each year, special effort is required to provide the 27,000 club leaders with appropriate instruction for the tasks they will assume. The annual district assembly is the major leadership training event in each Rotary district of the world.

The district assembly offers motivation, inspiration, Rotary information and new ideas for club officers, directors and key committee chairmen of each club. Some of the most experienced district leaders conduct informative discussions on all phases of Rotary administration and service projects. The assembly gives all participants valuable new ideas to make their club more effective and interesting. Usually eight to ten delegates from each club are invited to attend the training session.

Another important feature of a district assembly is a review by the incoming district governor of the program theme and emphasis of the new RI president for the

coming year. District goals and objects are also described and plans are developed for their implementation.

The success of each Rotary club is frequently determined by the club's full representation and participation in the annual district assembly.











THE DISTRICT CONFERENCE

Most Rotarians have never attended a Rotary district conference. They have not experienced one of the most enjoyable and rewarding privileges of Rotary membership.

A district conference is for all club members and their spouses, not just for club officers and committee members. The purpose of a district conference is for fellowship, good fun, inspirational speakers and discussion of matters which make one's Rotary membership more meaningful. Every person who attends a district conference finds that being a Rotarian becomes even more rewarding because of the

new experiences, insights and acquaintances developed at the conference. Those who attend a conference enjoy going back, year after year.

Every one of Rotary's more than 500 districts has a conference annually. These meetings are considered so important that the Rotary International president selects a knowledgeable Rotarian as his personal representative to attend and address each

conference. The program always includes several outstanding entertainment features, interesting discussions and inspirational programs.

One of the unexpected benefits of attending a district conference is the opportunity to become better acquainted with members of one's own club in an informal setting. Lasting friendships grow from the fellowship hours at the district conference.











How it all started

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaňo, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
