

# SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

"Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose". This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog – Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - "Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary".

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10,2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District- funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education – Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

An active, dynamic and nurturing Rotary club meets a group of volunteers, a generous Rotarian patron, a project granted right after the satellite's creation. indeed, it was the hand of destiny.

# October 2022

In August, I was proud to visit Pakistan and high-light Rotary's top goal, eradicating polio. It was al-so a tremendous opportunity to spotlight female health workers who are playing a critical role in protecting children from this vaccine-preventable disease.

This month, as we celebrate World Polio Day, we are shining a spotlight on our more than 30-year effort to lead the first

global polio eradication cam-paign and our success in forming partnerships ca-pable of completing this massive goal. We all know that this is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and that we've reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent worldwide.

Pakistan is one of only two countries in the world where wild poliovirus remains en-demic. (The other is neighboring Afghanistan.) I was able to witness and take part in vaccination campaigns in Pakistan, and soon after I left, a monumental nationwide immunization campaign took place, focused on 43 million children under the age of 5. I saw the incredible work of Rotary members on the ground. More than 60 percent of vaccinators in Pakistan are women, and they are doing a remarkable job building trust and convincing mothers to vaccinate their children.

Seeing it all firsthand, I know that the will exists across the Rotary world to end polio, and I'm confident that we have the strategy. The Pakistani media has been very sup-portive of our efforts as well, and this is making a difference. This month, a new glob-al pledging moment at the World Health Summit in Berlin promises to pull together more resources to fund these time-sensitive eradication efforts. Now it is up to us to do our part and raise \$50 million this year to earn the full 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

There's great cause for optimism on the polio front — but also some staggering new events that have further raised the stakes. Over the past few months, new polio out-breaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and, most recently, in the New York City area. These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear — vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most at-risk people have kept their vaccinations up to date.

Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. What I saw in Pakistan convinced me that we can and must fin-ish the job, but it will only happen if we remain committed to a strategy that's work-ing and back it with all necessary resources.

Through our commitment, generosity, and sheer determination, we will #EndPolio.

# How it all started...

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaňo, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.



The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.


