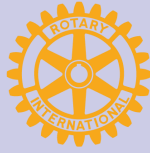


Kapihan sa Dav Nor invited LACES to talk on volunteerism via PTV channel last February 15, 2023.

SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

“Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose”. This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog – Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - “Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary”.

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10, 2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District-funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education – Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

An active, dynamic and nurturing Rotary club meets a group of volunteers, a generous Rotarian patron, a project granted right after the satellite’s creation. indeed, it was the hand of destiny.

Dhors highlighted the revolutionary knowledge on wheels, PP Ann relayed the long-standing support given by RCTGL to the Sibol learning center, and PE Erms on the life-changing impression of the computer literacy for students with exceptionalities.

Basic education and literacy are accordingly the cornerstone of development. The programs that promote basic education and literacy would pave the way for their beneficiaries to attain better lives as opportunities are created. They help attain safer, healthy, and stable communities for our children and our children’s children. #

Last February 15, 2023, We guested at PTV 48 - Kapehan sa Davnor to talk about the literacy and education programs of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. and the spirit of volunteerism that made all our flagship and legacy projects prosper through the years.

I, together with President-Elect Erma Bendigo, and Past President Anabelle Eve Sator discussed how crucial it is for us to provide or assist in the attainment of basic education and literacy in our communities. With it being one of the Areas of Focus of Rotary, we believe that it is an important component in building a stronger and more equitable community.

We shared during the program that our volunteerism in basic education and literacy has taken many forms through the years. Starting with our legacy project, the St. Martin de Porres Sibol Learning Center which started as a commemorative project between the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. and Rotary Club of Noda Central way back in 2008 to help with the educational needs of Kindergarten pupils of Gawad Kalinga. Through the years, this program expanded as the community grew to RTU Grand Village. From a learning center for Kindergartens, it now caters to the education of up to Grade 2 learners.

We also talked about our Knowledge on Wheels which started as an aid to DepEd Tagum's ALS (Alternative Learning System) program. We explained that the program started as a way to provide an opportunity for our pedicab drivers who wish to continue their education without sacrificing their livelihood. From a simple Piaggio vehicle, we now have an L300 van that was and still is a huge help, especially during the pandemic. Even with the challenges that COVID has caused, we rose above and innovated in our project to cater to the immediate need of transporting educational materials within Davao del Norte and Davao de Oro. We hope that in the coming years, we will procure or receive additional vehicles to benefit more communities.

Lastly, we shared on, our computer literacy program for the differently abled students of the Tagum City National High School. Through it, we financed the teachers and instructors of the students to ensure that their education is tailored to their specific needs. We aim to not just provide education but to also guarantee that what we deliver is quality education.

All of these and many more have been made possible through volunteerism and camaraderie of all the members in attaining a unified goal of providing the fundamental right to education. We are thankful that through our partnerships with our sister club in Chiba Japan, the Rotary Club of Noda Central, as well as the help of our public partners in the government and private partnerships with likes of Tagum Cooperative and the support of the community we were able to sustain and grow our projects.

The club has always believed in going above and beyond when it comes to service. With that, We will continue on our work to raise funds for literacy programs and advocate for policies that support access to education for all, and take any opportunity such as the Kapehan sa DavNor to raise awareness on how any of us can make a lasting impact to our community through service.

I challenge all of us to continue our work of being instruments in breaking the cycle of poverty by offering our time, skills, and resources. Let our work break down barriers through education and opening up opportunities for our communities.

Let our passion for service be fueled by the joy and light that our work has brought to the communities and the results we see as they grow and improve with us. Our service to others especially those who have less is not easy but always remember that even in the smallest of ways we can always help make a difference.

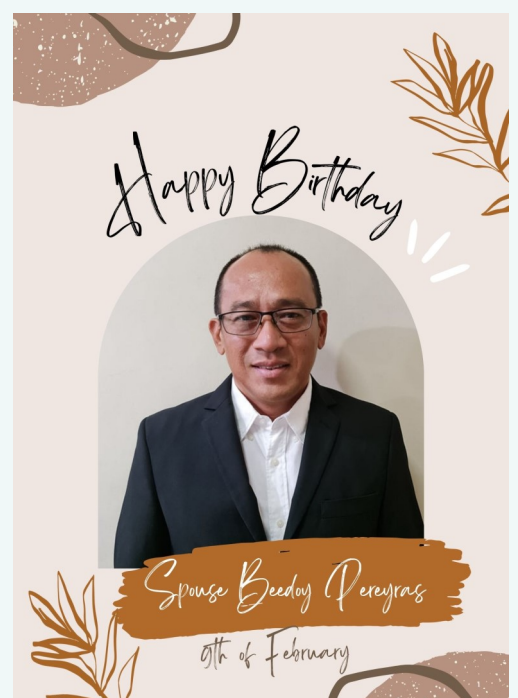

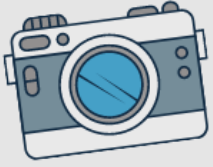

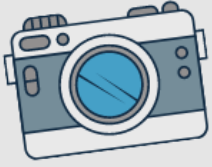

Recently, I spent time in the Nakivale refugee settlement in Uganda. As the "settlement" in its name suggests, the people living there are free to move around and integrate as best they can — one thing that makes the place unique.

I had a chance to play soccer with boys and girls from about a dozen nations and talk with women who had fled areas of conflict. It was a tapestry of human experience shared through both laughter and tears.

As I walked across a school campus at the settlement with a teacher, she shared with me the dire statistics on girls' education. Most don't get through grade school. Many are sold into child marriage to pay for food for their families. As I looked around at these young girls, I was gutted.

Our work with empowering girls and women is much more than creating equity — sometimes, it's about health or education. Other times it's about providing safety. Regardless of the path, it's always about basic human rights.

We can do more to empower girls and women, and we can expand how we share the progress Rotary members and our partners have made toward this goal.

There is no shortage of inspiring examples of our work, from interest-free microcredit loans for women in Nigeria, to projects in India that provide girls menstrual hygiene products. Hundreds of projects are taking place across all Rotary areas of focus and are making a meaningful and often lifesaving difference.

Together, we can address the needs and inequities that girls throughout the world face daily. But we must also monitor the impact of these projects and create awareness of Rotary resources and subject matter experts, including Rotary Action Groups, The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, Rotary Peace Fellows, and others.

It is especially important that we tell the stories of our initiatives that have a positive impact on the lives of women and girls. This last point is near and dear to my heart. This means sharing our stories on social media, through local news outlets, in this magazine, and wherever we can inspire others.

As you do so, it's important to provide information that helps our Rotary family connect with others who are implementing activities in their regions, as well as across the world. Let's share our successes and learn from one another — then proudly tell our stories to a larger audience.

These are exciting times in Rotary, and the world is taking notice. As we work to empower women and girls to step into their full potential, we create new pathways for membership growth and greater collaboration with partners to create positive, lasting change. Thank you for your continued action in this vital effort.

How it all started...

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaño, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

Out of the original forty (40) ladies who were invited to organizational meetings, only 25 were finally submitted for charter membership of the new club. The names which were submitted to Rotary International on October 30, 1992 are as follows: Nelida Aguillon, Cynthia Catungal, Leonida Decena, Natividad del Rosario, Maria Cleofe Evidente, Corazon Fernandez, Susan Franco, Rebecca Lectura, Flor-deliza Magallon, Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Jocelyn Melendres, Ofelia Millan, Anna Geraldine Morante, Nenita Nazareno, Providencia Nuñez, Jocelyn Ong, Evelyn Ross Perdido, Carolina Quirante, Mai Rallos, Agnes Resurreccion, Linda Sicam, Lay Fong Soo-Montero, Arisfina Torre, Conchita Yago, and Amelie Tan-Ramos.

From these charter members: the following were elected as Charter Officers: Rtn. Rebecca Lectura, Pres.; Rtn. Providencia Nuñez, Pres.-Elect; Rtn. Nenita Nazareno, Vice-Pres.; Rtn. Susan Franco, Sec.; Rtn. Jocelyn Melendres, Tres.; Rtn. Linda Sicam, Auditor; Rtn. Conchita Yago, P.R.O.; Rtn. Natividad del Rosario, Sgt-at-Arms; Rtn. Corazon Fernandez, Dir.; Rtn. Agnes Resurreccion, Dir.; Rtn. Marilyn Grace Mangilet, Dir.; and Rtn. Arisfina Torre, Dir.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.
