



More than 1,000 of you have responded so far to an ongoing survey by the Rotary Action Group on Mental Health Initiatives, offering your feedback on what Rotary can do to improve the personal well-being of members.

The top suggestions are illuminating. Rotary members are asking for more fellowship, camaraderie, conversation, cohe-

siveness, and connection. They also want more recognition, validation, and integration. They are seeking more service opportunities, and they want more wellness activities, including mental health speakers, awareness efforts, and education.

Our members not only appreciate the greater focus on mental health, but they also believe that making more of the Rotary experience will materially improve their lives. I find it interesting that members are not asking anything dramatically new of their club—rather they want more of what we do best. Public health experts worldwide are concerned about increasing levels of loneliness — the U.S. surgeon general has even declared it an epidemic. Mental health experts agree that finding groups and clubs around common hobbies and interests is a strong way to create greater connectedness. This is what Rotary is all about. We need to make sure all of our members are fully engaged and that our communities are better aware of this inherent strength.

Second, if your club has found new ways to build connection, please share your stories with us at mindhealth@rotary.org so we can make them more broadly known within the Rotary world. Your good ideas might inspire others. Post your service project stories on Rotary Showcase.

And finally, I encourage you to share feedback from surveys like this with your club and bring forward your own ideas to improve your club experience and meet your peers' expectations. The journey we have begun is about more than mental health. It is about taking advantage of the full strength of our wonderful organization and helping all members feel that they are part of a community that cares deeply about their personal well-being.

Everything you do to strengthen connections in Rotary, with each other and the people we serve, also helps improve mental health. And everything we do to improve mental health helps strengthen those connections. Let's continue this virtuous cycle.







In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaňo, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.



The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. Ledesma, Incumbent District Governor for 1991-1992, at Molave Hotel on Sept. 4, 1992 in his club visitation of the Rotary Clubs in Tagum.

On December 1, 1992, the club received the good news from SEABO that its application for membership was formally admitted by Rotary International on November 19, 1992 with Club No. 29117.











SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

"Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose". This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog – Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - "Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary".

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10,2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District- funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education – Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

An active, dynamic and nurturing Rotary club meets a group of volunteers, a generous Rotarian patron, a project granted right after the satellite's creation. indeed, it was the hand of destiny.
