There are many pathways to peace, and in Rotary, we are fortunate to have Rotary Peace Fellows who demonstrate this truth time and again.

Each year, Rotary awards up to 130 fellowships for leaders around the world to study peace and development, and what these peace fellows learn prepares them to work in conflict prevention and resolution and promote Positive Peace. Here are a few examples of the creative ways peace fellows advance peace:

Promoting sustainability

Alejandra Rueda-Zarate combined her Rotary Peace Fellowship in peace and conflict resolution with her master's degree in energy and resources to support her dream of protecting the Colombian countryside.

She founded the organization NES Naturaleza in 2011 to help farmers in Colombia and across rural Latin America gain access to knowledge and training to uphold sustainable farming standards. That support has improved the lives of nearly 4,500 farmers, inspiring many of them to become entrepreneurs. And it's helped promote both natural and social sustainability throughout Latin America.

Ending racism

Peace fellows Geoffrey Diesel and Kathy Doherty have applied their fellowships in peace and development studies toward co-founding the Racial Equity Project, a subcommittee of Rotary Positive Peace Activators in North America committed to studying ways to create a more peaceful society through anti-racism efforts.

The Racial Equity Project takes a deep look into how the eight Pillars of Positive Peace could support efforts to address racism, and it works to spread this message to communities across North America. The organization initially grew from Rotary's strategic partnership with the Institute for Economics and Peace, a global think tank dedicated to promoting Positive Peace.

Managing disasters using data

Through a Rotary Peace Fellowship, Jamie LeSueur earned a master's degree in social science within peace and conflict research. He now leads emergency operations for the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies, setting a management and operational framework for agency collaboration in emergency response situations.

Jamie has found that research data is a powerful tool to bring calm to the complex world of disaster response. No matter what an organization's protocols might entail, letting research be the foundation for decision making helps clarify even the most complicated emergencies.

These stories — and hundreds like them — show how Rotary is creating a generation of leaders ready and able to build peace worldwide. Nearly 1,800 peace fellows have graduated from Rotary Peace Centers, and they are applying their craft in more than 140 countries.

May the continuing work of peace fellows and the Rotary members who support them inspire you to continue to Create Hope in the World through service, fundraising, and creative thinking.



It was an honor to attend the 40th anniversary celebrations of RC Tanauan in Batangas. This event not only commemorated four decades of incredible community service and contributions but also brought together various stakeholders committed to social improvement and collaboration.

Their attendance underscored our commitment to building stronger community ties and our dedication to contributing to meaningful causes.

As we move forward, let's carry the momentum from last week into our future endeavors. The insights gained from the anniversary event, coupled with our ongoing projects, position us well to make a significant impact.

Embracing Choices:

A Story of Women and Self-Expression

At the heart of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden Laces (RCTGL) beats a dedication to inclusivity and respect for individuality. The goal of the club has been to create a community where every woman felt valued, respected, and empowered to make choices that resonate with her true essence.

On a poignant evening, during the club's 17th Regular Meeting on March 06, 2024, this commitment was brought to life. Dr. Jean Somera-Avenido, a respected member of the Phil Academy of Aesthetic and Age Management Medicine, Inc. (PAAAMMI) and the Aesthetic Medicine Institute (AMI), was invited to share her insights on cosmetic surgery and beauty enhancements. It was a fitting occasion, coinciding the celebration of Women's Month.

Dr. Avenido, known not only for her expertise in aesthetic medicine but also for her advocacy of self-love and empowerment, took the center stage with a gentle smile. Her presentation, titled "Love Yourself", was a timely reminder of the importance of self-care and acceptance. She spoke passionately, urging the women in attendance to embrace their uniqueness and celebrate their individuality.

As her words washed over the audience, a sense of resonance filled the room. Dr. Avenido's discussion on cosmetic surgery, often marred by societal stigma, struck a chord with many. In the aftermath of the presentation, the atmosphere crackled with energy as club members engaged in heartfelt discussions about beauty, self-love, and the power of choice. Despite differing perspectives, there was an overarching spirit of respect and understanding for each woman's journey.

In the end, the evening was not about conforming to external standards of beauty, but about embracing one's authenticity and celebrating the rich tapestry of womanhood. In that shared moment of vulnerability and connection, each woman felt a renewed sense of confidence, empowerment, and beauty in her own unique way. And as we parted ways, we carried with us the profound realization that true beauty lies not in perfection, but in the courage to be unapologetically ourselves.

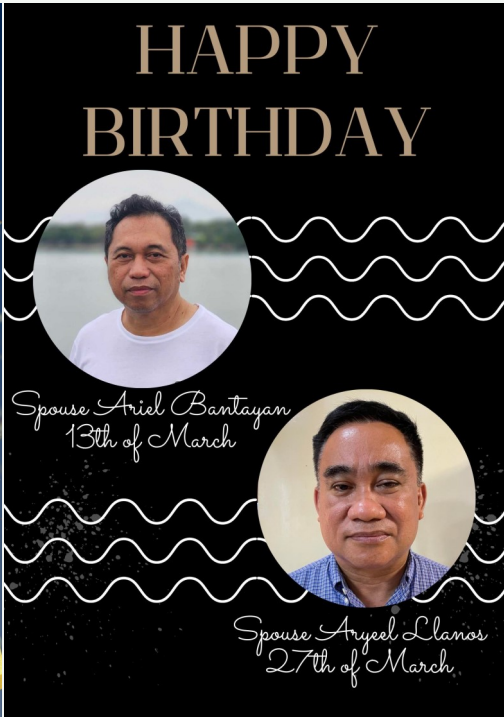

The idea of organizing an all-female Rotary Club of Tagum was thought of as early as 1989 by the Rotarian and Anns of RC Tagum North. The initial organizing of the club however started only sometime in the first week of February 1991.

The names of 28 selected ladies were first floated by the Rotarians & Anns of RC Tagum North. Out of this number, 16 responded by attending the first organizational meeting held at Magnolia Kiosk along Quezon St., Tagum. Other ladies were later invited to the regular weekly meetings as prospective members of the club although their attendance along with some of those who were initially invited were irregular. In this organizational meetings, Rotary Information was given by Rtn. Jess Albacite, Special Governor's Representative and PP of RC Tagum North, Rtn. Rey Vegara, Incumbent President RC Tagum North, Rtn. Bebot Madayag, District Governor's Representative & PP of RC Tagum. Other Rotarians who helped in giving various information included Rtn. Arrel Olaño, PP RC Tagum; Rtn. Danny Lee, Past DGR and PP of RC Tagum North; Rtn. Jun Cagas and Rtn. Raffy Erfe, both RC Tagum North.

The club officers & members of the newly organized ROTARY CLUB OF TAGUM GOLDEN L.A.C.E.S. (Ladies in Action Committed to Effective Service) first met DG Xavier C. SATELLITE CLUB HISTORY

“Destiny is the push of our instincts to the pull of our purpose”. This quote from an American bishop and author aptly describes the creation of the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden LACES Compostela.

It all started when Judy Marie Rapista- Tan, at that time the incumbent President of the Rotary Club of Tagum Golden LACES, mentioned in passing to her cousin Joji Bernadette Ancog – Casidsid that her club was planning to go to a neighboring town of Compostela, Davao de Oro to help revive an ailing Rotary club. Ancog-Casidsid then broached the idea of organizing a satellite club in Compostela instead, herself being a member of an informal group of men and women in Compostela engaged in outreach programs and civic works. Propelled by the desire to serve, this group of volunteers would gather their resources, solicit from generous townmates from in and out of the country to help out communities in remote barangays, particularly when Typhoon Pablo devastated the area. It has always been a dream for these volunteers to give a more effective and sustainable service to the community.

RCTGL set the ball rolling when it conducted an orientation to potential members on April 30, 2021 at Legacy College of Compostela. Thereafter, ten members were recruited to form the Rotary Satellite Club of Tagum Golden L.A.C.E.S. Compostela with Joji Bernadette Ancog-Casidsid as Chairperson and Corazon Nerves as Secretary.

On May 12, 2021, during the 18th Regular Meeting, the Satellite Club was introduced to the members of RTCGL and its sister club Rotary Club of Loyola Heights. Again, as fate would have it, present during the meeting was Past President Nilo Rapista, an active member of Rotary Club of Loyola Heights and himself a native of Compostela. Elated by the news that a Rotary satellite club was finally formed in his hometown, which was dream come true for him, PP Nilo Rapista pledged financial support to the fledgling satellite club by shouldering its first annual dues. In his message to the satellite club members, he emphasized the value of service and the advantages of being a Rotarian - “Fall in love with service, fall in love with Rotary”.

On May 26, 2021, the satellite club was officially recognized by the Rotary International and on July 10, 2021, the Satellite Club Members were inducted during the RCTGL 30th Hand-over Ceremony and 1st Induction of Satellite Club Members.

Not long after, the Satellite Club had its first project and contribution not only to Compostela but to the whole Davao de Oro province through the District-funded Knowledge on Wheels project. One unit of the Knowledge on Wheels Motorcycle edition was turned over last August 10, 2021 to the Department of Education – Davao de Oro Division for the benefit of its 13,000 Alternative Learning System (ALS) learners.

An active, dynamic and nurturing Rotary club meets a group of volunteers, a generous Rotarian patron, a project granted right after the satellite’s creation. indeed, it was the hand of destiny.

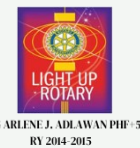
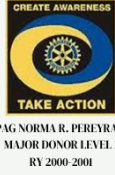
