# EDITORIAL



Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever. As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Rotary launched PolioPlus in 1985 and was a founding member of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988. Through decades of commitment and work by Rotary and our partners, more than 2.5 billion children have received the oral polio vaccine.

Polio does still exist, although polio cases have decreased by over 99% since 1988, from an estimated more than 350 000 cases to 22 reported cases in 2017. This reduction is the result of the global effort to eradicate the disease. ... There is no cure for polio, it can only be prevented.

Today 'pulse polio' is a well-known phrase. But many of us don't know what the 'Plus' is, in PolioPlus. The Plus indicates an addition to Polio immunization. To understand it, let us go back in history and see how Rotary got involved in major health projects.

We all know Rotary's tremendous power to transform our communities and ourselves. However, in every community, people have been left out, and we have not made a strong enough effort to reach them.

The RI Board of Directors is taking action to make Rotary more welcoming and diverse. We formed a task force to promote diversity, equity, and inclusion to help clubs attract new members regardless of gender, race, religion, age, or other factors. This will help us speed up the change we all want and need. The selection of Jennifer E. Jones as Rotary president for 2022-23 — the first woman to lead our organization — is another step in this direction.

At the grassroots level, clubs drive inclusion and diversity. Alia Ali — who serves on the board of directors at the Big West Rotaract Multidistrict Information Organization and is a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards alumna and past president of the Rotaract Club of Surrey-Newton, British Columbia — offers her perspective.

I still remember the relief I felt as a RYLA participant four years ago. I had finally found my people: people who cared as much as I did. All over the world, Rotary has the same heart. We serve our communities and take action where others feel paralyzed by the size and scope of a problem.

Let's continue that spirit, especially when the conversation is difficult. Racism, prejudice, and discrimination take on different forms but exist in every country, in every city, and in every person. How do we root it out?

As a diversity, equity, and inclusion consultant, I help organizations create a culture that empowers and attracts everyone using the power of empathy. When we feel with others as if they were ourselves, we cannot hold prejudice in our hearts. When every child reminds you of your own child, when every woman or man reminds you of your mother or brother, you start seeing the world differently.

We can apply The Four-Way Test through the lens of empathy. Are we building goodwill and friendship with everyone in our area, including women? Are things fair and beneficial to people of all ages? Who has to make choices that you don't have to make?

I made a heartbreaking choice between Rotary and my religion when a Rotary convention was held during Ramadan. I wondered: When we ask if this is fair and beneficial to all concerned, did that not include me as a Muslim? Would the convention ever be held over Easter? Only by asking difficult questions can we begin the work of creating a more inclusive and diverse Rotary.

We already connect so many people across the world. Imagine the possibilities when we bring even more people along for the ride. That's the future of Rotary I want to see: one where we are unstoppable in our service, relentless in our kindness, and intentional in the change we want to see.

Rotary has a big enough heart. If we open our door wider, we might find a lot of interesting people with new voices and new perspectives. We already have a variety of clubs offering different styles, cultures, and opportunities — and those who do not feel welcome in any particular club might be great candidates for new clubs created on different models. It's important that we make sure every new Rotary member is a good fit for their club. Rotary Opens Opportunities through diversity.

## Trustee Chair's Message

In the early 1870s, a genius toiled in his laboratory, driven by a vision to improve life through technology. After many failed attempts, by 1880 Thomas Edison had perfected a new light bulb that could be produced on a mass scale.

When someone pointed out to him that he had tried and failed 10,000 times before succeeding, he responded that he had merely found 10,000 ways it wouldn't work!

Just like Edison, The Rotary Foundation is driven by a vision for a better world. And we, too, remain determined and creative in the face of setbacks.

Earlier this year, our vital polio immunization activities had to be temporarily paused to ensure that the polio eradication program did not contribute to the COVID-19 pandemic. And so we adapted: The polio-fighting infrastructure that Rotary helped build was enlisted to assist in the response to COVID-19 in many vulnerable countries, as we had done before during outbreaks of Ebola, yellow fever, and avian flu.

Thankfully, we resumed polio immunization activities in July, having first taken all precautions to protect frontline workers and communities.

During these challenging days, our business — reaching out to people in distress — is not business as usual. The way we prepare and deliver projects and the methodology we use need to change. And the way we communicate what we do also must change.

The success of our global grants model is unmistakable. At its introduction in 2013-14, the Foundation awarded 868 grants worth over \$47 million. By 2019-20, the number of approved grants had risen to 1,350, worth over \$100 million. While the number of grants shot up by more than 50 percent, and funding by 123 percent, corresponding Annual Fund contributions showed only a 5 percent increase, and that's troubling.

To reach those who need us, to spread the love that our Foundation brings, we will need to rise to this challenge and work together to meet our funding needs.

Mother Teresa once said that if we want a message of love to be heard, it has to be sent out. To keep a lamp burning, we have to keep putting oil in it.

The Rotary Foundation offers the best opportunity I know for us to invest in a better future for communities around the world. Your generosity today and throughout this year is the oil that keeps our grants burning bright, reaching the ones who need us most.

## President's Corner

Raising Deaf Awareness is important for a number of reasons. As well as improving people's knowledge of their own aural health, Deaf Awareness is also important to educate people both hearing and non-hearing and eradicate any possible stigmas - ensuring the deaf community is not left isolated. So to celebrate Deaf Awareness Week, Rotary Club of Tagum North joined the Magugpo Pilot Imelda Elementary School SPED, with Ms. Lorelei G. Limoran, SPED Coordinator, and Mr. Romeo F. Dano, School Principal of MPIES, in a TV/Radio Guesting at PTV 48 on November 17, 2020. It is indeed outstanding to note what the teachers at MPIES SPED has done to this deaf community and the efforts of the Local Government of Tagum City and stakeholders such as Rotary Club of Tagum North to sustain their education.

On November 19, 2020, the City Government of Tagum and the City Public Education and Employment Services Office, together with DTI and DOLE, and the support of the Rotary Club of Tagum North, conducted a "Virtual Trabaho, Negosyo, Kabuhayan." This is indeed a big aid for most of our fellow Tagumefios, and residents of the nearby provinces where most of the residents lost their work and businesses due to the COVID 19 Pandemic.

To continuously educate our leaders in Rotary, a Regional Rotary Foundation Seminar was conducted last November 21, 2020. Topics included were: TRF, Polio Updates and Challenges Faced, and Best Practices during COVID Pandemic from the Philippines. This was attended by PAG Arnold Nicolas.

And to top up our week's activity is the Site Visit for the Construction of a School and our Rotary Caravan in Sitio Mondol, Brgy. Gupitan, Kapalong, Davao del Norte which benefited 500 Residents and which included such activities as:

- Feeding of Porridge
- Medical Mission ( Medicines courtesy of myself and the CHO)
- Distribution of Six (6) Toilet Bowls
- Distribution of 500 Surgical Face Masks
- Distribution of 500 Face Shields ( part of the 20,000 face shields donated by Rtn. Ramel Lintuan)
- Distribution of 500 Face Shields to the 60IB Mediator, Phil. Army at Doña Andrea, Asuncion ( courtesy of PP Lintuan)

Thank you for accompanying me in this noble work: AG Neal Ararao, PAG Arnold Nicolas, IPP Renie Siscon and Spouse Gina, Rtn. Jess Osorio; newly inducted President of the Rotaract Tagum North Palm City Chapter, Bryan Sulasula and from the CHO, Dr. Dainah Fajardo. Thank you also to our Chef Rotarian Eduardo Dinglasan Jr. who prepared the group's lunch meal. Thank you also for the assistance of the 60IB Mediator, Phil. Army under the leadership of the Battalion Commander, Lt. Col. Rolando Sarmiento who also accompanied us in this activity. It was indeed an experience of a lifetime, with the group waking up at 4 a.m. to travel to the 60IB Battalion in Doña, Andrea, Asuncion, Davao del Norte, then setting off again to a three (3) hours ride to Sitio Mondol, Gupitan, Kapalong, Davao del Norte. Due to the heavy rains, our transportations had to be left behind in the middle of the road buried in knee-high deep of mud, and start the more than an hour of walking up a 75° mountain trail of ankle-length mud. It was indeed an arduous experience, but the warm welcome of the residents took away the exhaustion of the journey. Thank you to the bulldozer operator whom we found on top of the mountain for helping us pave the road where some of us had to walk, for letting some ride with him in the bulldozer while on our way down from the mountain, and for helping pull all our transportations (2 pick up and 2 KM vehicles of the Philippine Army ) until we reached a safe road. Thank you for the camaraderie of the group for lightening our situation. Our transportations may have suffered a lot: scratched paints, bumps, broken tail lights, but the firm conviction to reach out to those who need our help will forever glow.

## HISTORY OF ROTARY INTERNATIONAL

Paul P. Harris, an attorney, wanted to create a professional group with the same friendly spirit he felt in the small towns of his youth. On 23 February 1905, Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. This was the first Rotary club meeting. They decided to call the new club "Rotary" after the practice of rotating meeting locations.

Within five years clubs had formed across the country, from San Francisco to New York.

In August 1910, Rotarians held their first convention in Chicago. The 16 clubs that existed at that time united to form the National Association of Rotary Clubs.

In 1912, the name changed to International Association of Rotary Clubs to reflect the addition of clubs in other countries. The name Rotary International was adopted in 1922.

By July 1925, Rotary had grown to more than 2,000 clubs and an estimated 108,000 members on six continents.

Rotary's reputation attracted presidents, prime ministers, and a host of other luminaries to its ranks — among them author Thomas Mann, diplomat Carlos P. Romulo, and composer Jean Sibelius.

As Rotary grew, members pooled their resources and used their talents to serve their communities. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its motto: Service Above Self.

## New Polio Vaccine Becomes The First Vaccine Under the WHO's Emergency Use Listing



13 November 2020


WHO today listed the nOPV2 vaccine (Bio Farma, Indonesia) for emergency use to address the rising cases of a vaccine-derived polio strain in a number of African and East Mediterranean countries.

Countries in WHO's Western Pacific and South-East Asia regions are also affected by these outbreaks. The emergency use listing, or EUL, is the first of its kind for a vaccine and paves the way for potential listing of COVID-19 vaccines.


cVDPVs are rare and occur if the weakened strain of the poliovirus contained in the oral polio vaccine (OPV) circulates among under-immunized populations for a long time. If not enough children are immunized against polio, the weakened virus can pass between individuals and over time genetically revert to a form that can cause paralysis.

Type 2 cVDPVs are currently the most prevalent form of the vaccine-derived virus.

# WHY THE ROTARY YEAR BEGINS 1 JULY?



Ever wonder why the Rotary year begins 1 July? The international convention initially played a key role in determining the start date of our fiscal and administrative year.

Rotary's first fiscal year began the day after the first convention ended, on 18 August 1910. The 1911-12 fiscal year also related to the convention, beginning with the first day of the 1911 convention on 21 August.

At its August 1912 meeting, the Board of Directors ordered an audit of the International Association of Rotary Clubs' finances. The auditors recommended that the organization end its fiscal year on 30 June to give the secretary and treasurer time to prepare a financial statement for the convention and board, and determine the proper number of club delegates to the convention.

The executive committee concurred, and at its April 1913 meeting, designated 30 June as the end of the fiscal year. This also allowed for changes to the schedule for reporting club membership and payments. Even *The Rotarian* changed its volume numbering system to correspond to the fiscal year (beginning with vol. 5, July 1914).

Rotary continued to hold its annual conventions in July or August until 1917. Delegates to the 1916 event in Cincinnati, Ohio, USA, approved a resolution to hold future conventions in June, mainly because of the heat in cities where most of them occurred. The next one was held 17-21 June in Atlanta, Georgia.

The term "Rotary year" has been used to signify Rotary's annual administrative period since at least 1913. An article in *The Rotarian* that July noted, "The Rotary year that is rapidly drawing to a close has been signaled by several highly successful joint meetings of Clubs that are so situated as to assemble together easily and conveniently."

Since the executive committee's decision in 1913, the end of the Rotary year has remained 30 June.

A club that reflects its community's diversity with regard to professional and business classifications, gender, age, religion, and ethnicity is a club with the key ingredients to its successful future.
