DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

The Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions was adopted by the Rotary International Council on Legislation in 1989 to provide more specific guidelines for the high ethical standards called for in the Object of Rotary:

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;
3. Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
4. Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public, and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
5. Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or profession;
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

EDITORIAL

Significance of World Polio Day 2021

Through the World Health Organisation's sustained efforts, Polio has reached a distinct level of eradication across the globe. Polio is one of the dangerous diseases in this world with implications of a lifetime. It is a water-borne disease, and children affected with this disease face the consequences of losing out mobility and walking abilities for their entire life.

Polio vaccination is administered orally to children below five years by governments of respective countries where the disease has shown endemic signs in the past. In 1988, the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) was launched by collaborations between Rotary International and the World Health organisation.

Around that year, worldwide cases counted up to 3, 50,000 and more. Developed countries in America, Europe and the Western Pacific are free from this endemic today. Polio has left these regions without a trace. But there are certain other regions where the deadly disease still exists and needs to be eradicated.

Strict measures and vaccinations are to be administered from time to time to completely kill the virus from its roots and declare the entire world polio-free. On the perfect occasion of World Polio Day, such stringent measures can be adopted and stringently practised to heal our next generations from polio.

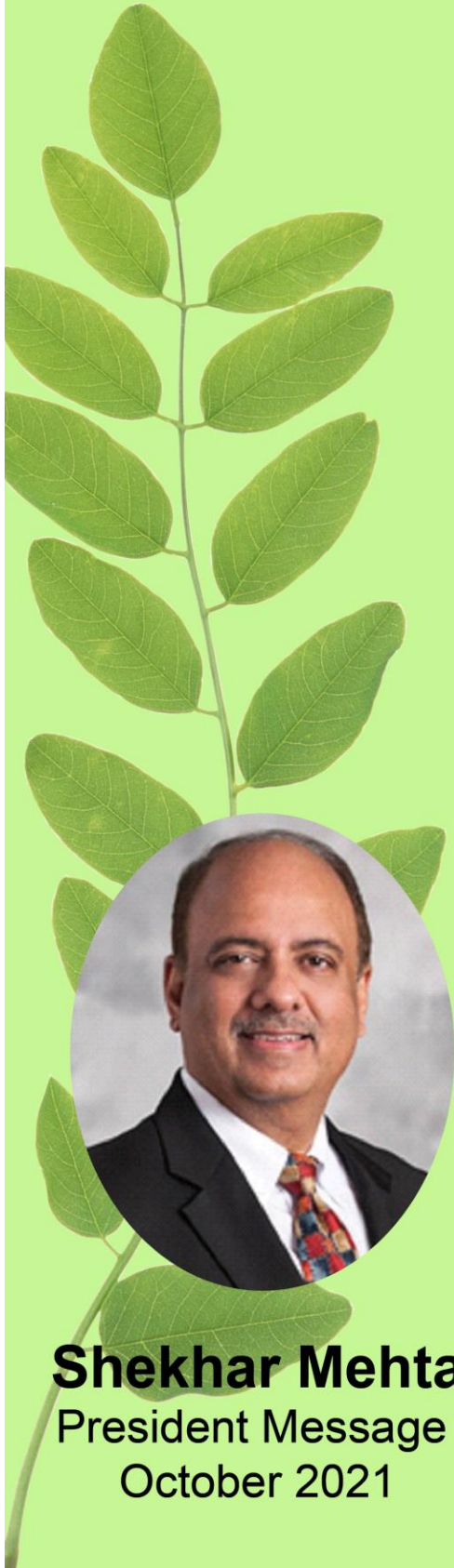

A quarter of the Rotary year is now behind us. I am sure you are helping Rotary to grow more and do more. And I hope you have already done your part for the Each One, Bring One initiative by introducing one person to Rotary.

Do you ever think about your earliest days as a Rotarian? I often do — because those first moments of discovering the power of service shaped who I am today. When I joined my Rotary club, our efforts focused on India's rural communities, where people were living without toilets, getting their drinking water from the same pond they bathed in, and sending their children to outdoor classrooms set up under a tree. The nearest health care provider often was miles away — and the services were inadequate. But after Rotary clubs carried out some service projects, the villages had toilets, clean drinking water, a classroom for early learning, and a nearby health care center.

The spark that Rotary kindled within me forced me to look beyond myself and embrace humanity. It made service a way of life and led me to a guiding principle I still stand by: Service is the rent I pay for the space I occupy on Earth.

If you feel the need to reignite the spark of service in yourself or your club, October — Community Economic Development Month — is a great time to do so. When we work to improve the lives of people in underserved communities — through, for example, projects that provide vocational training and access to financial resources — we help build and sustain local economic growth.

The need is great. According to the United Nations, 9 percent of the world's population — that's 700 million people, a majority of them in sub-Saharan Africa — live on less than \$1.90 a day. By supporting strong community development as well as entrepreneurs, we can help improve conditions for people in that region and others. Your club can also promote economic development in your own community by expanding vocational training opportunities through local schools and community colleges, partnering with lenders to improve access to financial services, or working with a nonprofit that provides resources to entrepreneurs and connects them with the business community.

Of course, developing strong communities is impossible without strong public health. On 24 October, World Polio Day, we'll celebrate our tremendous progress in the effort to eradicate polio. But we also know the fight is not over. We still need your help raising funds and awareness to ensure that all children are immunized against polio. Please don't forget to activate your clubs on that important day and encourage them to donate here: endpolio.org/world-polio-day.

Service has been rewarding for me throughout my life. I know the same is true for many of you. Join me this month in becoming a good tenant of our planet by helping others to better themselves and their communities. Together, we can Serve to Change Lives.

When Rotary courageously stepped up to pursue the dream of a polio-free world, we knew realizing our dream wouldn't be easy. But since 1988, working with our partners, we've brought worldwide case counts down by 99.9 percent.

However, it's not over 'til it's over. It will take courage. We're going to keep up the funding and keep on the pressure until this fight is finished, and no child ever again has to experience the devastating effects of polio.

As we mark World Polio Day on 24 October, we can take heart; we continue to make progress, and with the current low transmission rates of wild poliovirus in Afghanistan and Pakistan, we have a unique opportunity to interrupt transmission. We also have a new strategy and vaccine that will bolster our eradication efforts.

To eradicate wild poliovirus and stop outbreaks of circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus (cVDPV), the Global Polio Eradication Initiative's new strategy centers around several key areas: political advocacy to create greater urgency and accountability in the endemic and outbreak countries, improved engagement with high-risk communities, improved operations and polio surveillance, and the inclusion of polio immunization in broader health programs. (For more on the new polio eradication strategy, see page 30.)

Along with our new strategy, Rotary and its partners are using a new tool, novel oral polio vaccine (nOPV2), to help address outbreaks of type 2 cVDPV. This new vaccine has been deployed in a growing list of countries and is a promising development in our quest to end polio once and for all. But there is still much work to be done. In particular, we need to remain strongly committed to our goals in the face of recent events in Afghanistan. As a nonpolitical organization, Rotary will continue to do the work that is necessary to protect the health of children everywhere.

After all the progress we've made in our decades-long fight, the worst thing we could do is to become complacent, so here's where you come in.

Let's raise awareness of Rotary's role in polio eradication. And let's double down on our commitment and keep raising \$50 million each year for polio. Remember: Thanks to the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation, any contribution you or your Rotary or Rotaract club makes will be matched 2 to 1. In Rotary, when we dream, we get behind our dream with everything we can muster. We have always risen to challenges — and now it is more important than ever for us to rise again, with courage, to defeat polio.

Club President's Message

October 2021 is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Every October, people all over the world show their support for people affected by breast cancer. Our work's always important, but October is when we get to really shout about it. For months, the coronavirus put many areas of breast cancer on pause.

The Department of Health today led the observance of the Breast Cancer Awareness Month which emphasized the importance of regular self-breast examination and the critical role of screening in the early detection and treatment of breast cancer among women.

A breast self-examination is a method to detect any noticeable changes in one's breast. Early detection of any changes in the breast and seeking immediate consultation will increase one's chances of successful treatment.

Citing the 2020 data from the Global Cancer Observatory (GCO), the DOH said that breast cancer leads the incidence among cancer sites and it is the third leading cause of cancer deaths among Filipinos. In response to this public health concern, the DOH established the Cancer Assistance Fund (CAF) pursuant to Rule V Section 20 of the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) of Republic Act No. 11215 or the National Integrated Cancer Control Act to financially support the Cancer and Supportive-Palliative Medicines Access Program (CSPMAP) available in 26 access sites nationwide.

This year, despite the pandemic, more than 3,000 patients with breast cancer were given free cancer medicines under the Program.

"We urge women to do breast self-examination regularly and seek early consultation or teleconsultation with the primary care physicians for further assessment. Early detection of breast cancer is tantamount to better treatment outcomes for our patients." said Health Secretary Francisco T. Duque III. Tonight we welcome our Guest Dr. Jing Erfe and Engr. Melina Avila our partner in breast cancer awareness program from PINK Tagum.

Rotary Club of Tagum North in partnership with City Health Office, Living Hope Cancer Survivor's Club, Davao Regional Medical Center, Ican Serve Foundation, PTV 48, 91.1 Radyo ng Bayan FM, and the City Information Office, conducted series of breast cancer forum to create awareness on breast cancer.

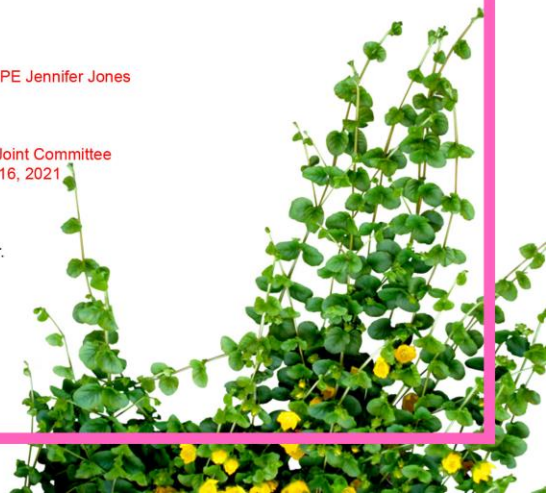

Why is Pink October an important calendar event?

Breast cancer awareness is the first step towards preventing this disease from having irreversible consequences on one's life. Year after year, several companies from different industries and numerous NGOs team up to support this educational and fundraising campaign. Through a diversity of media channels, they endeavour to transmit the importance of early breast cancer detection, how best to live with breast cancer, the significance of self-tests and breast screening, raising awareness on the symptoms of breast cancer and the diversity of treatments available, and the value of prioritising your health and the lifestyle you adopt.

Some Facts on Breast Cancer

According to the World Cancer Research Fund, breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer worldwide, with half a million women dying of this disease per year. More than 300 women are diagnosed with breast cancer each year in Malta, implicating the diagnosis of one new case of breast cancer per day.

Early detection is quintessential as 90% of breast cancers in their early stage are curable. According to statistics provided by the local Health Department, 4 out of 5 treated women live for at least 5 years in Malta, putting us as the country with the highest survival rate in Europe. Although men may also be affected by breast cancer, women aged between 50 and 69 are found to be mostly affected.

Which Breast Cancer Risk Factors should you be aware of?



What causes breast cancer is yet to be discovered. How does a cell's DNA get damaged? Causes may be environmental, hormonal, related to your lifestyle, or a combination of all factors.

Known risk factors are several. So who is most likely to get breast cancer?

- Gender: Women are more susceptible than men
 - Age: Women over 50
 - Family history: People with family members diagnosed with breast cancer
 - Personal health: Women who underwent early menstruation before 12 or late menopause after 55
 - Child-bearing: Women who bear children after the age of 30 or who've had no children
 - Physical Activity: Women who are inactive
 - Weight: Overweight and obese women are at a higher risk
 - Previous diagnosis: Women who experienced cancer in one breast are more likely to have breast cancer diagnosed in the other breast
 - Radiation exposure: Women exposed to chest radiation at a young age
- Other possible risk factors include alcohol, smoking, birth control pills, and a diet lacking fruits and vegetables.

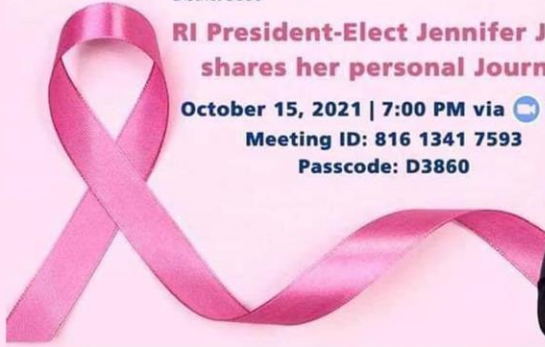

The virus spreads from person to person and only affects humans; children are especially susceptible. Because polio has no cure, vaccination is the only way to protect children and stop the disease from spreading. Rotary has been working to eradicate polio for more than 35 years. Our goal of ridding the world of this disease is closer than ever. As a founding partner of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, we've reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent since our first project to vaccinate children in the Philippines in 1979.

Paul P. Harris, an attorney, wanted to create a professional group with the same friendly spirit he felt in the small towns of his youth. On 23 February 1905, Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram Shorey gathered at Loehr's office in Room 711 of the Unity Building in downtown Chicago. This was the first Rotary club meeting. They decided to call the new club "Rotary" after the practice of rotating meeting locations.

Within five years clubs had formed across the country, from San Francisco to New York.

In August 1910, Rotarians held their first convention in Chicago. The 16 clubs that existed at that time united to form the National Association of Rotary Clubs.

In 1912, the name changed to International Association of Rotary Clubs to reflect the addition of clubs in other countries. The name Rotary International was adopted in 1922.

By July 1925, Rotary had grown to more than 2,000 clubs and an estimated 108,000 members on six continents.

Rotary's reputation attracted presidents, prime ministers, and a host of other luminaries to its ranks — among them author Thomas Mann, diplomat Carlos P. Romulo, and composer Jean Sibelius.

As Rotary grew, members pooled their resources and used their talents to serve their communities. The organization's dedication to this ideal is best expressed in its motto: Service Above Self.

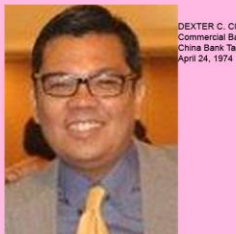

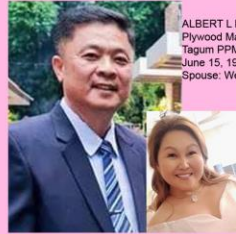

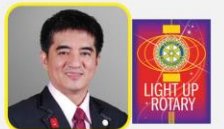
